To the inhabitants of the Town of Westmoreland in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Westmoreland on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at seven of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects: The Polls will open at 10:00 A.M. and will not close before 7:00 P.M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To bring in your votes for amendments on the Zoning and Building regulations.
3. To hear the reports of Agents and Auditors and take any action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$510.00 (50 cents per capita) for Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
5. To see what disposition the Town will vote to make of the income of the Jotham Lord Fund.
6. To see if the Town will permit the Westmoreland Athletic Association, Inc. to play basketball in the Town Hall, in accordance with rules and regulations mutually agreed upon by the Association and the Selectmen of the year 1977, until the next annual meeting.
7. To see if the Town will vote for Class IV or Class V roads construction, re-construction, or betterment aid, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$987.42, the State contributing \$6,582.77.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act for use as a setoff against the following debt service:

9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated:

Addition to Fire Station	\$1,000.00



10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$239.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association, or take any other action relating thereto.
11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget, as submitted by the Budget Committee under the authority of the Municipal Budget Act.
12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

PRESENT ZONING AND BUILDING REGULATIONS

- E. Sewage disposal systems for new dwellings or other buildings designed for human occupancy shall consist of an approved septic tank and will follow the requirements of the Health Law of the State of New Hampshire.
- H. (a) Trailer camps and mobile home subdivisions shall not be permitted in the Town until approval has been granted by the Board of Adjustment, after a public hearing.
- (b) No multiple family dwelling or conversion of a single to a multiple family dwelling, mobile home or house trailer, camping or travel trailer, shall be located in the Town without a written permit signed by the Board of Selectmen, unless excepted per Paragraph H. (c).
- (c) Travel trailers and campers will be permitted on private property for no longer than four weeks during any one year. A written permit will be required for a longer period of time
- J. (a) In zones A and B, all building lots for a single family dwelling shall contain a minimum of two (2) acres, with a minimum of three hundred (300) foot frontage. This also applies to lots for trailers and mobile homes.
- (b) In Zone C all building lots for a single family dwelling shall contain a minimum of five (5) acres, with a minimum of five hundred (500) foot frontage. This also applies to lots for trailers and mobile homes.
- (c) Churches and schools permitted in all zones.
- M. Business, industry and professions will be permitted in Zones B and C. by special exception only, in accordance with state requirements. A business permit is valid only for the business or location for which it is issued, and may not be automatically transferred to a new owner. A permit shall expire upon termination of the enterprise it is assigned to.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO ZONING AND BUILDING REGULATIONS  
TOWN OF WESTMORELAND, NEW HAMPSHIRE

- E. (a) All dwelling units used for permanent human occupancy must be supplied with running hot and cold water properly connected with the following fixtures: kitchen sink, lavatory sink, tub or shower, water closet. These fixtures must be connected with a septic tank and leach field which has been approved by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission. The required septic tank and leach field must be of sufficient size to accommodate a water closet.
- (b) A family sized commercial dry composting toilet may be allowed in lieu of a water closet. Such a system must first be approved in writing by the local Board of Health based on the determination that said system will not endanger the health of any person or cause a nuisance and that the end product will be disposed of in a sanitary manner. All other requirements in Paragraph E(a) must be met.
- H. (a) Mobile homes, mobile home subdivisions, multiple family dwellings or conversion of a single to a multiple family dwelling shall not be permitted in town until approval has been granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment, after a public hearing.
- (b) Travel trailers and campers will be permitted on private property for no longer than four weeks during any one year. A written permit will be required from the Board of Selectmen for a longer period of time.
- J. (a) In Zones A and B all building lots for a single family dwelling shall contain a minimum of two (2) acres with a minimum of three hundred (300) feet frontage on a town approved and maintained road. This also applies to lots for trailers and mobile homes.
- (b) In Zone C all building lots for a single family dwelling shall contain a minimum of five (5) acres, with a minimum of five hundred (500) feet frontage on a town approved and maintained road. This also applies to lots for trailers and mobile homes.
- (c) Churches and schools are permitted in all zones.
- M. (a) Business, industry and professions may be permitted in Zones B and C by Special Exception only, in



accordance with the following requirements:

