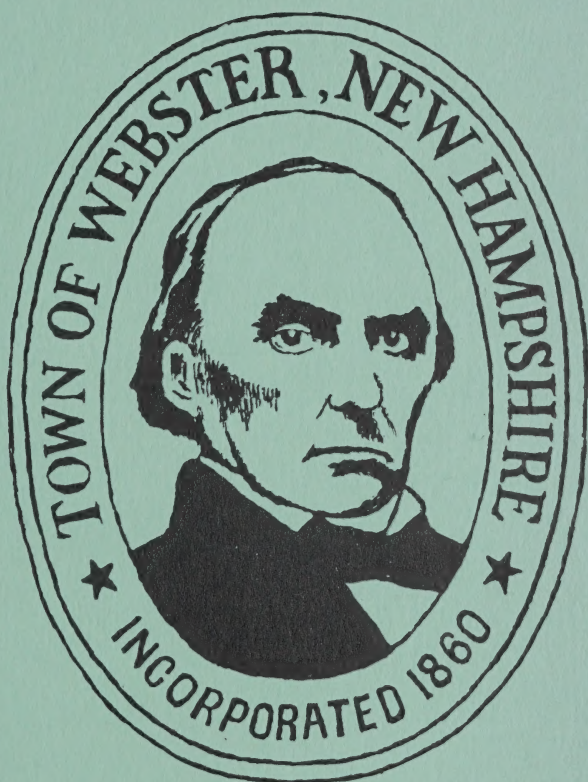

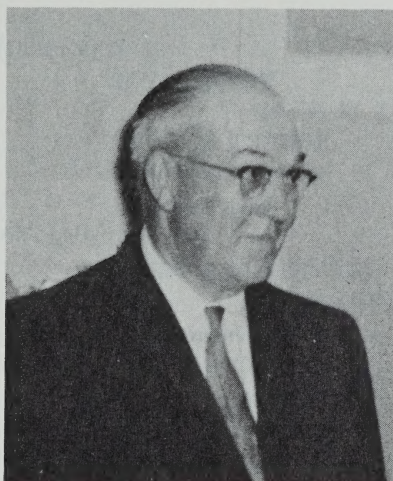

WARRANT

for the

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L.S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Webster Central School in said Webster on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine-thirty of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of highway and bridges.
 - a. Summer Maintenance.
 - b. Winter Maintenance.
 - c. Tar Roads.
 - d. General Expense of Highway Department.
 - e. Street Lighting.
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$585.80 for class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Public Welfare.
 - a. Town Poor.
 - b. Old Age Assistance.
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money

as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library.

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Patriotic purposes.

- a. Old Home Day.
- b. Memorial Day.

8. To see if the town will vote to pay the Fire Chief a salary and fix the amount of same.

9. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

10. To authorize the selectmen to accept, in the name of the town, gifts or bequests of funds for cemetery lot maintenance and care, this authority to continue without further vote, until amended or repealed by some future town meeting.

11. To establish a board of three cemetery commissioners with full power over the maintenance and operation of town cemeteries, and to fix their compensation; such commissioners to be appointed by the selectmen and to serve for staggered terms of three years each, provided that the first appointments shall be for terms of one, two and three years, respectively.

12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$136.80 for use in connection with the state program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

15. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$30,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year, 1966, said notes payable from said taxes within one year from date of issuance, and to

authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the maintenance of the playground.

17. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of the old trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation commission to provide a matching sum.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to purchase a new furnace for the library and Selectmens office. Any excess of appropriation to be used for repairs to the building.

19. To see if the Town will adopt the following by-laws:

Town By-Laws for the Purpose of Preserving Property Values by Regulating Land Uses and Building Practices.

For the purposes of promoting the health, safety and general welfare of the community, for conserving property values and for encouraging appropriate use of land:

The Town of Webster, in town meeting assembled, hereby adopts the following by-laws

Sect. 1. No premises in the Town of Webster shall hereafter be used for a commercial trailer park. As used in this section, "Commercial trailer park" means a tract of land where two or more trailers are permitted to park, upon payment of a fee or other compensation to the owner or lessee of the land.

Sect. 2. No second-hand trailer shall hereafter be erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of Webster for use as a residence or dwelling unless such trailer is less than three years old (meas-

ured from date of first use) at the time of such erection or installation.

