**TOWN WARRANT**  
**State of New Hampshire**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the sixth day of March, next, at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay Town charges in anticipation of taxes.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on Class V Highways and appropriate the sum of \$317.88 as the Town's share.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,717.20 for Sanbornville Fire Precinct and \$500.00 for forest fires.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,040.00 for use of Sanbornville Dump.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for Gafney Library.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$180.00 for Huggins Hospital.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$395.00 for the Public Health Visiting Nurse Service.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10.00 for the Carroll County Mental Health Service.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the Lakes Region Association.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,300.00 for oiling roads.
12. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$3,000.00 to the Capital Reserve Fund.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$220.00 to join the Lakes Region Planning Association.

14. To see if the Town will vote to designate Garney Road, Lyford Road, Mountain Road and Dick Road as scenic highways.

15. To see if the Town will vote to close the following roads, subject to gates and bars:

- a. The Dick Road from the Camp Road to the Wolfeboro Town Line.
- b. The Old Governor's Road from Lyford Road to the Cotton Valley Road or Cottle Hill Road.
- c. The Mountain Road from Swett's Farm to Mountain Lake.

16. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and approve withdrawal of \$750.00 from the Capital Reserve Account for a new road sander for the Town truck.

17. To see if the Town will vote to approve borrowing \$12,000.00 on five year serial notes to cover Town's share of cost of building a new bridge on Mountain Road, over Mountain Brook.

18. To see if the Town will vote to approve borrowing not more than \$9,000.00 on four year serial notes for the purpose of obtaining a tax map.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 a sum not to exceed \$200.00 as payment of interest charges on the \$9,000.00 four year serial notes as outlined in Article 18.

20. To see if the Town will vote to approve the closing out of the Eva Willey Fund from the Capital Reserve Fund and transferring same to the School Renovation Fund.

21. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Conservation Commission under the provisions of RSA 36A, and that the selectmen shall appoint said Commission, to consist of three members, with 60 days of the said annual meeting, and that said selectmen shall also designate, for the purpose of calling the first Commission Meeting, a temporary Chairman.

22. To see if the Town will vote to have the Moderator appoint a three member budget committee to assist the selectmen in reviewing policy making decisions pertaining to Town finances. (By Petition)

23. To see if the Town will vote to have all Town records properly audited by a "Certified Public Accountant", or qualified accountant. (By Petition)

24. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.
