THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.

4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid to be expended on the Robie Road, so called, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,388.00 for the same, the State contributing \$2,388.00, or if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$718.46, the State contribute \$2,873.83 for construction of Class V highways.

5. To see how much money the Town will raise for Memorial Day and make appropriation for the same.

6. To see how much money the Town will raise for Old Home Day and make appropriation for the same.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three hundred dollars, (\$300.00), for the Laconia Hospital, to be used for the care of needy residents of the Town.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing the tractor and snow plow, now rented by the Town, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to purchase forest fire fighting equipment.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the care of old cemeteries.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds.

14. To see what action the Town will take relative to the repair or rebuilding of bridges damaged by the 1938 flood, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sufficient sum to pay all Town indebtedness up to January 31, 1938, incurred by flood damage and rental of tractor and snow plow.

16. To see what action the Town will take relative to purchasing a cook stove for use in the Town Hall, and raise and appropriate money for the same.

17. By request. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue W. P. A. Projects for one year and raise the sum of \$10,000.00 for the repair of highways and bridges.

18. By request. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Overseer of the Poor full control of handling all Relief money and to limit the amount to be spent to not over \$500.00 for each quarter beginning

April 1st, and any money left over may be used in the following quarter if necessary.

19. By request. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 for the Newfound Lake Region Association of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and advertising relative to natural advantages and resources of our Town, in co-operation with other towns in this Newfound Lake Region.

20. By request. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$160.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with other Towns in the Lakes Region.

21. By request. To see if the Town will vote to exempt from taxation, for a period of five years the first experienced blacksmith who settles in town to practice his trade.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of New Hampton:

In General

The same number of schools, six, have been maintained this past year as previously. The same teachers as the year before have been employed except at Sanborn School, where Miss Foster's resignation necessitated a change. Mr. Rene Mathieu, a graduate of Keene Normal School, class of 1938, was secured for this school. The total registration for the school year ending June 30, 1938, was 101 and average attendance 94. There were 41 tuition pupils last year; at the present time there are forty.

Equipment

As I reported last year, the text book supply in New Hampton is fairly adequate. There are maps and globes in each school room, but supplementary reading along lines of Health, Geography, Nature, History, Civics, Government, Travel, Adventure, Character Building, Local History and Occupations are wanting, for the most part. The sets of books sent out to the schools by the local library are helpful and much appreciated, but we need more than that. It is unfortunate that more school material cannot be secured designed to so interest rural pupils in their country environment that more will desire to remain there and accept the challenge of the opportunity for improving rural life by developing themselves into leaders. While it is true that the automobile has brought the rural community nearer the city attractions and that scientific farming is proving attractive to the rural youth, it is equally true that even now too many are leaving the farms for the false lure of the city life with

its possibilities of accumulating wealth. Experience of years alone will teach these that the truest-hearted people, the most abundant life, the best type of citizenship, is developed in rural communities.

It is the problem of the home, the school, the church and community as a whole to demonstrate to the younger generation that the country is a better place to live in than the city. The cooperation of all these agencies is needed; no single agency can do it alone.

The schools will have a large part in making rural life a more abundant life, by adopting a curriculum that is adaptable to rural environment, regardless of the old traditional education practices.

Health

Schools everywhere, as well as the general public are interested in looking after the health of the children. The "school nurse" has become an important part of the school system in New Hampshire. The schools attempt to teach health habits and practice them. This year each school has been supplied with health books for study. Both school nurse and teachers are continuously preaching principles of good health: just how much of this is supplemented in the homes we have no means of knowing. Health is a very important matter. It is worthy of the fullest cooperation between home and school.

Noon Lunches

I would like very much to see in all the New Hampton schools arrangements made for serving every noon some one hot dish like soup, chowder, or a baked dish, to those not near enough to go home. Hot cocoa could be served to supplement the lunch brought by the pupils. The expense would be small, the benefits great. It would be a splendid project for the Grange to sponsor.

School Attendance

The number in school Sept. 30th, 1937, was 99; the number Sept. 30th, 1938, was 120, an increase of 21 this year. The tardiness record this past year has improved from 182 in 1937 to 155 in 1938.

The 155 is too many. The home can help in this matter by sending children to school on time. Tardiness is a bad habit to "grow up" with regardless of what one's life work may be. The Plaisted School holds the banner for best attendance record last year.

Graduation

Eight boys and eight girls graduated from the 8th grade last June. The graduation was in recognition of the general observance of the Sesquicentennial celebration. The schools presented four one act plays: "The Flag Maker," "The Preamble Speaks," "The New Constitution," and "The Four Absentees."

These plays were all well done and reflected great credit upon both teachers and pupils. The music for graduation was of the earlier period and very appropriate for the occasion. The whole exercise was timely, appropriate, instructive and interesting.

Conclusion

We have good pleasant schoolhouses, children of good average intelligence and good faithful teachers working with your children. Good results ought to be secured and I believe are.

I think New Hampton is fortunate in having the services of so good a music supervisor. Mrs. Adams certainly secures good results and is to be commended for her work.

The school nurse has charge of eight towns, and regardless of how good she may be, it is too large a district to give equally satisfactory service to all.

I think the town is to be congratulated upon having a new schoolhouse and especially upon being able to make the last payment due for it this coming year.

I appreciate the very pleasant cooperation of the school board and teachers this year. Working in New Hampton has been very pleasant.

All pupils have been weighed three times and report sent to the parents each time.

Also all pupils have been checked twice a year regarding vision.

Dental defects were rechecked late in the year and an opportunity provided for group appointments with local dentists. It is hoped that this phase of the school work may be increased by the setting up of a fund by some local organization. A relatively small sum of money can be made to do a great deal of work by the cooperation of the dentist.

Arrangements were made possible for several tonsilectomies through the cooperation of physicians and surgeons.

The local Red Cross has made possible the distribution of cod liver oil to all schools. Where parents have cooperated the better attendance of the children and their freedom from colds has been most noticeable.

Thanks are due all organizations and individuals contributing in any way to the success of the program.