1. The proposed use is in an appropriate location for such a use.
  2. Such approval would not reduce the value of any property within the district, nor otherwise be injurious, obnoxious or offensive to the neighborhood.
  3. There will be no nuisance or serious hazard to vehicles or pedestrians.
  4. Adequate and appropriate facilities will be provided for the proper operation of the proposed use.
- (b) A Special Exception is valid only for the business or location for which it is issued. It shall expire upon termination of the enterprise to which it is assigned.
- (c) Any addition, expansion or alteration of an existing use for which a Special Exception has been granted must receive a new Special Exception.
- (d) The cost of advertising and costs of mailing the notices of hearings shall be payable by the person making the appeal prior to the hearing.

Article 10 - To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to cover the possible cost of Emergency Ambulance Service in accordance with the contract negotiated with the City of Keene in 1977.

Moved, seconded and voted in the affirmative.

Article 11 - To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for a road sander for the Highway Department and authorize withdrawal of this amount from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act.

Moved, seconded and voted in the affirmative.

Article 12 - To see if the Town will vote to accept the Westmoreland Emergency Service Corps to be a part of the Westmoreland Fire Department.

Moved, seconded and voted in the affirmative.

Article 13 - To see if the Town will authorize the Westmoreland Emergency Service to offer transportation to residents of the Town on such terms as the Service may establish.

Moved, seconded and voted in the affirmative.

Article 14 - To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$8,000.00 to re-model the rear of the Town Hall basement for use as the Post Office in the event that a suitable contract is negotiated with Postal Authorities.

The Board of Selectmen requested the addition of the following: the sum borrowed to be repaid at the rate of \$2,000.00 per year.

The article with addition was moved, seconded and voted - 137 in the affirmative and 4 no's.

Article 15 - To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee under the authority of the Municipal Budget Act.

Moved, seconded and voted in the affirmative.

Article 16 - To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Moved, seconded and voted in the affirmative.

Article 17 - To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

#### REPORT OF THE WESTMORELAND EMERGENCY SERVICES CORPS

As of this writing, Wesco has responded to twelve requests for aid since January 1, 1978. The Corps has also held a blood pressure clinic and operated a First Aid Station on Old Home Day. Licensing requirements have been completed qualifying Wesco for non-emergency transport. This service will be available at no charge to residents on an appointment basis by calling April Ferguson at 399-4470 or Bill Howland at 399-4309.

In an effort to remain financially self-supporting the group has held a raffle, yard sales, a square dance, con-

tra dances and put on a supper for the Cheshire County Farm Bureau. The Corps is particularly grateful for the donations and support of townspeople.

All personnel within the Corps are either Red Cross Advanced First Aid trained with a minimum of 60 classroom hours or Emergency Medical Technicians trained with a minimum of 81 classroom hours. We are also most fortunate to count a Registered Nurse among our members. Thirteen drills have been held in the past year to keep our members continually familiarized with first aid procedures. All of our personnel are Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation qualified.

Five new monitors have been purchased during the past year along with several other articles of equipment.

Wesco need not be called individually, but is automatically toned by calling Southwest N.H. Mutual Aid at 352-1100. Members will automatically respond.

Agreeable to the foregoing warrant, the legal voters having met at the time and place mentioned in the warrant, the meeting was called to order by the moderator, Carlson D. Barrett at 2:00 P.M. Article 1 was then read by the moderator and after declaring the polls open for voting, the business meeting was adjourned until 7:30 P.M. The polls, as noted under Article 1, will remain open until 9:00 P.M.

