



THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Warrant for 1976 Annual Meeting of the Town of Rumney

To the inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton and State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday the 2nd day of March, next, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be opened for balloting on Article 1 and shall close not earlier than 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon, and you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday the 9th day of March, next, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon for the second session of the town meeting at which time action will be taken upon the remaining articles in this warrant.

Article 1: To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2: To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriation of the same.

Article 3: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.

Article 4: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

Article 5: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate to acquire either by negotiated purchase or by eminent domain, 14.3 acres of land on the west side of the Buffalo Road now owned by Edward Banel, trustee, to be used as a sanitary land fill site in order to comply with state and/or federal statutes and regulations prohibiting open burning, and to credit against the sum so appropriated whatever balance remains in the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, with the remainder of the sum so appropriated to be raised from current taxes.

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 for the purchase of a new fire truck, \$5,000.00 of the sum so appropriated to be set off, if available, by a withdrawal in that amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, \$5,000.00 of

the sum so appropriated to be taken from the capital reserve fund which was established pursuant to an affirmative vote on Article 7 of the Warrant for the 1975 Town Meeting, and the balance to be raised by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of a note or notes of the Town pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act.

(Affirmative action on this article requires a two-thirds vote.)

Article 7: In the event of a negative vote on Article 6, to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 to purchase a new fire truck, \$5,000.00 of the sum so appropriated to be set off, if available, by a withdrawal in that amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, \$5,000.00 of the sum so appropriated to be taken from the capital reserve fund established puusuant to an affirmative vote on Article 7 of the Warrant for the 1975 Town Meeting, and the balance to be raised from current taxes.

(Affirmative action on this article requires a majority vote).

Article 8: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be added to the capital reserve fund to be used for the purchase of equipment for the Fire Department.

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be used to make the Town's existing fire protection reservoirs fully operative.

Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$494.40 in order to secure from the State the sum of \$3,296.01 for Town Road Aid.

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,497.00 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc.

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,245.50 for ambulance service.

Article 13: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the New Hampshire Humane Society.

Article 14: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be added to the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 15: to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the use of the Planning Board.

Article 16: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Conservation Committee.

Article 17: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be applied toward the preparation of a town tax map.

Article 18: To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to lay out a Class VI highway, the traveled portion to be twenty (20) feet in width, following the course of Rattlesnake Trail, commencing at Stinson Lake Road and running in a general westerly direction to the boundary of the White Mountain National Forest.

(This article inserted by petition. Town counsel has advised the Selectmen that this article is out of order.)

Article 19: To see if the Town will vote to elect the members of the Planning Board, commencing at the next regular town meeting, according to the terms of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 36:4 (II) (b).

(This article inserted by petition.)

Article 20: To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.

Article 21: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell and convey or otherwise dispose of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town by any Tax Collector's deed.

Article 22: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and pay the obligations of the Town.

Article 23: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, accept and expend on behalf of the Town such aid as the Town may now be entitled to receive or hereafter become entitled to receive from the Federal Disaster Assistance Administration.

Article 24: To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the Nooth Country Council, organized in July, 1973. The Council has been designated by the State Office of Comprehensive Planning to be the official planning commission for the New Hampshire Planning Region

One. The objectives of the Council are to prepare a comprehensive plan for the region, work for consensus on major problems of regional concern, encourage and assist in cooperative projects to solve problems involving more than one town, and help member communities in their planning programs.

The Council's authority is conferred by R.S.A. 36:45-53. It is advisory to local governments in the region. Member representatives of the Council are appointed by the Board of Selectmen, as provided by State Law. Two representatives will be appointed from this Town.

Article 25: In the event of an affirmative vote on Article 24, to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$750.00 as the Town's share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1976. These funds will be used for financing staff, office and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the Council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

Article 26: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Baker River Audio Visual Center which was established in 1974 as the result of a Federal Grant.

Article 27: To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the old town road as it was located prior to its relocation following the flood of 1927, that leads from the East Rumney Road to the hunting camp now owned by Harold Bixby.

Article 28: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Bicentennial Committee.

