Appropriations and other Articles of Town Business will begin at 7:30 in the evening.

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF ROLLINSFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF STRAFFORD, IN SAID STATE, QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town, the tenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon Article 1. All other Articles to be acted upon in the evening.

- ARTICLE 1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, One Selectman and Overseer of Welfare for a term of three years, One Road Agent for one year, and Chief of the Fire Department.
- ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes of the 1959 levy except poll taxes, paid within thirty days after presentation of warrant to Collector.
- ARTICLE 3. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to have the Town Books audited every year by State Tax Commission.
- ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to revoke its previous adoption of the non-Partisan Ballot System.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to abandon the so-called Dump Crossing if or when the B & M R.R. builds a road on the westerly side of the railroad leading to dump.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to publish all delinquent Head and Poll Tax payers.
- ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote on disposing of Town Tractor, it being no longer serviceable.
- ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote on disposing of the 1930 Ford Tank Truck which no longer can be of any service to the Town.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and compel the Selectmen to have printed in the annual town report the value and tax of all property assessed in said town of Rollinsford. (By Petition).
- ARTICLE 12. To choose all other necessary
  Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford favor the abolition of the Rollinsford Municipal Court.

#### REPORT of the SUPERINTENDENT of SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Rollinsford:

In this my first report to you, I wish to echo the words of my predecessor and say "Rollinsford has a good school". It is out of the ordinary for any school to retain its entire teaching staff for more than one year. The feat was accomplished in your school this year with very favorable results. The teachers have been able to begin productive work from the very first school day. There has not been the usual confusion and delay between teachers or between teacher and pupil that results whenever someone new takes over a teaching assignment. Some change is good, but in the past few years we have had too many changes which are not all good.

The salary schedule for teachers which was adopted last year is a prime factor in the retention of the staff. I firmly believe that you must keep within range of surrounding towns as to teacher salaries in order that we remain in a competitive position as to teacher recruitment and/or retention.

The curriculum at the school is basically fundamentals, reading, writing, and arithmetic. A thorough grounding in the area of basic fundamentals is the only basis upon which a student can build towards later achievements in any field. We have expanded the program in the area of science in order that the youngsters become acquainted with the basic elementary concepts in this area.

Transportation this year has been a difficult item to handle with the present equipment, two forty-eight passenger buses. It will be necessary to add a third vehicle to care for increasing numbers. I have therefore, recommended the addition of a sixty passenger bus which should be sufficient for a few more years unless extensive home building takes place.

The possibility of school expansion has occupied the School Board, your Superintendent, and Principal during the last few months. We have explored the area of enrollment projection, possible home building developments, and types of school expansion. An exploratory meeting with the architect who designed the original building was held last fall. I want to emphasize that no definite plan is being considered at this time. All thinking up to this point is purely academic in the eventuality that we might have to add to the present school building. The School Board is to be commended for their foresightedness in this action.

The School Budget this year has increased as it must with increased costs and increased enrollments. The major increases are in salaries, transportation, and tuition costs. Salaries and transportation were dealt with previously in this report. Tuition costs increases are due to higher tuition rates and a larger number of children going on into high school.

The following reports and statistics will further explain the major areas in our

school.

I wish to close this report with an expression of appreciation to the School Board for their cooperation and help. I also want to commend your very able Principal, Mr. Hatfield, and the teachers for their help and assistance.

It is with pleasure that I am at this time able to submit a report that in part covers some of the activities of the Rollinsford Grade School during the year 1958-59.

## ENROLLMENT

The activities of the Rollinsford Grade School began this year on September 2, 1958 with an enrollment of two hundred and eight pupils. Since the beginning of the school year we have had a small but steady increase in the enrollment until at the present time it now stands at two hundred and fifteen pupils. The follow-

## INSTRUCTION

The Rollinsford Grade School adheres to the following Statements of basic beliefs:

- 1. Educational opportunity should be provided for all children and youth and for adults to the full extent of their abilities and aptitudes through a program which recognizes and provides for individual differences.
  - 2. Teaching is a profession requiring

special preparation in subject matter, teaching methods, and knowledge of how children grow and learn.

3. The curriculum of a school cannot be static; it must be responsive to changing local, state, and national needs.

#### 4. Our aims are to:

- 1. Foster intellectual growth as a primary objective.
- 2. Teach the basic skills thoroughly.
- 3. Provide a balanced educational program in terms of the abilities and aptitudes of all learners.
- 4. Develop the attitudes, habits, values, appreciations, and understandings essential for a well adjusted person and a contributing member of our society.
- 5. Recognize and develop the special talents and meet the special needs of all pupils.
- 6. Develop the ability to make rational judgments based on accurate and complete information.
- 7. Contribute to physical and mental health.
- 8. Help pupils grow morally and spiritually.
- 9. Contribute to the social and aesthetic development of pupils.
- 10. Help pupils develop increasing ability to exercise self-discipline as individuals and in groups.

- 11. Develop a respect for work and for skill in performance, and the ability to carry tasks through to completion.
- 12. Stimulate an attitude for continued learning throughout life.

Our school presents a program of organized experiences for all children between the ages of 6 and 14. Common learnings in grades 1-6 include the elementary skills, knowledges, and understanding of:

The Language Arts -- reading, literature, listening, oral and written language, handwriting and spelling.

Quantitative subjects -- arithmetic and elementary mathematics.

The Social Studies -- geography, history, citizenship, and related fields.

Sciences -- elementary physical and biological sciences.

The Arts -- Art, music, drama, and dance.

Physical well-being -- health, physical education, and recreation.

Equally important is the elementary school's effort to help children develop healthy personalities. As subject matter is mastered, the elementary school child learns to work and study, recognizing standards of skilled workmanship; to live safely; to contribute to his group; to cooperate with others; to assume responsibility; to accept leadership.

Such traits as honesty, reliability, fair play, sensitivity to others, self-control are developed through day to day activities.

## FACULTY

The faculty of the Rollinsford Grade School has undergone no change from the preceeding year.

## SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

The lunch program of the school is under the capable guidance of Mrs. Barbara Wilson who serves as both dietician and cook. She is assisted in her cooking and serving duties by Mr. Willis Lane.

The lunches that are served are both tasty and wholesome. They are well received by the pupils of the school. The cost per meal for the pupils is twenty-five cents.

A typical lunch for each day of the school year is as follows:

- (1) A hot dish, consisting of one of each of the following:
  - (a) Beef, Pork, Lamb, Chicken, Turkey, Fish
  - (b) Potato, Rice, Noodles, Macaroni, Spaghetti
  - (c) Vegetables, according to the season, both fresh and canned
- (2) A sandwich of some variety
- (3) A dessert of some variety cake, pie, cookies, ice-cfeam, fruits, etc.
- (4) A bottle of pasteurized milk.
