LITTLETON WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Littleton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town and State affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall and Police Court Room in the Town Building on the 10th day of March, next, being the second Tuesday of March, at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following:

Article 1: To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for the term of three (3) years, one Park Commissioner for three (3) years, a Town Treasurer, three members of the Board of Trustees of the Public Library for three (3) years, one member of the Board of Trustees of the Public Library for two (2) years, and one Trustee of Trust Funds for three (3) years.

Article 2: To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, relative to playing Beano in the Town of Littleton, and that the following question be placed upon the ballot to be used at said meeting—"Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, relative to playing the game of Beano be adopted in this Town?"

Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Australian ballot system for the election of Town officers, thereby rescinding the non-partisan ballot system; and that the following question be placed upon the printed ballot: "Shall the Town adopt the Australian ballot system for the election of Town officers, thereby rescinding the non-partisan ballot system?" (This Article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 4: To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Officers' salaries, general expense, elections, Municipal Court, Town Building, Civil Defense, Dredging River, Social Security, Police Department, Forest Fire, Blister Rust, Planning Board, Fire Department, Damage by Dogs, Employees' Retirement, Garbage Collection, Health Officer, Hospital, District Nurse Association, Special Highway Account, Town Garage, Dump, Sewers, Town Road Aid IV, Town Road Aid V, Street and Highway, Street Lights, Sidewalks, Superintendent of Public Works, Vital Statistics, Welfare, Old Age Assistance, National Holidays, Advertising, Region Association, Community Center, Recreation, Dutch Elm, Cemeteries, Public Library, Parks and Playgrounds, Hydrants, Interest on Indebtedness, Debt Retirement and other necessary expenses.

Article 5: To see if the Town will authorize its Board of Selectmen to purchase and install on Pleasant Street in said Littleton from the intersection of Pleasant Street with Main Street to the intersection of Pleasant Street with Cross Street, parking meters for the regulation of parking on said street, and the revenue resulting from the operation and use of said meters to be used to finance the purchase, maintenance and policing of said meters, or to maintain and improve streets and highways in the Town, or to acquire, construct, improve, maintain and manage public parking areas.

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) to purchase the land and premises situate northerly and westerly of Main Street in the Town of Littleton and in the rear of the theater building, including the land and buildings known as Hillvue Terrace property, and all rights-of-way and other rights appurtenant to the aforesaid premises, now owned by Eames Realty Company; and being the premises deeded said Eames Realty Company (1) by Blanche F. Eames and Ambrose P. McLaughlin, Jr., Trustees u/w John B. Eames, by deed dated April 1, 1957, recorded Grafton County Registry of Deeds, Book 889, Page 319, and (2) by Edward J. Brooks by deed dated December 12, 1950, recorded said Registry, Book 798, Page 183. (This article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 7: If Article 6 is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) from the Parking Meter Fund toward the purchase price.

Article 8: If Article 6 is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell that portion of the aforesaid Eames Realty Company property known as the Hillvue Terrace property, land and buildings, for such price or consideration as they deem advisable and proper, and to convey the same by appropriate deed of the Town; and further, authorize the Board of Selectmen to use the proceeds of said sale of the Hillvue Terrace property, or as much thereof as may be necessary, to develop the Eames property for a parking lot, including the purchase and installation of parking meters, the remaining balance of said proceeds, if any, to be added to the Parking Meter Fund.

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to purchase the Annie M. Lamont property situate on Pleasant Street for the sum of Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00) to be used for a parking lot, said sum to be taken from the Parking Meter Fund.

Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to participate in the Urban Planning Assistance Program and appropriate Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00) as the Town's share of the total cost. (This article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to sell the TV translator, equipment and rights of Channel 73 for the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to be paid by June 1, 1964. (This article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new fire pumper for the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00); and to trade in on account of the purchase price the Town's Maxim G.M.C. 750 gpm pumper for an allowance of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00); and further vote to raise and appropriate the balance of the purchase price, namely, Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$19,000.-00).

Article 13: If Article 12 is adopted, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town the sum of money so raised and appropriated; and for this purpose authorize the issue of serial notes of the Town under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, interest to be paid annually and the principal during a period of five (5) years.

