

# WARRANT for the ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L.S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Webster Central School in said Webster on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of highway and bridges.
  - a. Summer Maintenance.
  - b. Winter Maintenance.
  - c. Tar Roads.
  - d. General Expense of Highway Department.
  - e. Street Lighting.
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$518.21 for class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Public Welfare.
  - a. Town Poor.
  - b. Old Age Assistance.
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Patriotic purposes.
  - a. Old Home Day
  - b. Memorial Day
8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.
9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$161.00 for use in connection with the state program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.
11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.
12. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$30,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year, 1965, said notes payable from said taxes within one year from date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the maintenance of the playground.
14. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of old trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation commission to provide a matching sum.
15. To see if the town will empower the Board of Selectmen to take the necessary action to bring about toll free telephone service within the town so that the residents of the Town of Webster can commun-

cate with each other by telephone and without any extra charge.

(This article included by petition.)

16. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five members with duties as set forth in section 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. revised Statutes annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The board shall consist of one selectman and four other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

Be it resolved that it is the intent of the Town Meeting that the Board represent the several areas of the Town—Courser Hill, Blackwater, Putney Hill and Winnepocket—and that at least one woman be included in the appointments by the selectmen.

This article included by (petition)

17. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regards to relocating the existing Town dump and to authorize the Selectmen to sell the land where the Town dump is now located.

18. To see if the Town will adopt the following resolution:

Be it resolved that it shall take a majority vote of approval at an annual Town Meeting for any person or persons to construct operate or maintain a commercial dump in the Town of Webster.

19. To see if the Town will vote to build a new Town Hall on land now owned by the Town adjoining the Central School at a cost of \$65,000 and to authorize the Selectmen, with the advice of the Building Committee, to make all necessary contracts for construction.

20. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$65,000.00 for the purpose of the preceding article, the said sum to be raised by taking \$19,597.35 from the "Town Hall Sale Fund" and the sum of \$4,902.65 from the Reserve Fund for the future Town Buildings and the

balance amounting to \$40,500.00 by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of serial notes or bonds in said sum in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act as amended. (Standing vote or ballot vote required, with 2/3 majority to adopt.)

21. To instruct the selectmen and the Town Treasurer over what term of years such serial notes or bonds shall be repaid.

22. To extend the term of the present Town Hall Building Committee of eight members for one more year, any vacancies caused by refusal to accept reappointment to be filled at the meeting.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeeting.

Given under our hands and seal, this 8th day of February, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and sixty-five.

## Report of the TOWN HALL BUILDING COMMITTEE

The Town Hall Building Committee held its first meeting of 1964 on May 12. With the \$1000 appropriated for this purpose at the March Town Meeting, we were now in a position to hire an architect to provide us with suitable plans for a Town Hall Building, to be presented at the 1965 Town Meeting. The Committee agreed to interview several architects and also to ask that the Selectmen attend our meetings, working with us on this project.

On May 22, we met with Clifford Broker of Clifford Broker Associates. It was his opinion that we would have to curtail our building to a much smaller, 1 story size to come within the \$45,000 range. This opinion was also shared by the other architects interviewed. Mr. Broker's fee would be 8% supervised, 6% unsupervised; 2% for making plans to present at the next Town Meeting.

On May 29, we interviewed the architect Douglass Prescott from Sanbornton and Laconia. His fee was 6%; 1 1/2% or \$8.00 per hour for drawing a plan.

The third architect was interviewed on June 5; Arnold Perreton of Arnold Perreton Associates, Concord (a resident of Webster). His fee was 6% supervised; 1 1/2% or approximately \$500 for plans. The Committee voted by ballot to ask Mr. Perreton to draw the plans.

On June 28, Mr. Perreton met with the Committee and two members of the Board of Selectmen, who have worked with us at all meetings since this one. After visiting the proposed building site with the architect, the Committee attempted to give him an idea of the requirements which it believes are needed for a Town Hall in this community. Mr. Perreton, in turn, agreed to present at a later meeting, sketches of various types

of building from which the Committee could choose the one best suited to the town's needs.