Article 29: To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ACTIVITIES OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

- 1. Two trips to Mr. Stanley Shmishkiss' development on Stinson Lake. A paper was written and given to the Planning Board indicating position of the Conservation Commission.
- 2. Monitoring of Stinson Lake on south and southeastern shores to develop bench mark measurements to determine if or when pollutants enter lake from condominiums. Sampling started on January 31, 1976.
- 3. Letter to Society for the Preservation of New Hampshire Forests giving support to the Quincy Bog project known as the Rumney Ecological System.
- 4. Attended meeting of Soil Conservation Service in the town of Wentworth involving plans for completion of dam sites on the Baker River and tributaries.
- 5. Cruised town forest in East Rumney with foresters and town officials to determine how tract should best be managed. Report written and sent to Selectmen.
- 6. Investigated dredge and fill request that was submitted by the New Hampshire Water Resources Board to repair flow guaging station in Baker River. On site meeting with state engineer. Project has not been started due to shortage of funds.
- 7. Investigated dredge and fill request that was submitted by Mrs. Nancy Block to straighten brook running past residence into Stinson Lake. Two trips plus conversations with road agent and contractor.
- 8. Investigated dredge and fill request that was submitted by Mr. Elliot Comenitz to clean beach area on Stinson Lake. Three trips made to area, conversations with contractor and member of Fish and Game Department who was requested by Conservation Commission to investigate. Project completed.
- 9. Requested Ford Foundation to extend time limit on remaining funds in grant to July, 1976. Request granted.
- 10. Several discussions, meeting, and conversations with state officials on solid waste management. This included cruise with Mr. Tom Sweeney, Solid Waste Management Director, of a site adjacent to present Rumney dump. Presently, it would seem that Rumney has

until July, 1977, to consider solid waste plans. It should be pointed out that the date has been pushed back twice by the General Court for towns of populations under 2,500, and it is not clear what will be the final decision.

- 11. Land use decisions in the state are uncertain; two meeting attended by Conservation Commission with nothing concrete to report.
- 12. Plymouth Airport and possible impact on Rumney particularly East Rumney was researched but with some difficulty because plans for the project are somewhat hazy.
 - 13. Awaiting soil survey from Soil Conservation Service.
- 14. Baker River monitored from May to September in 1975 under a grant from Spaulding Potter Trust Fund to Mr. Lawrence Cushman and Dr. Robert Frey. In general, the river falls well within Class B standards. Occasional tributaries were found to exceed allowable coliform counts, but this occured mostly during long dry spells as were prevalent in 1975.
- 15. Attended meeting at Lincoln, New Hampshire, concerning VTN's study of alternate routes and Interstate 93. Other meetings and decisions since this meeting have fairly well established that no interstate highway will be built through Baker River Valley.
- 16. Sent questionnaire to New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions that they requested.

PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY, INC.

The Agency has added an important new service this year which has benefited many residents in Rumney. This is called the Home Health Aid-Homemaker program. This service helps those who need occasional nursing care but cannot help themselves while recuperating from an illness in the area of nutrition, cleanliness and understanding. This service eliminates the need for an expensive stay in a nursing home for many.

This service was first funded by a grant through the Laconia Health Agency, which due to financial trouble had to disband, and has been carried this past year by the Pemi-Baker. Some of the service costs will be paid by Medicare, Medicaid, Blue Cross/Blue Shield '65 and a grant which the agency has now applied for, but a portion of the financing will devolve upon the towns.

Many people served by the agency are unable to help pay for this service, some can only pay part of the cost. Rumney's appropriation, therefore, makes this service available to those whose physician feels that his patient will benefit from this type of care in his or her home.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

REPORT TO TOWNS

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS AS OF DECEMBER 31, 1975

Three new and two increases in Cemetery Care Trust Funds have been established in 1975 as well as a new Fire Department Equipment Capital Reserve Fund and a \$1,000.00 addition to the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund.

The report submitted herewith has been prepared according to guidelines from the Municipal Services Division, Department of Revenue Administration, Concord, New Hampshire, based on the enactment of Chapter 78, Section I, of the Laws of the 1975 Legislature. This new Law provides that the Trustees "shall not print in such report the reports of trusts created for the care of cemeteries and burial lots". An exception is that in the year in which the Town accepts gifts, legacies and devises for such purposes, the Trustees shall so print in the Town Report.

The Trustees of Trust Funds are still obligated to file complete reports to the New Hampshire Attorney General and the Department of Revenue Administration.