Article 14: To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention (by vote upon the ballot to be used at said meeting).

Article 15: To see if the Town will vote that Sweepstake tickets be sold in the Town, and that the following question be placed upon the ballot to be used at said meeting: "Shall Sweepstake tickets be sold in this Town?"

Article 16: To see if the Town will vote to establish an Aeronautical Fund, in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 423:6. (if the vote on No. 16 is in the affirmative) (This Article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 17: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand and One Dollars (\$15,001.00) and pay such sum into the Aeronautical Fund. (if the vote on No. 17 is in the affirmative, pass over No. 18; if the vote on No. 17 is in the negative) (This article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 18: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Thousand and One Dollars (\$15,001.00) and pay such sum into the Aeronautical Fund and for this purpose to authorize the Selectmen to borrow upon the note of the Town a sum not in excess of Fifteen Thousand and One Dollars (\$15,001.00) at such rate of interest and payable at such time and place, in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and amendments thereto, entitled "Municipal Finance Act", as the Selectmen shall decide. (if the vote on No. 16 and No. 17 or No. 18 is in the affirmative) (This Article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 19: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen, in accordance with the Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 423:8, to transfer the sum of Fifteen Thousand and One Dollars (\$15,001.00) from the Aeronautical Fund to the New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission, said sum to be expended by said New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission on the Whitefield Regional Airport, so-called, in connection with the expansion of said airport facilities. (This Article inserted upon written application of voters.)

Article 20: To see if the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Board of Selectmen to publish and print in their reports once every three (3) years, beginning in the year 1964, rather than each year, a list of the owners, together with the assessed value of all taxable properties in Town, as the same appear upon their invoice book; and a separate listing to be made of stock-in-trade assessed values.

Article 21: To establish the annual salary of the Justice of the Littleton District Court, and the annual salary of the Special Justice of said Court, and the annual salary of the Clerk of said Court, in accordance with the provisions of the Revised Statutes Annotated, 502-A (Chapter 331, Laws of 1963); and to raise and appropriate a sum equal to fifty (50) percent of each salary thus established for the period beginning July 1, 1964.

Article 22: To choose any other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year, and to choose and elect any agents for Committees which may be necessary to carry into effect any vote that may be passed under the warrant.

Article 23: To hear the report of Agents, Auditors, Committees, including the Planning Board, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Littleton for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Sewer Bond Fund, Library, Planning Board, and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1962 - December 31, 1963: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1962 and December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt increased by \$570,001.42 in 1963.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$42,632.59, plus a revenue surplus of \$6,519.00, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$49,151.59.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1963, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Parking Meter Reserve Fund: (Exhibit B-4)

A summarized statement of the activity in the Parking Meter Account during 1963 is presented in Exhibit B-4.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit H)

A statement of outstanding Long Term Indebtedness as of December 31, 1963, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit H.

Municipal Court: (Exhibit I)

A statement of the accounts of the Littleton Municipal Court for the fiscal year of 1963, is included in Exhibit I.

Sewer Bond Fund: (Exhibit J)

A statement of the Sewer Bond Fund account for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1963, is presented in Exhibit J.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the

custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the book of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report, are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$14,898.58, from \$59,527.58 to \$74,426.16, in 1963, as shown herewith:

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

1963

In her will, Marion Cass left her unusual personal library of hundreds of books to the Littleton Public Library. From these, 51 titles, not in our library, have been added to our collection and about 50 titles have replaced soiled, shabby copies of the same titles. The exciting value of many of these books is that they are out-of-print and we are fortunate to have them to fill in and replace. All of these books are checked and arranged to be used as needed and will be cataloged gradually with the new books. In this gift are several New Hampshire history titles which we always need.

Two funds have become realities for the library in 1963: the Chester F. Meacham Fund for \$4,050.67 and the Hattie R. Meacham Fund for \$9,628.45. The interest from these funds is to be used for books.

