#### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Lincoln qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the High School Auditorium in said district on the twenty-eighth day of March 1944, at seven o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

8. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.

9. To see if the District will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division, and to make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such an audit. 10. To see if the District will vote to adopt the non-partisan ballot system as provided in Chapter 22, Section 5, Laws of 1943, for the election of all district officers whose election is required by statute to be by ballot or whose election by ballot has been previously voted by the District.

11. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

In accordance with the request of the District an audit and examination of the accounts for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1943, has been made by this Division, a report of which is submitted herewith. Schedules as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Comparative Balance Sheets for the fiscal years ended June 30, 1942 and June 30, 1943, presented in Schedule A, indicate a decrease in Net Debt during the year of \$2,294.06. An analysis of the decrease in Net Debt is shown in Schedule A-1.

Comparative statements of Appropriations and Expenditures, Estimated and Actual Revenues for the fiscal year indicate a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,246.06, a net revenue surplus of \$20.97, and a resulting net budget surplus of \$1,267.03. (Schedules B and C)

Receipts and Expenditures summarized in acordance with the uniform classification of accounts are shown in Schedule D. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of June 30, 1943, is exhibited in Schedule D-1.

A statement of Bonded Indebtedness showing annual maturities is included in Schedule E.

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lincoln, which was made by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission in accordance with the vote of the town. This audit covers the period from December 18, 1942 to January 17, 1944.

#### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerks and the Municipal Court.

#### FINANCES

#### Revenues, Appropriations and Expenditures - 1942 (Schedules D and E)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the year ended January 31, 1943, are presented in detail in these schedules. A net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,882.89, and a net revenue deficit of \$1,529.78, resulted in a net budget surplus for the year of \$353.11.

#### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials who are charged with the custody of and who receive or disburse public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from the depository bank.

#### TAX ACCOUNTS

The tax warrants of Collector Henderson for the levies of 1941, 1942 and 1943, were audited and balanced as of January 17, 1944, as indicated by Schedule H.

#### **TOWN CLERKS**

The accounts of Town Clerk D. J. Walsh, were examined for the period from December 18, 1942 to March 9, 1943, and Town Clerk Archibald Ferguson, for the period from March 10, 1943 to January 17, 1944. All funds received by the Clerks from the issuance of motor vehicle permits and dog licenses were properly accounted for either through remittances to the treasurer or funds on hand. (Schedules I, I-1 and J)

#### MUNICIPAL COURT

An examination was made of the accounts and records of the Municipal Court and a summarized statement of the receipts and disbursements of the Court is contained in Schedule K.

#### **TOWN OFFICERS' BONDS**

The surety bonds of the town officers were inspected and found to be correct in form and sufficient in amount. A list of the officials required by law to furnish surety bonds, the amount thereof and the issuing company, are included in Schedule L.

#### **GENERAL COMMENTS**

It was noted that the recommendations as to accounting procedure, which were made in last year's report, had all been carried out this year. The financial accounts and records of all town officials which were examined were found in good condition and in accordance with prescribed methods.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, this report or a summary of its essential features should be published in the next annual town report. The letter of transmittal should be included in its entirety, but the inclussion of schedules is optional with the board of selectmen.

Our thanks is extended to the officials of the town for the assistance rendered and information furnished while we were engaged in making this audit.