Sect. 3. The minimum lot size for any lot on which any building, structure or trailer shall hereafter be erected, installed or located in the Town of Webster, for use as a residence or dwelling, is one acre; provided however, that in the case of residential lots fronting on a lake, pond or river such minimum lot size shall be one-fourth acre.

(a) Such a residential lot shall have not less than 200 feet frontage on the town highway, state highway or private right of way which serves it:

(b) Provided, however, that a waterfront residential lot, as above described, shall have not less than 100 feet frontage on any such highway or right of way and not less than 100 feet frontage on the water.

(c) No conforming lot now or hereafter used for residential purposes shall be so reduced in size as to make it non-conforming hereunder.

(d) This section shall not apply to lots previously dedicated to residential purposes by the prior recording of a plan in the registry of deeds and by the prior sale of lots thereunder.

Sect. 4. Every dwelling house, residence or accessory building and every trailer used for such purposes, hereafter erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of Webster, shall have a minimum set back of 50 feet from the town highway, state highway, or private way which serves it, measured from nearest right of way sideline.

Sect. 5. Every dwelling house, residence, or trailer used for such purposes, hereafter erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of Webster shall be equipped with suitable underground sanitary sewage disposal facilities conforming to the recommended standards of the N. H. Division of Sanitary Engineering, which are hereby adopted as the requirements of this by-law.

Sect. 6. Every dwelling house, residence, or trailer used for such purposes, hereafter erected, installed or located on any premises in the Town of

Webster, shall have at least 400 square feet of floor space on the ground floor, measured along the outside walls.

Sect. 7. Whenever the construction, erection or installation of any new residence, dwelling and accessory building thereto is hereafter commenced on any premises in the Town of Webster, the owner thereof shall cause the exterior finish thereof to be completed in a workmanlike manner with the use of suitable exterior building materials, in accordance with generally accepted standards of exterior finish for residential construction, within one year after beginning of such construction, erection or installation.

Sect. 8. The board of selectmen shall be responsible for the enforcement of this by-law, either on their own initiative or upon complaint by any interested person. The board may hold informal hearings for the purpose of investigating grievances and issuing interpretations hereunder.

Sect. 9. Any owner of premises which is used in violation of any section hereof, or any owner or other person responsible for the construction, erection, installation or location of any building, structure or trailer, who violates any section hereof, shall, upon conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction, be liable to a fine of not exceeding Ten Dollars for each offense. Each day in which a violation continues, shall be a separate offense. In case of a violation of any section hereof, in addition to the foregoing penalty, the board of selectmen, in the name of the Town may institute an appropriate action or proceedings to prevent such unlawful action, to restrain, correct or abate such violation, to prevent the occupancy of the building, structure or land, or any illegal act or use in or about such premises.

Sect. 10. These by-laws shall take effect upon their adoption in town meeting.

20. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five members with duties as set forth in section 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. revised Statutes annotated, 1955, to make a study of the

Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The board shall consist of one selectman and four other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

Be it resolved that it is the intent of the Town Meeting that the Board represent the several areas of the Town — Courser Hill, Blackwater, Putney Hill, and Winnepocket — and that at least one woman be included in the appointments by the selectmen.

This article included by petition last year and voted to be tabled for action this year.

21. To see if the Town will vote to empower the Board of Selectmen to sell by sealed bid or public auction the following parcels of land

- (a) Jackman Woodlot
- (b) Burbank Land

and further to negotiate by private treaty for the sale of lot and building located behind property owned by Robert H. Roby.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN
and DISTRICT CHIEF**

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindfull that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 PM
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

This will be my last report for the school district of Webster. This coming June I will have completed nineteen years of working with the Webster Schools, so it is with some regret that I start this final report to the Webster School District.

I will miss the close association with the Webster residents and more particularly the young people now in school and those that I have watched progress through the schools; some of them now parents of children in school. Yet I have no regrets at being involved in a program (consolidation) which has caused our separation. If our original plan of combining with Bradford, Warner and Hopkinton had been successful, Webster would still be one of my towns, and we still would be working together. Perhaps I could have said to one of my Webster pupils, "Why, I remember when your grandfather was in school."

No, I have no regrets about Webster becoming a member of a Cooperative. This is a movement which has been long overdue in New Hampshire. The Merrimack Valley Cooperative won't be the last one that is formed. Many groups have been formed in the last two years, and many more are about to be formed. 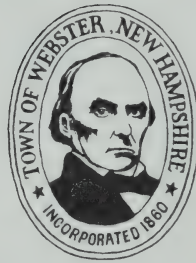