In 1975 the individual Trusts for Cemetery Care earned the regular savings bank interest of 5.25% while the Common Trusts Cemetery Care Funds were allocated 7.886% interest.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the 6th day of March, 1976, at 7:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see what action the District will take relative to the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers.
- 2. To see if the District will authorize the recitation of the traditional Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag in the public elementary schools in accordance with RSA 194:15-a, wherein pupil participation in the recitation of the Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance shall be voluntary.
- 3. To see if the District will vote, pursuant to RSA 31:105 (supp) to indemnify and save harmless for loss or damage occurring any School District employee, school administrator, school board member, school district officer, or agent from personal financial loss and expense, including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit, or judgment by reason of negligence or other acts resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to or destruction of property, provided that the indemnified person at the time of the accident resulting in the injury, damage, or destruction, was acting in the scope of his employment or office.
- 4. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to accept and expend on behalf of the School District revenue sharing money from the Town of Rumney to be used for the purchase of a school bus.
- 5. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to make application for, accept, and expend on behalf of the School District all gifts, advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for educational purposes, as may now or hereafter be available or forthcoming from the United States government, the State of New Hampshire, or any other federal, state, or local agency.
- 6. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials, employees and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

7. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

In the past few years the Rumney School District has made significant improvements in the quantity and quality of the services provided the students of the Russell School.

Without a doubt the most important people in the growth of any school system are the teachers. The difference between a good school and a bad one usually can be directly related to the quality of instruction — the teaching. Many hours are spent observing the instruction of the Rumney teachers. These observations are primarily designed to assist teachers in the constant improvement of teaching. Usually the following format is used:

- 1. a pre-conference
- 2. the observation
- a post-conference

The end result is, hopefully, a better school system. We feel that when teachers and administrators work together for the benefit of students, a great deal can be accomplished.

The proposed budget for the 1976-1977 school year represents many hours of deliberations and some difficult decisions by the School Board. Faced with the needs of the school and the always present concern for the local tax payer, your School Board feels this budget is a reasonable compromise.

Some Highlights of the Proposed Budget

Account #135

The new negotiations law places the Board in a position where advice from legal counsel and others is necessary to protect the best interests of both the community and the teachers.

Account #210

Primarily this account represents a negotiated settlement with the teachers and the results of the merit plan.

Account #850.2

The rate for the School District share of the N.H. Teacher Retirement will go from the present 1.07% to 2.58% in July, 1976.

Account #1267

The need for a newer school bus is evident and the Board is recommending \$6,000.00. Without doubt, the District saves money by owning and operating its own bus.

Account #1477.1

The number of high school tuition students has increased and the rate has increased resulting in over \$18,000.00 more for this account.

REPORT FROM THE PRINCIPAL RUSSELL SCHOOL

The school year for the Russell School began with four new faculty members.

Mrs. Long came to the Russell School with an experienced background. Under her very capable leadership the resource room program has been expanded to include not only grades 1-4 but also grades 5-8. Mrs. Long has done much work with students in problem areas of reading. She has also been meeting with grades 1-4 every week for "movement education".

Mr. Hulick, also an experienced teacher, is the social studies teacher for grades 5-8. He further teaches science (7th grade), physical education, and coaches football and baseball.

Mr. Latus joined the staff having two distinct responsibilities. In the mornings he works with special students on a "one-to-one" basis. In the afternoon session he teaches science to grades 5, 6, and 8.

The last new member of the staff, but by no means the least, is Mr. Steinsieck, the art teacher. Students eagerly anticipate his arrival on Fridays. His program for students is varied, innovative, and well received.

The faculty of the Russell School works very diligently to meet the individual needs of our students. Our major educational aim centers around improving basic reading and math skills. We have also attempted, within our budgetary means, to provide positive and meaningful experiences for our students. This includes, among other things, a variety of field trips, films, and guests to the school. With the aid of volunteer help, we are expanding our present library facility. Mrs. Goodnough, our speech therapist, is at the Russell School for a full day this year. Our school nurse, Mrs. Parmelee, has been testing vision and hearing, as well as offering health and hygiene programs. Mr. Smith, our custodian, has worked hard and long to keep the school clean and bright. His ability to construct bookcases, partitions, library shelving, and storage spaces has been of inestimable value to us all.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1974-1975

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district, and their share of same. Said report shall be filed with the school board of each school district involved and shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrators, if any is in service in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuations. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$18,500 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of Supervisory Union #48 during 1974-1975 was made up as follows: \$2,500 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$16,000 was prorated among the school districts comprising the Supervisory Union. Allowance for \$1,000 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of the Assistant Superintendent during 1974-1975 was made up as follows: \$2,400 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$13,100 was prorated as stated above. Allowance for \$1,200 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.