Thirty-two books have been given to the library in 1963 in memory of the following people: Winfred E. Stoddard, George A. Edson II, John MacDonald, Bessie Edson, Herbert J. Beaton, Phillip E. Bedell, Ronald Nickerson, Mrs. Fleta Pennock, Edward A. Harmes, Dolor Fournier, Richard Poore, Penny Keough, Mrs. Frank Cady, and Louis Salway.

The \$1,000 worth of Shieling books, which Franconia, Lisbon, Sugar Hill, Bath, Lincoln and Littleton have been selecting at their cooperative book purchasing meetings with the N.H. State Library, have been divided among the six libraries and are now to be cataloged and shared by these libraries as needed. Our catalog will show the location of each of these books housed in a neighboring library. As soon as they are received the Shieling books have been rotating and used by the patrons of these libraries for over a year now.

Your librarian has attended professional meetings including 2 days at the New England Library Association Meeting at Wentworth-by-the-Sea in late September. Littleton has been host library to two Book Banquets held by the State Library to give trustees and librarians a chance to look over a large number of recent books. A most interesting meeting was held in Littleton December 6 at the high school library in the morning and at the public library in the afternoon. North country public and school librarians met with superintendents and state department personnel to discuss problems of school and public library use with an ultimate goal for better cooperation. Mrs. Armstrong, Littleton High School Librarian and your Librarian both spoke at this meeting. The north country meeting for the New Hampshire Library Association was held in Littleton in October.

Attorney Alexander J. Corey, president of the Littleton Board of Trustees and first vice president of the N.H. Library Trustees Association was honored in September by being named "outstanding trustee of the year." We are grateful to him for his work for this library and others of the state and we are proud too.

During the year the library was visited by the three first grades of the elementary school and they had a story, by Mrs. Kyte's nursery school class several times, by Mrs. Nute's pupils, and by Mrs. Hayden's ninth year English classes for instruction in the use of this library. Twenty-one collections of books are at the elementary school and one to St. Rose of Lima School.

National Library Week in April, Mrs. Riley spoke with the school librarians at the PTA meeting. Films were shown at the Littleton Public Library. Lists of outstanding books were distributed by Lotta Rock Dairy. Several trustees and the librarian attended the NLW Luncheon at Concord.

The special project the librarian accomplished, with the aid of her assistants, was to weed, check and replace when necessary all the fiction of the library for all age groups. Oversize books had become such a problem in our library that Mrs. Howard has marked ours with a special symbol and they are shelved together on their own adjustable shelving.

Last April Mrs. Patricia Gardner resigned and Mrs. Virginia Walsh came to us immediately.

Because our library offered too little space, the N.H. Bookmobile Littleton Office is to move to the Solomon Block, 20 Main Street, Littleton, N.H. Needless to say, we will miss the very direct source of books and professional aid. For about 23 years our library has been very fortunate.

The library has outgrown its present use of one floor. The large room upstairs has been painted and carpeted as the library board and librarian try to move ahead on this problem. To use the room for anything more than a meeting, more staff and more furnishings are needed. Also the library trustees have worked out plans for an easier front walk leading to our building.

And now I feel that great change lies ahead for N.H. libraries. I ask you all to study with me any new developments. Lastly, may I thank the library trustees, Mrs. Howard, Mrs. Gardner, Mrs. Walsh, Miss Patricia Richards, Mr. Kinne and all of you for this busy and good year at the Littleton Public Library.

**ANNUAL REPORT OF LITTLETON
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS
AND HIGHWAYS**

T.R.A. Work

There was no work done during 1963 on T.R.A. work, because of the extent of work done on Pine and Richmond Streets and re-surfacing program. There was no time available.

Sidewalks

The Dept. laid some more asphaltic concrete on sidewalks. There is still some left to do, but in general the sidewalks in town are in good condition.

Sewers

Other than the normal maintenance of sewer mains the only major sewer work was done in Richmond Street in conjunction with the reconstruction of that street. There was a new 8-inch transite sewer laid from Hill St., to Union St. This did away with several septic tanks and will service any other future development in that area.

Streets and Highways

During the 1963 season your Town Highway Dept. applied approximately 6000 tons of blade mix to town roads and streets. Most of these mix jobs were sealed with a light application of asphalt and sand.

