

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bath qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bath on Tuesday, March 9, 1948, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, a Town Treasurer, an Auditor, one or more Highway Agents and all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear hear the reports of officers and agents heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the town officers' salaries and expenses, for repairs, maintenance and construction of highways and bridges, for the support of the town library, for old age assistance and the support of the town poor, for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Day, and for all necessary town charges and expenses for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$660.85.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one hundred dollars for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to repair the Dodge Hill Road, so-called, and raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand dollars for said purpose.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Dodge Hill Road from its intersection with the state road to its intersection with the road leading from the residence of Napoleon Paradie to the residence of Tony Locke.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from the residence of Napoleon Boutin to the Lyman Town Line, also the road from the premises recently occupied by Amos G. Wheeler to its intersection with the above-mentioned road.

Article 10. To hear the report of the Selectmen in connection with a vote taken under Article 14 of the 1947 Town Warrant, to pass any vote relative to the acquisition by the town of special equipment for highway maintenance and-or snow removal, and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for this purpose, and-or to vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on short term notes, a part or all of the money necessary for this purpose.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the municipal accounting division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 2 per cent on 1948 property taxes paid on or before July 3, 1948.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to dispense with the delivery of inventory blanks until April 1.

Article 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through the Tax Collector's deed.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

To the inhabitants of the Bath Union High School District in the Town of Bath qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 27th day of March, 1948, at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any alterations in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.

- 9. To see if the district will approve a School Lunch Program and raise and appropriate funds for the support of same.
- 10. To see if the District will approve equipping a room for a Manual Arts Shop and raise and appropriate funds for the support of same.
- 11. To see if the district will authorize the School Board and two other legal voters of the district, appointed by the moderator, to act as a special committee to consider the feasibility of forming a cooperative secondary school district and to report to the district not later than May 1 its findings including building requirements, program of studies, capital investment, operational costs of such a district and such other matters as may be deemed material.
- 12. If the preceding article is adopted, to see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of not exceeding \$300 to cover the cost of preparation of the report and traveling expenses of the special committee.

Teachers and Pupils:

The teaching staff is new this year. Altho a complete turnover is usually detrimental to any school system, yet the Bath Village School is being taught in a most satisfactory manner with its new personnel. Miss Martha White of Woodsville, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College and a teacher of long and successful experience, was engaged as principal, teaching grades 5-8. Mrs. Johnie Onderdonk of Lisbon is her co-worker teaching grades 1-4. Mrs. Onderdonk is also an experienced teacher and a graduate of Livingston State Normal School in Alabama. Mrs. Christie Goodwin of Piermont was employed as Music Supervisor, replacing Mr. Childs.

Buildings and Grounds:

During the summer the school building was greatly improved by the redecoration of the rooms now used. The desks were sanded and refinished. The exterior of the building was also painted, making it one of the most attractive school plants in the Union. The District is fortunate in having an excellent playground. More equipment however, for the primary grades, would be a valuable asset.

The water supply is still a matter of concern, as a very inadequate amount is available. The school board fully realizes, as does your superintendent, the difficulties involved in overcoming this problem. Every effort should be expended in improving the condition before another school year arrives.

The basement, including the toilets, is also a matter needing attention. A hot lunch program is a recognized part of modern educational units. The support of the district favoring this project will tend greatly to the realization of the objectives of the theme of education stressed in today's schools, which is the "Growth of the Whole Child." Physical fitness and good citizenship are vital factors in a child's growth. Without a well equipped school plant, directed by understanding teachers, these phases of de-

velopment will be retarded. Our potential citizens of tomorrow deserve the best.

It is with pleasure that I am permitted this opportunity to express my sincere appreciation for the cooperation of the pupils, teachers, school board and all citizens of the Bath Union District, who have made my work pleasant indeed as a new member in your educational system.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the school district in the town of Bath (Town District) qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Selectmen's room in said district on the 10th day of March, 1948, at 8.00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and truant officers, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agent, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to sell the Nutter School Building and empower the School Board to dispose of same.
- 10. To see if the District will vote to empower the School Board to use the funds (\$1500.00) amounting to One Thousand Five Hundred dollars received from the Grange Mutual Fire Insurance Company on account of the Pettyboro School Building, for support of schools.
- 11. To see if the district will authorize the School Board and two other legal voters of the district, appointed by the moderator, to act as a special committee to consider the feasibility of forming a cooperative secondary school district and to report to the district not later than May 1 its findings including building requirements, program of studies, capital investment, operational costs of such a district and such other matters as may be deemed material.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
