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TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Unity on the second Tuesday of March next—March 11, 1958— at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

To choose all necessary Officers, Agents and Trustees, for the ensuing year under the Australian Ballot System.

- 1. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing one year.
- 3. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing one year.
- 4. To choose an Overseer of Public Welfare for the ensuing one year.
- 5. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing one year.
- 6. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing one year.
- 7. To choose a Highway Agent for the ensuing one year.
- 8. To choose a Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.
- 9. To choose a Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

Business meeting called to order at 2 o'clock.

- 1. To hear the report of the Selectmen and other town officials and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other Town Charges.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Librarian's Salary and Library Tax.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor Charges.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay just debts of Town.
- 7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of highways and bridges, snow removal, and determine price to be paid for labor and trucks.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the control of Blister Rust.
- To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$758.15 for Town Road Aid. If this sum is raised the State will contribute \$5,054.35.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the benefit of the Unity Volunteer Fire Department, Inc., the Fire Department to have authority to spend any part of this money for Civilian Defense equipment for the Fire Dept.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote by ballot to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise one-hundredth of one per cent of valuation for the benefit of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Association.
- 14. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the Town's share of Social Security.
- 15. To see what the Town will do regarding re-assessment of all Town property and to raise a sum of money to cover said re-assessment if so voted.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to study the feasability of establishing minimum building regulations for new construction in the Town. Said committee to consist of one member of the Board of Selectmen; the Fire Chief; and three citizens appointed by Selectmen. They shall be empowered to make their report and any recommendations therein to the next annual town meeting.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500 to be paid to State Highway Department for resurfacing blacktop road in Town of Unity.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

FOREST FIRE PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem—97 per cent of all forest fires being man-caused and preventable—a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Carelessness and perverseness, however, continue to be big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires—all result in serious loss of property, disruption of inindustry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort—The rules are simple.

- Don't burn at home—use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
- 2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
- **3** Be sure that all lighted materials—cigars, cigarettes and matches—are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
- 4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
- 5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.

6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

REMEMBER—the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.

- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8 To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization and and building funds, together with other income; the School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will authorize the School Board, as agents of the school district to dispose of existing school building and lots to which the district has clear titles and apply the income towards the general fund.

- 10. To see if the district will authorize the school board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and any other receipts from miscellaneous sources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1958-59, for the lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.
- 11. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereinafter be forthcoming from the U.S. Government and/or state agencies.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Unity, I herewith submit my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

We wish to state that there were two changes in the faculty assignments this year. Mrs. Mildred Clark was appointed as a new teacher for grades three and four. She succeeded Mrs. Winnifred Towne. Mr. William Hall was appointed as teacher of grades seven and eight to replace Mr. Donald Fletcher. Mrs. Lois Cragin returned as teacher of the primary grades, one and two. Mrs. Nelson has assumed the responsibility of principal of the building and teacher of grades four, five and six.

We are all very proud of the new school building. Mrs. Kenneth Smith has continued as janitor of the building. The school officials appreciate the excellent work done in the maintenance and care of our classrooms. The physical condition of the building is excellent and provides most comfortable surroundings in which the children may live and study.

Mrs. Irene Chase has continued as cook and is in charge of our hot lunch program. The lunches have been most satisfactory and enjoyed by the pupils and teachers as well.

The all-purpose room is a great addition to this modern school. It is the center of activity during the noon lunch period and also serves as an assembly room for many school and social activities. With the addition of new tables and chairs, we are now able to serve hot lunches to all children at one sitting.

This year, through financial help from the Spaulding Fund, we have resurfaced the driveways and walks with a hot top finish. This has helped to preserve our floors and improves the general appearance of the building and grounds.

 A_S in the past, the transportation of pupils has been taken care of by bus routes operated by Mr. Lund and Mr. Stone. Overcrowded conditions on one bus route is anticipated next year.

As usual, Miss MacIver, our school nurse, has had a very busy year. I hope that evryone appreciates the very fine work she has done throughout the union. Her services in the care of sick and needy children are indispensable.

The budget next year will, undoubtedly, show a slight increase. This is due to the increase in cost of tuition for a greater number of children attending high school. This added expense is a situation over which the school board has no control. It is hoped that this added cost can be, in part, offset by savings in other directions.

We are fortunate in having a very fine staff of teachers in our Unity School. We hope to retain this experienced staff. With our fine building and strong teachers, we can provide good educational opportunities for the children of the town of Unity.

I have enjoyed very much my work with the teachers and members of the school board. Working together, we can continue to maintain a high level of educational standards for the young people we serve.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

We should like to briefly express our sincere appreciation to Teachers, Employees, Pupils, Parents and all other interested citizens who make it possible for us to provide a good education for our children. We should like particularly to thank everyone who has worked so diligently on fund raising projects for the school. In determining the sums of money raised voluntarily by our townspeople and students before applying to the Spaulding Trustees for aid, we discovered that a total amount of over two thousand (\$2,000.00) had been raised and expended in a relatively short period of time for the benefit of the Unity School. We are sure that this local effort and cooperation played a large part in the decision of the Spaulding Trustees to grant us the two thousand five hundred \$2,500.00) dollars necessary for the surfacing of the School driveway. We are grateful to the Trustees of the Spaulding Trust Fund for their gift but none of these projects could have been accomplished without the wonderful spirit of the Townspeople of Unity. It seems only fitting that in this School Report we should let you know of our appreciation.

Heretofore, no special accounting of funds raised voluntarily or given has been made in the School Report and it is the opinion of the Board that such an accounting, while not a part of the regular budget, would be an appropriate part of the report and we have therefore opened a "Special Activities Account" and are including a report of these funds in the School Report.

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SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

Many times during the past 5 years I have been asked these questions: "Do you work for just this school district?" or "How many schools do you visit?". I would like to take this opportunity to answer these questions.

Your school nurse is employed by Supervisory School Union No. 5. Union No. 5 is comprised of six school districts—one of which is a consolidated school district serving two towns. We have approximately 1300 children in 9 school buildings. The building and opening of three news schools within the last four years resulted in the closing of 14 old one room school houses. The opening of these new buildings has resulted in my having more time to work with the children and more time to visit with parents. Both of these factors have led to a better understanding of the children's problems as well as better means to cope with them. Most important, however, is the fact that these new buildings have provided a more healthful and wholesome atmosphere for both pupils and teachers.

The main office of the school nurse is in Charlestown. As most of you know our Union covers a large area. One of our districts is 30 miles from Charlestown, another is 21 miles, another is 20 and the other two districts are 7 and 9 miles from Charlestown.

A monthly schedule is set up by the school nurse. Certain days of each month are set aside for each school district and a copy of this schedule is posted in each school. Unless an emergency arises or the weather prevents traveling this schedule is met. Needless to say this type of schedule must be flexible to a certain degree. The same type of health program is carried out in all areas.

Salk Vaccine Clinics have again been made available to all areas. Everyone wishing their children to have Salk Vaccine have had several opportunities to do so. At the present time there are no plans for further Salk Clinics in the schools. It is hoped that the pre-school children will have their Salk Vaccine through the Pre-School Immunization Clinics. These clinics will be available to all areas.

Our routine testing programs were carried out this past year as usual. The fine response and cooperation of parents and interested individuals resulted in many more corrections of defects than we have had in the past. These defects included problems in vision, hearing, dental needs, orthopedic needs, general health, social and classroom adjustments, as well as speech difficulties. In instances where financial assistance was necessary, it was provided by private citizens, service clubs and State agencies.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to all of you who have helped so much with the school health program—parents, School Board, Superintendent, teachers, principals and those of you who have helped so much with our various clinics. Thank you.
