TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veterans' Memorial Building in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To elect two Selectmen, one for three years and one for two years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Auditors, four Delegates to the Constitutional Convention, and all other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.
- 2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town halls, for the support of libraries, for state and county taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes, for co-operating with the state and federal governments in control of the white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 3. To see if the Town will accept state aid for construction of the Class 2 road known as the Windham Road leading from Shute's Corner to Windham Junction and raise and appropriate, or set aside for said purpose, the sum of \$2786.25; or will accept state aid

for construction of Class 5 roads and raise and appropriate, or set aside for said purpose, the sum of \$992.21, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 4. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the taxes for the year 1938 on the negotiable notes of the Town, said loans to be repaid from 1938 taxes collected, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 or any other sum of money, for the purposes of advertising and giving publicity to the natural industrial advantages of the Town of Derry, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for free public band concerts in the Town during the summer of 1938, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize its Collector of Taxes to appoint a Deputy Collector, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 9, (By petition). To see if the Town will take any action in regard to procuring adequate public parking space in the congested parts of the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 10. (By petition). To see if the Town will vote to have the Town reports out two weeks before Town meeting and have them in a designated place so every one can obtain them.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the celebration of the anniversary of the ratification of the federal constitution by the state, June 21, 1938, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the following sections of road; viz:
- a. That part of the old Manchester Road which leads from Tyrrell's Corner to the Londonderry Turnpike.
- b. A section of road leading from the dwelling of Everett Rutter to the Island Pond Road, being a section of the old Lowell Road.
- c. A section of the Collette Road, so-called, leading from the intersection of the Hampstead Road to the Hampstead Town line; and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$50.00 for the purpose of inserting on the Veteran's Monument the names of certain veterans whose names were omitted therefrom, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 14. To see what action the Town will vote to take relative to taking, purchasing, leasing or otherwise acquiring and maintaining a municipal light or gas plant for the purpose of supplying, through the whole or any portions of said Town of Derry, electricity or gas, or both, for street lighting purposes and the use of its citizens and others, and for such other purposes as the Town may from time to time direct in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 153 of the Laws of 1935 as amended by Chapter 158 of the Laws of 1937, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- 15. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and committees, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 16. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

DERRY PUBLIC LIBRARY

Annual Report of the Trustees

Miss Elsie Gaskin who has served the Library faithfully as its librarian for the past thirty-two years at her request was granted a year's leave of absence beginning November 1, 1937. During her absence the Library is being very capably directed by Miss Edith Hall, acting librarian, and her assistant Miss Hildred Safford, a Simmons College graduate.

The following reports of the Librarian and Treasurer cover fully the work of the Library and show its continued growth. These reports are herewith submitted.

DERRY PUBLIC LIBRARY

The 33rd annual report of the Derry Public Library is herewith presented. During the past year a new ruling for extending library service has been tried. As many books as desired may be taken out on a single card, with the exception of seven day books which includes current novels and periodicals. This ruling was largely made to accommodate patrons living at a distance, so as to save them time and inconvenience in frequent trips to the library. Rules governing the loan of books have gradually been changed with the steady increase in the number of books on the shelves.

Special vacation privileges are also given to those going away for their annual vacation, whether it be two weeks, a month or longer, may have books of their selection post dated to what ever time the return home is made.

Attractive displays of mounted pictures have been of great interest to the patrons. Such exhibits included showing of West Minister Abbey pictures at the time of the coronation, flower and bird groups in their season. A group of pictures taken in Derry, about 1882-1883 of the factories and their workers, was of great interest to the older citizens, many coming in just to look over the photographs. Of special interest to the children were an exhibit of tropical fish during the summer, and in the fall, of the exhibit showing all the process re-

quired to turn raw cotton to a book binding, this being loaned us by Holliston Mills Inc., Norwood, Mass. The 4th grade pupils of the West Side School loaned us a splendid display of their drawings of Indian pictures. A traveling display of new books for children was loaned by the State Commission. Attractive displays of current book jackets having been placed in store windows attracts the attention of shoppers and has caused a demand for the books.

Book week was observed by a special display of new books for children at the library. As Better Lighting week was to be observed by the Derry Electric Co. on National Book Week, it was arranged with that office for us to display a comparison of the old books with the new, while they drew the comparison in lighting of the same dates. Books from 1799 to the present time offered an interesting contrast.

Vacation reading club was started as an airplane trip around the world, 16 children joined and 8 finished their journey. In addition to the regular diploma given each child, a fireside party held during a supper hour, was a pleasant surprise at the journey's end.

The reading room was used by the Garden Club for their annual flower show, and a committee from this club furnished the attractive Christmas decorations again this year.

It was found necessary to add three new book stacks: in the main library to accommodate the extra books: that crowded the shelves.

During July Edith Hall, assistant, and Marjorie Hall, volunteer assistant, attended the Summer school session held in Manchester, and they, with Elsie Gaskin, attended the State Library meeting in New London. Derry was represented at two neighborhood meetings with Miss Gaskin appointed membership chairman for District No. 15, Derry is included in this district.

Your Librarian was granted a year leave of absence to be spent in rest and travel. Edith Hall was appointed Acting Librarian with Hildred Safford, a Simmons College graduate, as her assistant. Miss Safford started story hours for the grade children which will be continued through the winter if attendance warrants.

Town reports dating from 1848 through to the year 1920 have been bound and placed on the reference shelf. Later bindings will bring them up to date.

We wish to extend our thanks to the newspapers for their service in publishing our notices and lists and to the various store keepers for the window space they have so kindy permitted us to use.

TAYLOR LIBRARY

To the Trustees of Taylor Library:
The sixtieth annual report is herewith presented:

Taylor Library is sixty years old. It was opened February 28th, 1878 in the upper rooms of the Town Hall where it remained for fifty-two years and it has now been eight years in the Shepard Library building across the street on the Parker lot.