On August 21, Mr. Perreton presented four sketches of prospective Town Hall Buildings, as follows:

- #1. 1 story; auditorium-dining room, kitchen, selectmen's office (no library).
- #2. 1 story; auditorium-dining room, kitchen, selectmen's office, library on second floor over front section, which is 1 1/2 story.
- #3. 2 story, auditorium, dining room, kitchen, selectmen's office (no library).
- #4. 1 story, auditorium, dining room, kitchen, selectmen's office, library.

Mr. Perreton estimated that it would cost approximately \$10 per square foot to construct a Town Hall Building and based upon this, he estimated the cost of #4, which the majority of the committee selected as their choice, at about \$65,000.

(The approximate cost of \$10 per square foot for this type of building construction was a figure in agreement with the estimates of both of the other architects interviewed)

On August 28, 1964, the Committee met with Mr. Perreton at his request, to look at a slightly revised version of the plan which he had previously presented.

On October 9, the Committee again met with Mr. Perreton to view a larger, more detailed plan and prospective of the proposed Town Hall building. Mr. Perreton also presented the specifications to the Committee.

At a meeting on January 13, 1965, the Committee discussed the report and articles which would be included in the 1965 Town Report and Warrant. It was decided to hold a public meeting on February 17 at the schoolhouse to discuss the plans and to enable the townspeople to acquaint themselves with the

facts before Town Meeting. Mr. Perreton will be present at this meeting.

The Town Hall Building Committee wishes to thank the Selectmen for their advice and assistance during our work on this project.

**Report of  
THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
and your DISTRICT CHIEF**

---

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy—both industrial and recreational—is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area—4,350,000—is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed

to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your very fine cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

In my last town report I said that there were going to be great changes in New Hampshire education. This past year many districts, including our own, were studying the feasibility of forming a cooperative school district. Some of these school districts have already voted to join a cooperative district, a few of which are: the Bristol area, Alstead, Charlestown, Walpole area, Wolfeboro area, Plaistow area and Lancaster and Whitefield area. There is no question but that this trend will continue and the State Board of Education and the Legislature will give more financial assistance to those communities which form a cooperative district. As a matter of fact the Cooperative School provides \$75 for high school pupils, \$60 for junior high pupils and \$45 for elementary pupils who cross a town line to go to school. No funds were made available, but they eventually will be and this will be a big help to the cooperatives.

Your representatives, with representatives from Bradford, Hopkinton and Warner, have spent many hours studying this problem. There have been over thirty meetings to this point and many have lasted until 11:30 P.M. Thus far I think that I am correct in saying that a complete study has been made, and

by the time that you read this report, you will have had information about the program. As I have said previously, the Cooperative School will not save money, and in the initial stages it may make a sizeable increase in the budget, it is just as true to say that you will be getting much more for the dollar spent.

The increase in cost of a Cooperative is caused by several factors. There is usually a large building program; there are more services which are common to many schools, but we have been unable to provide, because of our size. Our high school program will be greatly expanded, and although we can make improvements in our college preparatory program, the big improvement will be in the program for non-college students, particularly in the field of vocational education. There will also be increased services in guidance and elementary education. Transportation will be provided for all pupils which is not now the case in Webster where high schools pupils have to find their own transportation. Webster is one of the very few towns in the state which does not provide transportation. There will also be a late bus for those pupils who wish to stay for athletics or other extra curricula activities.

It is my firm conviction that Webster's growth is going to continue and that the number of pupils will increase more in the next ten years than it has in the past ten. Webster will be better able to meet these growth problems in a cooperative school much better than they could going it alone.

This is going to be a big step for all the towns that are involved in this study, but it has been a big step for all other communities who have already joined a cooperative. The one idea which has sold the cooperatives has been that all children in grades 1 thru 12 will have a better educational program. In this world of today and tomorrow, the best thing you can do for your children is to provide them with the best education possible. The decision is yours.