At 7:30 P.M. the business meeting was called to order by the moderator. Mr. Barrett then reviewed his rules of procedure as follows:

1. When a person is speaking, the rest will be quiet and listen.
2. To be recognized - stand or raise your hand.
3. If the Chair does not know your name, please state it before speaking; be brief and to the point.
4. Speak only on the motion at hand, or you will be ruled out of order and asked to sit down.
5. A motion must be made in the positive form.
6. If the Chair is in doubt on a vote, it shall be taken in another form.
7. Possible amendments or other motions not stated in the warrant are to be presented to the moderator in writing.
8. A motion to reconsider must be made within 15 minutes after the article to be reconsidered has been carried or rejected. The motion must also be made by one who voted in favor of the article.

The warrant was then read.

Article 2: Motion was made and seconded. Moved to hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto. Discussion. Ann Louise Ray reported on the Long Range Planning Committee report. The report was reviewed in detail. Questions from the floor included a multi-purpose room and deficiencies in pre-algebra preparation. A continuing committee was recommended by the Long Range Committee citing that there are definite needs - however, classroom space is adequate for the next 5 years for the projected enrollment. A motion was then made to accept the report, same was carried by voice vote and declared in the affirmative by the moderator. A motion was then made as follows:



"I move that the School District authorize the School Board to appoint a Committee of five members consisting of: 1 member of the Planning Board; 1 member of the School Board; a selectman; two parents-at-large; and members of the administration and faculty to serve as consultants."

"The purpose of this ad hoc committee is to study the feasibility of a need for a multipurpose facility at the Westmoreland School. Further, this committee will report to the Westmoreland School District at its next regularly scheduled meeting to be held in March, 1979." The motion was seconded and carried by voice vote and declared in the affirmative by the moderator.

Article 3: Motion was made and seconded. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to make application for, and to accept and use in the name of the District such advances, Grants-In-Aid, or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire, or any department or agency thereof, or any federal, state, or private agency. The motion was carried by voice vote and declared in the affirmative by the moderator.

Article 4: Catherine Scott made the motion which was seconded by Rod Tatnall - Moved that the District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$361,338 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents and for payment of statutory obligations of the District. Discussion followed. Harry Brown requested interpretation of the extra amount under item 735 - Contracted services. Donald E. Hall of the School Board advised that this was for electrical outlets, valves, new lighting in corridors, kitchen exhaust hood, a conjection oven, counter space, exit door for room #7, repair playground equipment and more insulation for the roof, etc. Mr. Brown questioned the more insulation advising that the building was designed for heat loss so the snow on the roof would melt - the weight of the snow in more heavy snow years such as this year would have an adverse effect. It was noted that in future years of heavy accumulation, the roof would, in all probability have to be shoveled off again. Mr. Brown questioned item 1477.1 - student tuition relative to state children. Mr. Hall advised the state paid \$200.00 per pupil and the remainder is borne by the town. Paul Vincent questioned item 735 - fan and hood for \$1,000. Mr. Hall advised that this was a hood of the commercial type to cover the stove area. Catherine Scott questioned item 1267 under capital outlay - new equipment - a jump from \$10.00 to \$380.00. Mr. Hall advised that this was for language

masters and 2 record players. Robert W. Moore brought up about school lunches and the milk program which was also answered by Mr. Hall. Kenneth H. Stewart then requested the question be moved - same was seconded and the motion was carried by voice vote and declared in the affirmative by the moderator.

Article 5: Motion was made and seconded - Moved to choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant. No discussion. The motion was carried by voice vote and declared in the affirmative by the moderator.

Article 6: Motion made and seconded - Moved to transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting. Discussion. Carol H. Austin, School Board Member, read the following motion which she wished to become a part of the minutes:

"Whereas, the people of the Town of Westmoreland are most grateful for Donald E. Hall's devoted service to the children of Westmoreland and his community as school board member from March, 1969 - March, 1978.

"Whereas, he served as chairman for five years and was the delegate to the Monadnock Children's Special Services Center Board of Directors and the Supervisory Union #29 Advisory Committee, and

"Whereas he was instrumental in creating positive changes in the instructional program of the District,

Be it resolved that the District honor itself by spreading this resolution upon the permanent records of the District and a copy of this resolution be presented to Mr. Hall.

