### TOWN MEETING WARRANT

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Landaff, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Landaff on Tuesday the 8th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate toward the support of the Lisbon District Nursing Association.
- 4. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for control of the White Pine Blister Rust in Landaff.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to buy a curtain for the town hall.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to install a suitable toilet.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to clean and grade the roadside on the town hall lot.
- 8 To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from H. A. Dexter corner to H. H. Hall place so called, and all highways between the Eaton Corner so called to the Bunga road so called and Bath line, subject to gates and bars according to chapter 72 of the Public Statues as amended by chapter 14 of the laws of 1903 as amended by chapter 19 of the laws 1925 retrieving towns of liability for damage incurred in the use of highways in certain cases.
- 9. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.
