THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to extend its electric lighting system and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class II road known as the Forest Road and raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$1200, or will accept State Aid for the construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$728.04 or take any action relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept a road to be built by Dr. L. V. Briggs to take the place of the existing road by the Briggs residence or take any action relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to insure the completion of the W. P. A. general road improvement project No. 1428.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the fire department.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80. to the Monadnock Region Association.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to repair the cemetery fence and raise and appropriate money for the same.
 - 10. To bring in votes for delegate to the constitutional convention.
 - 11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to extending and making replacements to the water system and raise and appropriate money for the same.
 - 12. To see if the Town will vote to sell a piece of the common adjoining the property of Mr. George Davis or take any action relating thereto.
 - 13. To see if the Town will vote to build a steel girder bridge over Ferguson brook at the Hubbard farm and raise and appropriate money for the same.
 - 14. To see what action the Town will take to provide supervision of our bathing beach and bath-house facilities during the summer months and raise and appropriate money for the same.
 - 15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to appoint a committee of five to gather material toward bringing the Town History down to the present time and raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars for their expenses or take any action relating thereto.
 - 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the moderator to appoint a committee of three to make recommendations for securing a new cemetery.
 - 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 to be used for making a plan for village beautification or improvement.
 - 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Library.
 - 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
 - 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money to pay for the Workman's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance.
 - 21. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes except poll taxes paid on or before July 15, 1938.

- 22. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home week or take any other action relating thereto.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts or legacies left in trust for use of the Town.
- 24. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.
- 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

The electric line has been extended during the past year to serve the residences of Barbara Davis, Hansel Shonamon, Ralph Bradley (cottage), Kimball Easterbrooks, and Harry Coffin.

We have added new services to Dr. Briggs' Alcock house, Charles Young, Errol Simonds, Amory Leland, George Ripley and Henry McQuade. A third wire has been added to the services of Sidney

Winslow, Richard Hensley and Warner's Garage.

The income from the line amounted to \$3,850.00 during the year. The balance of 1937 income amounting to \$942.87 has been received from the Public Service Co. of New Hampshire since the town books were closed.

In regard to the low voltage condition mentioned in the last report, during the summer we engaged the services of Mr. Clyde Loiselle, an electrical engineer who made tests all over the system with a representative of the Public Service Co. He found some lines which seemed to be overloaded and some changes were made to balance the load more evenly. We have not made any move to correct this condition permanently as we understand the Public Service Co. of New Hampshire will very soon make some changes on their line between the substation at West Peterborough and Peterborough village.

With this report I submit the statistical summary of the Hancock schools, together with the report of Miss Margaret Harris, school nurse.

Just before the opening of the school term we learned with deep regret of the serious illness of Miss Nellie Welsh, who has rendered such faithful service in the primary grades for many years.

After giving careful consideration to a number of candidates Miss Lillian Pearl Loiselle of Keene was chosen to take charge of the primary grades.

Miss Loiselle is a graduate of Keene Normal School with nine

years experience.

During the fall months all the schools were seriously affected by an outbreak of whooping cough, and because of the large number of absentees the physical examination in the graded school was postponed until later in the year.

At the opening of the school year the primary room was somewhat overcrowded but a number of changes occurred within a few weeks so that the enrollment of this school was reduced to less than thirty pupils.

Considering the large number of absences due to whooping cough

the schools have made satisfactory progress.

The Hancock High School has maintained its reputation under the leadership of Miss Manchester.

The large enrollment in the lower grades has necessitated the purchase of quite a large number of new books, but I believe the amount spent for text books will be within the appropriation.

It has been a pleasure to work in the Hancock schools, and I wish at this time to express my appreciation for the cordial support of the school board, teachers, pupils, and all who have shown their interest in the schools.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE HANCOCK

February 1, 1938

The routine inspection of each pupil's scalp, hair, teeth and general hygiene began with the opening of the school year.

The growth and weight chart with the periodic weighing and height records furnishes an incentive to practice rules which are simple but most important for health and normal growth.

A skin test clinic by the N. H. Tuberculosis Association for

detection of incipient tuberculosis began April 13, 1937.

Receiving first strength tests: Pupils No. 29

Receiving second strength tests: Pupils No. 23

Reactors—first tests 6, second tests 7.

Total reactors, 13.

Arm readings at 48 and at 72 hours were made April 15-16 and May 29-30.

Transportation was arranged and 13 pupils taken to Keene Hospital for X-rays. A complete written report of each picture was given by the technician.

Following the skin tests Dr. R. B. Kerr gave each pupil a chest examination and explained the X-ray findings. Home visits were made and parents were instructed on caring for their children to prevent the development of pulmonary tuberculosis in adult life.

A successful school dental clinic was held in March 1937; Dr. J. H. Grimes was the dentist. The dental clinic rates are greatly reduced and transportation problems eliminated; otherwise many of the children would be unable to have their work done. If it were not for the school dental clinics many children would never have any dental care.

Cod liver oil was furnished for those who didn't have it at home. Of inestimable value were the hot luncheons. The domestic science class served the lunch at the high school, and the Mother's Club furnished the hot dish at the graded school.

During the year the nurse made 114 school visits, 44 home

visits, 26 official visits, 2 welfare and 7 business calls.

I thank the superintendent of schools, members of the school board, teachers, parents, pupils, Red Cross and all others who helped to make health work a success.
