## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

---

### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal for the ensuing year.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the General Expenses of the Highway Department for the ensuing year.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Home Day.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred eighty-six dollars and fifty cents (\$186.50) for T. R. A. so-called.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the expenses of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of (\$39.00) thirty-nine dollars to advertise the Town.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Street Lights.

13. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make appropriations to cover the expenses of such audit.

14. To see if the Town will vote to take any action for the control of white pine blister rust, and raise the necessary money for the same.

15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or sell, at public auction, any property taken by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, this vote to remain in force until rescinded by some later town meeting.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of (\$200.00) two hundred dollars to improve the road from the Favor Place to the Upton Farm in South Stoddard.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard :

I hereby submit my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

### SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

School Board: Mrs. Lucy Hill, Chairman; Kenneth McClure, Mrs. Ruth Mansell.

Superintendent of Schools: Stewart V. McCormack.

Teacher: Mrs. Mary M. Lane.

School Nurse: Margaret E. Harris, Keene, N. H.

### PUPIL DATA

The following pupils had perfect attendance for the school year 1944-1945: Ethel Doe, Terrance MacMahon, and Ellen Mansell.

An excellent and well prepared operetta was given at the graduation of Ellen Mansell in June, 1945.

There are 28 pupils registered at the Center School, which is the largest number for some years.

Two Stoddard pupils are attending Vilas High School in Alstead.

### THE GENERAL REPORT

The annual report should perhaps give us some kind of a picture of the kind of education being provided for our youth from the first grade on, but when town meeting day comes around we get all "steamed up" over some little item on the warrant so our overall problems wait yet another year for discussion. Probably the most distressing feature of present day reaction to educational matters is the extreme inertia of the layman. This inertia results in a lack of information which promotes a lack of understanding and a lack of sympathy to-

wards the whole problem of education. Most distressing is the vehemence and ignorance with which views about education are expressed publicly and privately by many prominent people.

The basis of American democracy is that ALL people have value. Each individual has potential abilities, and given a chance, can make a unique contribution to the good of all.

Even from a narrow, selfish point of view, we cannot afford to have an ignorant and suppressed segment in our society. Whether we like it or not, these people are with us. Each individual becomes a producer and a consumer, hence an asset to our economic life, or he fails to produce and becomes a liability. Such persons become expensive liabilities if they have to be institutionalized, when for evidence we consider that America's annual crime bill exclusive of poverty is TWELVE billions annually while her total bill for education, is nearer TWO billions annually.

The Stoddard school is in good condition and well equipped for present needs. Mrs. Lane, is doing a commendable job as a teacher. Her loyalty must be greatly appreciated by townspeople. At the present time no new teachers are going into rural school work. Former teachers like Mrs. Lane, who are willing to sacrifice their homelife, are "few and far between" literally.

We have tried to provide the latest instructional aids to the pupils. Those pupils who are there every day, profit most from their educational experiences. It is often easy to be careless with one's health to the extent of later sickness. We should all strive to maintain better health and thereby better attendance.

It is the solemn duty of every citizen to make sure that every child he comes in contact with, is getting the most out of his educational opportunities. It is often easy to let an excuse keep a pupil home but this leads to lost interest and perhaps failure at later educational attempts.

May I call your attention to the need of study of the accompanying reports? Our duties of citizenship require us to be alert to such activities.

In conclusion I wish to thank the teacher, pupils, parents, and school board for their hearty promotion of our mutual educational program.