Richmond Street was completely rebuilt and surfaced with Type I-1 asphaltic concrete. There was also a new sanitary sewer and a new storm sewer laid in the street.

Pine Street was also completely rebuilt with a new storm sewer, maintaining the existing sewer as a sanitary sewer. Type I-1 asphaltic concrete was used as a new surface with a new sidewalk and asphaltic concrete curbing.

There may be some small jobs of landscaping and seeding to be done this spring on Richmond and Pine Streets.

Although there is no street reconstruction scheduled for this year, we hope to make minor improvements on some streets such as eliminating narrow places, etc.

The blade mixing and sealing program of streets and highways will continue this year.

There were three special conference meetings attended. The first was held in Littleton on "First Aid for Artificial Respiration of a Patient With a Laryngectomy." The members of the Fire Department attended the class. Patients who have had this operation, the removal of the larynx, would never benefit from the usual mouth-to-mouth type of artificial respiration because they are not mouth breathers. Instead there is an opening in the neck and this is their means of breathing. There were two patients present who had laryngectomy operations and one helped to demonstrate the proper method, and most important of all, the recognition of such a person.

The other two conferences were held out of town. The N.H. Heart association met at St. Anselm's college in Manchester, and the N.H. Rural and Medical Workers met at the Hitchcock hospital in Hanover.

I spoke to the members of two club groups in town, and through the generosity of the Catholic Daughters of Court Bellefeur of Littleton a pair of bedside rails and a walker were obtained for use of any patient confined at home. They also provided vitamins for a total of 60 infants and school children of 14 families, and are continuing the vitamin project this year.

In September I had the chance to take one of the first trips made in the well-manned and well-equipped ambulance of the Fire Dept. when one of my patients was taken to the hospital.

There were fewer Pediatric Clinics this past year due to the loss of Dr. Hume. He was always a ready source of information and willing assistance, and he is missed. Dr. David Toll, a pediatrician from St. Johnsbury, has taken over the Clinics. Two have already been held with good results. This is a service of the N.H. State

Department of Health in cooperation with our local Health Services. Five children have been helped to stay within the family unit as a result of the care and treatment obtained through these clinics this past year. These are held at our Littleton hospital, as are the twice-a-year Orthopedic Clinics where 25 of the 58 patients seen were from Littleton. This total number includes children of all ages from Lisbon, Whitefield, North Haverhill and Lancaster. There have been three pre-school youngsters from Littleton seen at the Heart clinic held in Lancaster.

In September we had an Emergency Oral Sabin Vaccine Clinic due to the polio cases reported on the northern border of the state. The master sheets provided by the volunteer workers for our huge clinics held in the summer of '62 were of great value when the numerous telephone calls came inquiring if the person or family they named had the Type 3 vaccine or not. The members of the LCNA again served as clerical helpers and also assisted at the N.H. State Dept. of Health Chest Clinics held at the hospital twice in '63.

The 39 agency visits represent the meetings held with the town and county welfare representatives, a very necessary part of my work.

The equipment of hospital beds, wheelchairs, commode chairs, walkers, side rails and bedpans, as well as other small items, has been used by over 50 individuals. There are 30 pieces of equipment in use most of the time. At present there are two wheelchairs and one bed available. These are all loaned ONLY with the consent of the physician in charge of the patient. Each item is signed for by the person who receives it and it is signed in on return. Last year it was determined that a nominal charge of \$1 per month for the use of any equipment on loan, might help to replace or repair any items in need of it.

In March, Mrs. Trevor Mooney donated a wheelchair to the association which had been given to her by the Wilkes Barre Kiwanis Wheelchair Club, Inc., in memory of her husband who had been instrumental in obtaining this service for this community. This club is international in scope and is now active on all continents.

In addition to the previously mentioned walker, side rails and chair, the LCNA purchased mattresses for two of the hospital beds. Not every town has this type of service available and many times the demand out-numbers the supply we have of six beds, seven wheelchairs, four walkers, three commode chairs and other items. Some of the equipment is out for anywhere from one to five years. There is no time limit set on the use of the equipment and no one has to go without it if he cannot afford the \$1 per month charge.

