Canaan Town Warrant THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Canaan, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House, Canaan Street, in said Canaan on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of tax revenue.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by quitclaim deed all property acquired by tax deed, or take any action thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow the playing of Beano or Bingo in the Town of Canaan as prescribed by the laws of the State of New Hampshire, or take any action thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to establish a Canaan Historical Museum in the second floor of the Town Library and to appoint a Board of Curators who may solicit and accept contributions and donations for the same.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to employ the services of the State of New Hampshire assessors to obtain

more equalized assessments and raise money to pay for the same, or take any action thereto.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to prohibit the parking of any vehicle on any street, road, or public way within the Town of Canaan from 12 midnight to 6: A. M., from the first day of November to the first day of April. Any person violating the provisions of this article shall be fined not more than five dollars, and in addition if any vehicle is moved by the Town said person shall be liable for towing charges and all costs occasioned thereby.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to cooperate with the Boston and Maine Railroad in the relocating of the road to the section of Town known as "Graceville" and thereby eliminate the grade crossing known as "Railroad engineering station No. 2719 X 50" and bridge over the Indian river or take any action thereto. For which purpose the Boston and Maine railroad has contributed the sum of \$2500.00.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use as the Town's share an amount not to exceed \$4000.00 from the 1961 appropriation for highway expenses or from any other available source for the purpose of building a new road to that section of Town known as "Graceville."
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to relieve the Town of the winter maintainance of the section of road known as the "Upper Mascoma River Road," starting at the Greenwood residence and continuing to the Canaan-Dorchester town line, from December 1st. to May 1st. of each year, or take any action thereto.

12. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or any other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Note: Polls to open at 10 A. M. and close at 6 P. M. Articles in the warrant will be taken up beginning at 1:30 P. M.

CANAAN STREET PARK

For the first time in many years the triangular piece of town land near the Town House was mowed as a lawn. Dick Roberts who did the job throughout the year for \$47.50 met rough going at first, but gradually it became easier. Lime was purchased and spread for \$14.40. With some more fertilization and smoothing we will have a lawn area of which the town can be proud.

The overgrown shrubs that were severely pruned last year sprang up to a more desirable height and had many blossoms. Much time was spent weeding out undesirable plants that had found a hospitable seed bed under the old tangle of shrubs. The painting of the Town House inspired a group to clean out the many trees and bushes that were choking out the shrubs that surround the building. Two evergreen bushes were planted in the holes left by the stumps of overgrown cedar trees on either side of the entrance to the hall by John Holteen for \$32. We started the year with \$32.32 on hand, received an appropriation of \$100, spent \$93.90 and ended the year with a balance of \$38.42.

Your commissioner is impressed with the amount of work and money that past generations have invested in the shrubs and landscaping of our town land on the Street. With the improvement in the Town House and the Library small pieces of lawn were mowed there late in the season. It is hoped that this lawn may be expanded. The Lions Club has done much to improve the town and at the wharf and is moving up towards the Street. I hope that these two projects may expand and meet. Sincere thanks go to the volunteers who spent many hours making possible the work on the park.

REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

The following is a report of activities conducted in the town of Canaan, by the N. H. Department of Health Bureau of Public Health Nursing, for the year January 1960 to January 1961.

A salk Vaccine Clinic was held at the School Auditorium on January 28th 1960 with a total attendance of 441. Some of this number were from the small surrounding towns. This was the fourth or "Booster" shot for most of the school age children, and first, second or third shots for others and adults.

Home visits have been made in the town, by the Nurse, on mothers, babies and preschool age children. Arrangements have been made for children to attend Cripple Children's Clinic and Cardiac Clinic at Hanover with follow-up on these cases. Other children have been referred to Sight Conservation and other services for corrections as necessary.

My sincere thanks to Dr. Dinerman and Mrs. Ruth Lester R. N. for their assistance at the clinic; also the School Nurse and School Officials, the Committee of Ladies who assisted and any others who assisted in any program for the betterment of the health of the children of Canaan. My thanks also to the press for the cooperation given throughout the year.

The work of the Tuberculosis program is now under the N. H. Dept. of Health Nurse. Several attended the Chest Clinic at Lebanon in November and reports have been send to local physicians and patients.

REPORT OF PLANNING BOARD

Your Planning Board has been organized now for about a year and a half. We soon found that facts - reams of them - are necessary before any worth while plans can be made. Other people's plans affect us so we wrote or talked with: Telephone Company, Water Pollution Board, Fish & Game and Highway Departments, Planning and Development Commission, and other planning boards. The Selectmen have drawn up a preliminary list of items owned by the town and the School Board has been asked to do the same.

Since the goal of any planning is to speed the continuing improvement of our home town, we cast about for things to do while assembling the facts for major plans. Some accomplishments:

Fire Insurance rates reduced.

State Industrial Agent visited town, was given a list of available buildings and manpower and kept aware of Canaan's needs.

Adopted slogan - "Canaan - Land of Milk and Honey" (and we have figures to prove it!)

Blinker light installed in Canaan Village.

"Canaan" accepted as the subject of the annual essay contest in our schools.

More state highway signs pointing to Canaan erected. Improvement contest entered by over 90 people.

Secured donations of 92 contest prizes and awarded them before a capacity crowd in the Community Center.

Represented on Lebanon Regional Airport advisory board.

Investigated bathhouse and toilet facilities at Town Wharf and made recommendations to Selectmen for improvements.

Printed folder about Canaan to answer inquiries from cut of town (at no cost to town.)

793 inches of publicity about Canaan printed in newspapers.

The board saw jobs that needed doing and was fortunate in securing the cooperation of others in carrying them out. Thanks are due: The Bicentennial Committee, The Hospitality Committee for welcoming newcomers to town, The Lions Club for agreeing to put up signs at town road junctions, The Fire Company for agreeing to locate pump sites on a town map.

We continue work on a number of projects. Among them: 1. A map showing the use to which each piece of land is put. This land use map will be the basis of carrying out a major responsibility with which you have entrusted us - the preparation of a plan for zoning to be presented to the town meeting in 1962. 2. More fire protection and lower insurance rates. 3. Resurvey of sewer needs. 4. Improvement of our greatest natural resource—the forest

Your Planning Board urges that you share your ideas with us. As chairman I have been in a position to know the hours of volunteer work that the members have put in. I am frankly amazed at how hard people will work for their community.

SCHOOL DISTRICT WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Canaan, New Hampshire, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Building in said district on the 8th day of April, 1961, at 2:00 o' clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Polls for balloting to open at 2:00 in the afternoon, to close not earlier than 9:00 P. M. Articles in warrant other than balloting for officers will be considered at 7:30 P. M..

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to use necessary monies from the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of the Hammond meadow adjacent to the present school property, to be used for school improvement and to authorize the trustees of trust funds to pay over these monies to the school board as agents of the school district.
- 10. To abolish all committees formerly chosen in connection with the Canaan school problem.
- 11. To appoint, with the assistance of the school moderator, a study committee to assist the school board in studying all possible solutions to the Canaan School problem.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
