REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens:

At the Center and the Emery schools last year's teachers have been retained. Vacancies occurred at the Blanchard and the Uplands through resignation of the teachers and their places have been filled by two other trained teachers, one from Concord Training School and one from Keene Normal. Kezer is in charge of a graduate of Keene. Though the Cadet system was continued at Kezer for less than a year it was responsible for the securing of our present teachers at Kezer and the Uplands.

The School Board, after conference with the Commissioner of Education's office, laid plans for remodelling the Center schoolhouse during the summer, but for various reasons this work was delayed and the fall term opened with nothing accomplished.

The first week of school disclosed the fact that the Blanchard had now suddenly become the largest schoolhouse in the district and its 27 pupils could not be properly handled without providing more light and rearranging the room. A new floor has been laid, the seats turned to face the north, large windows have been put in on the left of the children and new blackboards in the front of the room. With new curtains and some new seats, the cost has been about \$500.00. Now that we have commenced to remodel this building I would urge that this job be completed before another building is started upon. The shed would be large enough to house a year's supply of wood if toilets were placed elsewhere. A small lean-to on the south side of the building would provide an excellent place for two chemical toilets.

No action has been taken by the Board to carry out the vote to move the Emery schoolhouse as they have been advised that this vote gave them no legal authority to do so, since the warrant for the meeting contained no article covering such action.

At the last annual meeting \$1,000.00 was raised for repairs and alterations including the moving and locating the Emery School. It has been intended to hold this money until either a legal vote to move was passed or until definite provision was made by the district for its use in other alterations.

The Selectmen have turned over to the School Treasurer none of the proceeds of dog licenses since 1920. If they have available a sufficient amount to pay us the balance due us since that time during the current school year, we shall probably have funds sufficient to complete the year, otherwise a deficiency appropriation should be raised at the coming meeting or the Board will be obliged to expend a part of the \$1,000.00 mentioned above.

The statement of amounts needed for the coming year is given in somewhat more detail than in the past. You will note that the state aid next year will amount to more than twelve hundred dollars.