At Christmastime 38 families received food and clothing through

the generosity of local clubs and individuals. Thank you, all who helped with the Christmas project.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to Mrs. Vonley Rugles, president of the LCNA, for her continued support in the past year, to the members of the association who assisted at the clinics during the year, and to Mr. and Mrs. Carroll Tefft at the Community House where the equipment is stored. Without their assistance it would be very difficult to carry out this work.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

To the Citizens of Littleton:

The school board of Littleton School District presents herewith its annual report. Included in this report will be found the audit of finances for year 1962-1963 by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission, budgets and estimated receipts and expenditures for this year and next year, and written reports by the superintendent of schools and the school nurse.

The budget for this coming year shows an increase over the present year. Over sixteen thousand dollars of this is reflected in teachers' salaries. New transportation contracts must be issued for a period of three years and bids received recently indicate an increase of close to two thousand dollars in that item. The balance of the increase is spread out over a number of other items.

The budget as printed on other pages of this report indicates that we anticipate receipts of \$85,000.00. This is a sizeable increase over previous years and is due to an increase in the number of tuition pupils.

Several years ago the school board informed the voters of the school district that, based on projected enrollment, it would be necessary to add some rooms to the senior high school to take care of additional students. This situation has not changed. In order to plan properly for this future building expense it is our recommendation that a capital reserve fund be established, the purpose of which fund would be to defray building expenses. We recommend that the anticipated cash balance of \$20,000.00 that will be available as of June 30, 1964 be placed in that fund and that during the next few years additional sums be placed each year in the fund. The capital reserve fund would make it possible for the school district to add more school space without the issuance of bonds and the payment of interest. At the same time the money in the fund would be earning interest which would increase its value. This plan seems to us to be a common sense plan to take care of future needs at the lowest possible cost to you, the taxpayer.

After careful study of the needs of our school system, we recommend an appropriation of \$561,715.57.

WARRANT FOR SCHOOL MEETING

To the inhabitants of the Union School District, in the town of Littleton, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the high school, in said Littleton, on Saturday, March 14, 1964 at 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles. (Discussion of warrant at 8:00 p.m.)

Article 1. To choose a moderator, a clerk, one member of the board of education for three years, and a treasurer.

Article 2. To see if the district will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division.

Article 3. To hear the reports of officers, auditors or committees of the district and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 4. (By petition) Shall the Union School District of the Town of Littleton request the New Hampshire General Court to amend that part of Chapter 313 of the Laws of 1909 entitled "An act in relation to the Union School District in the Town of Littleton" which sets the membership of the Littleton School Board at 3 or 5 members by enacting a statute placing the Union School District of the Town of Littleton under Revised Statutes Annotated 197:15 which provides that a school district maintaining a high school may have a board consisting of 3, 6 or 9 members. This act to be made effective as of March 1965 Union School Meeting.

Article 5. (By petition) Shall the Union School District vote to establish the membership of the Littleton School Board at 9 members to be effective as of March 1965 Union School Meeting, at which time 3 members will be elected for a three-year term, 2 members for a two-year term and 1 member for a one-year term. This action to be contingent upon passage of the enabling legislation by the 1965 New Hampshire General Court.

Article 6. To see if the district will appropriate a sum not to exceed \$20,000.00 from its anticipated unencumbered balance as of June 30, 1964 and transfer same to a capital reserve fund for the purpose of providing additional high school facilities at a future date.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 8. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Littleton Union School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District. SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board and the School District Treasurer.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1962 and June 30, 1963, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt increased by \$123,998.53 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$11,570.67, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$736.97, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$10,833.70.

Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1963, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Building Fund Account: (Exhibit B-3)

A summarized statement showing the activity in the Building Fund account during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, is presented in Exhibit B-3.

Statement of Bonded Debt: (Exhibit C)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1963, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit C.

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased from \$17,900.27 to \$11,901.74, during the fiscal year as shown by the following statement:

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Littleton:

It is with pleasure that I submit to you my annual report relative to your schools.

Since my last report there have been a number of changes on the faculty and several additions.