The School Board of Westmoreland"

Dated March 17, 1978

At 8:17 P.M. the business meeting was adjourned and at 9:00 P.M. the polls were declared closed.

There were 63 townspeople in attendance at the business meeting.

For moderator for the ensuing year - Carlson D. Barrett - 84 votes and was declared elected.

For clerk for the ensuing year - Earl B. Spaulding, Jr. - 83 votes and was declared elected.

For member of the school board for the ensuing three years - Robert E. Staples received 14 votes. Lenville M. Meserve, Jr. received 70 votes and was declared elected.

For treasurer for the ensuing year - Rodman R. Tatnall received 85 votes and was declared elected.

For district auditor for two (2) years - Griffith Royea received 33 votes and was declared elected. Robert M. Cox received 23 votes and was declared elected for a one (1) year term. There were 22 scatter votes.

The oath of office was then given to the elected officials by the moderator and clerk.

WESTMORELAND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL  
FEASIBILITY STUDY COMMITTEE REPORT

Space Needs Summary

- A.) Library - A library with adequate space to house ample materials is essential for all schools. Our present library contains approximately 113.75 square feet. We should plan on 1,000 square feet in order to meet state minimum standards as well as to provide our students room to use the library as a resource center for the school.
- B.) Multi-Purpose/Gymnasium/Lunch Room/Community Center - Consideration should be given to the development of an area where not only physical education could take place, but could serve as a cafeteria and school assembly center where programs in art, music and drama could be put on by the students for the community. Such a facility could also serve as a place for community-centered cultural activities as well as

a recreational facility for interscholastic sports programs. Proximity to the two new school ball fields makes the school a greater part of the community. Approximately 3,000 square feet should be adequate for this facility.

- C.) Nurse/Health Room - Although we do not have a full-time nurse, there is a need for a place for the nurse or principal to attend to the needs of students who are not feeling well. Presently, students have no place to lie down while waiting for parents. Often an hour or more is required before transportation can be arranged. Additionally, the storage of health related supplies is a problem. An area with bathroom facilities, sink and work area would meet our needs. Approximately 100-150 square feet would be sufficient for this facility.
- D.) Administrative/Support Facility - At the present time the nurse, secretary and principal share a total of 132.85 square feet of space in a small, cramped office. Privacy is non-existent; therefore, parent, student or teacher conferences are difficult to conduct. When privacy is required, either the nurse and secretary must remove themselves or other space must be found to conduct such conferences. The creation of an administrative area, easily accessible by visitors, which would provide both a reception/waiting/secretary's room and a private office for the principal would be sufficient to meet our needs. Approximately 300 square feet would be required.

It is evident from the present building configuration that inadequate space now exists relative to our library, office and physical education/multi-purpose room.

Building a facility that will serve to remedy these pressing needs as well as serve the needs and wishes of the community would seem wise.

## ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

The American taxpayers are making it clear that they expect public agencies to become more accountable for the spending of public funds. They have also made it clear that they want the "basic" emphasized in their schools.

With the above ideas in mind, Supervisory Union 29 has developed an Accountability Model. This model has been approved by the New Hampshire State Department of Education. It is our hope that we will be able to complete the testing phase of this program by May of 1980.

The five towns in Supervisory Union 29 are in the process of conducting an achievement testing program. The results of these tests will be presented to the parents and school board in the spring of 1979. Using the results of the tests, a Curriculum Committee will examine our curriculum needs in the summer of 1979. These curriculum needs will be reflected in a report to each of the town school boards in the fall of 1979. This report will include recommendations for program modifications based on the achievement test results and the recommendations of the Curriculum Committee.

Achievement tests will be given again during the 1979-80 school year to determine if progress has been made in certain curriculum areas.

