THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining Highways and Bridges, including the amount of one-fourth of one per cent.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deed.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$672.48 to continue street lighting.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for care of the Common at Grafton Center.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$763.13 and thereby receive \$5,087.55 from the State for Town Road Aid.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Department for the current year.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 for the observance of Old Home Day.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purchase of culverts.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and approprite the sum of \$3600.00 for the purpose of purchasing a power loader, the sum of \$1200.00 to be raised by taxation in 1957, the balance of \$2400.00 to be raised by two long term notes, one to be paid in 1958 and one in 1959.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the purpose of putting a seal coat of oil on the two pieces of road oiled last year.

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum og \$267.00 for the purpose of painting and making necessary repairs on Town Hall, this appropriation to supplement the unexpended balance now existing for this purpose.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as an emergency highway appropriation, said appropriation to be controlled by the Selectmen.
- 18. Shall the provisionns of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town.
- 19. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The biggest change this year in the education program in Grafton is, of course, the transporting of pupils in grades 7 and 8 to Bristol. This, or some comparable solution, became necessary because of two primary factors: 1) My failure to find a teacher qualified by state standards and with successful experience; 2) The decreasing number of pupils to be educated. Practically speaking, the month of May was spent looking for teachers for this supervisory union without any success. Much of the time from then until late summer was likewise used for this purpose. We are at the point where the question of hiring teachers is not wholly a matter of money but where teachers for certain types of positions just don't exist. Among these is that of the rural school. A local person within daily traveling distances seems to be the only possibility. A decreasing number of pupils made it possible to handle the first six grades with one teacher. Although I do not consider this a very desirable situation it is a defensible one, especially when the capabilities of our present teacher are considered.

Personally I hope the year spent in Bristol grades 7 and 8 will prove educationally profitable to those attending. Perhaps I should not do so, but I am going to point out that Grafton should feel fortunate in that there did exist good educational facilities for its pupils made available through the Bristol Authorities. This is not a one way proposition, however, and Bristol has profited materially and otherwise, and has always shown a willingness to make its facilities available as long as the size of the classes could be kept reasonable.

Another factor which had to be considered was that of transportation which had to be kept within reason for the school district and yet make it possible for the transporter to, at least, break even and, better still, to make a reasonable profit. A thousand dollars to be paid by the district seemed to be the limit and when the transportation facilities could be extended to high school pupils both in Grafton and Danbury the necessary funds to the transporter became available. Pupils, in these modern times, deserve the right to attend high school. The time will come when the school district will be required to pay these transportation costs.

Under the present state aid formula Grafton does not qualify for any money. It is doubtful if it will in the near future. The chief reason lies in our decreasing school population. A few years ago Grafton had over 80 elementary pupils, which, under the present formula would give us over \$5,000. A matter of 7 or 8 more pupils would let Grafton qualify now. For those interested in mathematics, below is a copy of the figures for 1956-57.

State Aid Formula to Qualify:

49.2 elementary pupils x \$200 — \$9,840.00 10.5 high school pupils x \$300 — 3,150.00

Total \$12,990.00

14 mill tax on equalized valuation of \$1,046,562.00 equals \$14,651.87. Since this figure is higher than the top figure of \$12,990 Grafton does not qualify for any aid. It can be seen that a few more pupils would soon

make the top figure higher than the millage one. Conversely a lower millage figure would soon qualify Grafton too. The equalized valuations are set by the Tax Commission.

Grafton should watch and study carefully various plans to form a cooperative school including the school districts from Salisbury to Enfield. These plans take a great deal of work to prepare and involve many meetings and discussions over a period of years. Any conclusions at this time would be premature but we should keep an active participation in these studies on an ever widening scale.