During the past year the Library has been open, regularly, on Tuesday and Saturday afternoons and evenings with the exception of Christmas Day which fell on Saturday, a total of 463 hours on 103 days.

We have now on our list 343 active borrowers and have loaned them 7084 books and 1211 magazines during the year.

We have sponsored the Church reading course also the Self Improvement reading course for rural women and as usual carried on a vacation reading course for children.

Following a thorough revision of our shelf list 283 volumes of fiction have been discarded as worn out or not taken from the shelves since our card catalogue was made eight years ago.

We wish to thank friends who have given the library subscriptions to magazines and newspapers also those who have given books. We especially appreciate the gift of 24 volumes of junior science textbooks from Miss Abby G. Herlihy. These are very useful as reference sources for our Junior High and Academy students.

The Librarian attended the meeting of the State Library Association at New London in September.

Mrs. Julia M. Goldsmith has served as Associate Librarian during the year.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENRENT OF SCHOOLS To the Derry School Boards:

During the current school year we have completed the introduction of the Rugg Social Science series of text books, not only in the Derry seventh and eighth grades, but in all other schools in the Supervisory District.

These books are based on the idea that the chief purpose of education is to acquaint pupils of the grammar grades with the causes and conditions which, since the pioneer days of the 1700's, have changed our country from the simple Agricultural Civilization to the highly complex Industrial Civilization of today.

This requires, first of all, that pupils become somewhat familiar with present day conditions and tend-

encies: The study of current events provides for this phase of the work.

The next step includes the social, political and in dustrial history from pioneer days as the native redman's manner of living has given way, first to the whiteman's primitive agriculture which in turn has been and is being supplemented and often displaced by manufacturing, mining, lumbering, etc.

Thus the history of man's past experiences seen in their relations to present day conditions must be made use of in preparing the youth of today for problems of the immediate future.

The responsibility for this rests to a large extent upon the public schools.

It is my belief that our schools are meeting this obligation and I have no hesitation in stating the opinion that the grammar school graduate of 1938 is as well qualified, intellectually, to face and solve the problems of citizenship which he must meet ten or fifteen years hence, as I and my classmates were when we graduated from college in the 80's.

Perhaps the most important change in this year's program has been in the replanning of the instruction in music.

This was made possible by the request of the Londonderry District to have music made a part of their program.

With the inclusion of Londonderry the work became too much for one teacher.

We were extremely fortunate in finding two well trained and experienced young candidates, Mr. and Mrs. Norwood Hinkle, who were ready to come to Derry on Dec. 1st.

Their preparation for both vocal and instrumental instruction is as follows:—

Mr. Norwood W. Hinkle —Harvard A. B., and A. M. inteaching; Mrs. Cornelia C. Hinkle—Radcliff A. B., Surette Summer School 2 years, and 2 years teaching in Brookline, Mass., 1 year in Geneva, Illinois.

Mr. Hinkle has charge of the instruction both instumental and vocal in Pinkerton Academy and also gives daily instruction in the Oak St. Grammar grades as well as in the sixth grades in the West Side and Floyd schools.

Mrs. Hinkle is in charge of all other music teaching in the rural schools and grades.

I believe we have as well trained and competent music instructions as any school system in New Hampshire and from nearly three months of work now accomplished, it seems certain that pupils, teachers, and parents are well satisfied with the results.

The extension of the music course called for additional books and rather than add new books to the old series it was decided to introduce the Schirmer books in each of the five school districts.

Fortunately there was nearly enough left of the extra appropriation of \$800 for books to pay for Derry's part of this unexpected outlay.

Three years ago a plan was devised whereby, with the written consent of parents, pupils of demonstrated ability and willingness to work are promoted directly from the seventh grade to high school: Up to the present time 28 of such have been enrolled in Pinkerton Academy, of these 5 are now Juniors, 12 Sophomores, 11 Freshmen; Of this number not one has failed nor have any left school:

This, however, is not the whole story, the average rank of these seventh grade groups has been from 1 to

almost 4 points above the average of the entire class of which they are a part.

The Freshman group this current year have thus far averaged as follows: English 87.2, Mathematics 82.7 Language 85.6, Science 83, History 85.5.

Only one pupil of the 11 has in any subject averaged less than 80.

There is nothing mysterious about this for one of the most competent educators in America long ago made the statement that 25% of all normal pupils in our schools are in classes from one to two years below the grade where they belong and 25% are in grades which are too difficult: This leaves only half of our school population properly placed in the grade best adapted to the pupils welfare:—•

There is one and only one remedy for this deplorable condition, namely, withholding promotions for the slower, (but not necessarily less competent) group and advancing by extra promotions those who by ability and ambition are abundantly able to cover the pre-high school requirements in seven or even six years.

Our Derry plan of charting the school accomplishment of each individual pupil from grade four to grade eight inclusive enables us, as the above record of 28 pupils, demonstrates, to select with mathematical certainty at least half of the possible 25%, referred to by Dr. Terman, as being held back from such advancement as would be best for the pupil.

At the other end of this problem we are holding back less than half of the number which Dr. Terman's statistics show would be benefited by non-promotion.

As to school finances the public are well aware of the substantial reduction in recent years in the cost of school administration.

As to the quality of preparation for high school I am willing to submit the whole question to those who

have charge of Pinkerton Academy where 90 percent of our eighth grade graduates enroll and remain:

Just a word personally to each and everyone of the 28 pupils who have availed themselves of my plan of advancement: Without a single exception you have stood by your promise to me that you would endeavor to justify my faith in you and I take this opportunity to express my full appreciation of your hard work and to congratulate you on success greater than I expected.