Mr. Roland Barnaby of Hampton, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, was elected physical education teacher at the elementary school, replacing Roland Kunst who resigned to accept a similar position in Nashua.

Mrs. Janice Guyette of Orleans, Vt., a graduate of Lyndon State College, was elected to teach Grade 3 to replace Mrs. Charlotte Keysar, who resigned to accept a position in Bethlehem.

Mrs. Judith Millen of Littleton, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' College, with previous experience in Bethlehem, was elected kindergarten teacher to replace Martha Jane Holmes who resigned to get married.

Mr. Roger Delude of Nashua, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, was elected full time music instructor to replace Mr. and Mrs. George McLure who were employed on a part-time basis.

Miss Linda Pallait of South Windsor, Conn., a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, was elected girls' physical education instructor in the high school, to replace Louise Nutt who resigned to accept a similar position in the southern part of the state.

Mr. Leo A. Lavoie of Shoreham, Vt., a graduate of St. Michael's College, was elected to teach mathematics, replacing Mr. Roger Farquharson who resigned to go into business.

Mr. Keith Gould of White River Junction, Vt., a graduate of the University of Vermont, was elected to teach English. Mr. Gould was an additional teacher added to the English Department.

Mr. Walter Matson, Jr., of Bolster Mills, Maine, a graduate of the University of Maine, was elected an additional teacher in mathematics and science.

Mrs. Shirley Aldrich of Dalton, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, and with previous experience in Lancaster, Littleton and New York, was elected to replace Mrs. Martha Shosa who resigned for family reasons at the Christmas recess.

Mr. Aldrige Vaillant of Ashland, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, was elected to replace Mr. Ernest Bradbury who resigned at the Christmas recess for health reasons.

Mr. Ralph Young of Littleton, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' College, and with previous experience in Alstead, Corinth, N. Y., and Whitefield, was elected to teach junior high science, replacing Mr. Richard Bushman who resigned to return to college for further study in the sciences.

Mrs. Myla K. Morse of Andover, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, with previous experience in Tilton and Andover, was elected an additional teacher in the junior high school.

Mr. Paul W. Henry of Derby, Vermont, a graduate of the University of Vermont, with fourteen years experience in Vermont as a teacher and principal, was elected principal of the high school in December, to replace Mr. Arthur J. Kenney who resigned to accept the principalship of North Reading High School in Massachusetts.

Major repairs and replacements in the schools since my last report include the following:

- Painting ceilings and walls in Mechanic Arts rooms
- Painting stairwell on west end of building
- Refinishing gymnasium floor
- Re-tubed main boiler
- Additional shelving in library
- Black-out shades in two rooms
- Installation of lavatory in Home Economics room

Equipment added to the high school includes 99 pupil lockers in the corridors, two adding machines to the Business Education Department, and the replacement of four typewriters in the Business Education Department, and some needed science equipment.

Last year the school department provided classroom-to-home telephone service to two bedridden high school pupils. This year that same service is being rendered to one pupil.

Partial departmentalization of classes is carried on in the upper grades in the Lakeway Elementary School and teachers are assigned to those subjects in which they are most proficient.

As a result of your vote at the last regular school district meeting, the elementary school was formally named the Mildred C. Lakeway Elementary School, and the new junior high wing the Daisy L. Bronson Junior High Wing. Appropriate lettering has been installed and simple dedication exercises were held honoring both former teachers in our school system.

A number of our teachers have attended summer school and extension courses to improve themselves in their respective areas. The results of their work is always reflected in the classroom.

The entire administrative and supervisory staff is continually making every effort to improve the educational program in the community. This year, through the cooperation of the Littleton school district and St. Mary's in the Mountains, a series of lectures are being sponsored that have received a good response in the community. All school age children may attend these programs free of charge. It is hoped that a similar program can be carried on in future years for these have been very educational as well as entertaining.

On other pages of this report will be found a list of teachers, statistical report, school calendar for the school year 1964-1965, and a report of the school nurse.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere thanks to the school board and all other personnel, as well as the citizens of Littleton for their continued cooperation and support.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience—a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump—it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.
