TOWN MEETING - MARCH 9, 1965

The Meeting was called to order at 7:50 P. M.

The Moderator read the Warrant.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see how much of the Parsonage Fund the Town will vote to spend for preaching for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the establishment of a Capital Reserve for the Fire Department, the money thereby appropriated to be used to purchase a new fire truck fully equipped and approved by the American Insurance Association and the New Hampshire Board of Fire Underwriters, and the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) to be appropriated therefor. Also any interest earned be reinvested and/or returned to the Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make payments on a St. Light already in operation on Pleasant St.

Article 8. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Article 9. Voted to close meeting at 8:12 P. M.

# TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danville in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Danville Town Hall in said Danville on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at 1:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much of the Parsonage Fund the Town will vote to spend for preaching for the ensuing year.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$18,000.00 for the purchase of one new fire truck, class A pumper; such equipment to meet the requirements of the American Insurance Association and the New Hampshire Board of Underwriters, for approval of a reduction in fire insurance rates; and authorize the Selectmen to use all monies in, and interest accrued on, present capital reserve fund to apply on this purchase; and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the remainder on notes to be repaid in five equal annual payments.

7. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund, as established in the Town Meeting of March 9, 1965.

8. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Tax Collector an annual salary of \$800.00 per year in place of the percentage rate of 1% which is now in use.

9. To see if the Town will vote into Law the proposed Building Code as submitted by the Planning Board.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