It is our hope that by examining and reexamining our school programs we can provide a quality education for our students in the most economic manner possible.

Whenever the school has prospered during this past year, it has prospered due to the sustained efforts of individuals in the school where the program and the child meet. The professional staff deserves high praise for their effectiveness and willingness to adapt programs to meet the changing needs of our students.

I would like to express my appreciation to the school board, principal and staff for their understanding and cooperation during this school year.

## WESTMORELAND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

As we enter the last year of this decade, several important decisions face the School District. Our physical plant, the majority of which was completed in 1960, is beginning to show its age. Several maintenance projects should be considered in order to insure usability in the future. Exterior painting, repainting of interior as well as exterior cement blocks, energy conservation measures, and special attention to our increasing roof problems are major areas needing immediate attention. Accomplishing these tasks as soon as possible might very well extend the life of our facility. Additionally, as the cost of energy sources increases, protecting our facility from the forces of nature will save the District considerable money.

Another decision facing the District is the need for additional space. Based on current enrollment projections, we should have enough classroom space to accommodate 213 students. (Our present population is 162). However, as our school continues to offer support services and programs for students the need for additional space increases. Three persons now share the very small school office; two teachers share the former library; and speech therapy is given in the present library; thus limiting the availability of library time to students and teachers. Space for speech therapy, student/teacher/parent conferences, administrative conferences, and other program services is desperately needed. Our interscholastic sports and physical education programs (conducted by classroom teachers) suffer a great deal because of lack of adequate space. Additional space will allow us to continue our efforts to provide a well balanced educational program for the students of Westmoreland School. Space requirements will continue to increase as the population grows. Thus, planning for future building needs should begin as soon as possible.

Aside from the problems created by growth and space, we have continued to focus on the quality of education being offered to the students assigned to our school. To this end we have continued to review, change, and update curriculum as necessary to meet the ever changing needs of our students. A dedicated teaching and support staff, a knowledgeable and concerned Board of Education, and an interested and supportive community all contribute to our success.

The involvement of the community in setting educational goals, establishing financial support and participating in the successful operation of the school is a viable and attainable objective.

All members of the community are invited to share their thoughts and ideas about the educational process

with the school. Please contact the school principal or Board of Education members at any time if you have any ideas, comments, or suggestions. Remember--a community is composed of all the people - not just those with children.

We at Westmoreland Elementary School look forward to a close and harmonious relationship with our community. You have entrusted us with your most valuable assets (and hope for the future) - your children. We will try to live up to your expectations. Please let us know how we can better serve you.

## REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The following is the report for the year ending June 1978 as submitted by Margaret Freeman.

This school year proved healthier for the students as far as chicken-pox and strep throat were concerned (we had more than our share last year).

The school was hit hard with the flu bug which caused a high absentee rate for a week or so.

5 accidents occurred at school needing medical treatment by a doctor, fortunately none was serious.

177 students had vision and hearing screenings.

9 were referred for vision and 3 for hearing defects.

66 students had physical examinations by the school physician, Dr. McMurphy.

4 students had orthopedic referrals.

177 students had their heights and weights recorded.

64 students and staff had T.B. tests.

93 students, including kindergarten, participated in a dental conference which included cleaning and fluoride application by Sue Merrett.

31 of these students required follow-up, averaging only one or two cavities each.

I would like to express my thanks to all the mothers who volunteered their help with this very worthwhile program. A special thanks goes to Karen Sawicki, who has run the program for the past two years, and to the school P.T.A., who sponsored the conference.

59 students also participated in a pilot dental rinse program offered by the State Department of Dental Health. This program included daily teeth brushing and a weekly fluoride rinse.

Another project this year was trying to update immunization records on all the students. The State Department of Communicable Diseases would like to have 100% protection of all school children in New Hampshire by 1980. This is a tremendous job which really required full cooperation.

In conclusion I would like to say that I have really enjoyed my two years as school nurse in the Westmoreland Elementary School. The students will always hold a special place in my memories.
