PREVENTING FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2,200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
4. Have something to keep the fire under control - pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.

SCHOOL WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Auburn, New Hampshire, qualified to vote in district affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 8th day of March, 1963 at 8 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing year.
7. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which is to be raised by taxes by the town.
8. To see if the district will authorize the school board to negotiate and enter into a long term (if necessary) contract to provide for the secondary education of Auburn pupils and pass any vote relating thereto.
9. To see if the district will adopt a non-partisan ballot as provided for in the state laws of New Hampshire, Chapter 59:73.
10. By petition. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00, said sum to be carried as a special account to be known as the Auburn School Hot Lunch Fund the purpose of said fund to be to purchase articles to equip the kitchen and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept on behalf of the district any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.

12. To see if the district will authorize the school to accept gifts in the name of and on behalf of the district and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

The health of a child vitally affects his learning ability. Only a healthy, happy child can get the most from educational opportunities offered. The school nurse-teacher's program is set up with this goal in mind.

A pre-school registration clinic is held in May for all children entering school in September. Vision, hearing and motor coordination tests are done at this time. A dental hygienist is present to examine teeth and make necessary recommendations. The nurse has an opportunity to get a complete medical history on each child. Twenty-eight children were registered in May, 1962.

After your child enters school he will have a vision and hearing test done once each year. He will also be weighed and measured yearly to note poor growth development or unusual weight gain or loss. I wish to point out that the visual tests are adequate for school use but are simple screening tests for a few eye difficulties. If your child has not been referred by the school nurse but complains of eye difficulty, please have a complete examination done. A health record is sent home for each parent to fill out. These should be filled out carefully as they are used for emergency information. It is important for the school to have someone to contact in case of illness or accident. In cases of epidemic virus or communicable disease it is impossible for the school to assume transportation responsibilities.

A tuberculin patch testing program has been inaugurated whereby any child, whose parent so desired, was patched last year. In subsequent years grade one, three, five and eight will be able to receive the patch test yearly. An X-ray unit is set up at Grinnell School in Derry so that those children with a positive reaction can be X-rayed.

A dental education program is carried on in the school with the aid of the state dental hygienist. She visits the classrooms three times a year to assist the teacher in securing materials and planning her teaching program.

Many services are available to children who have need, either through a state agency or private organization. Parents may apply through the school nurse-teacher for such services. Children with speech defects may attend the speech clinic at the Manchester Rehabilitation Center if their schedule permits. Clinics are available for all types of handicapped children including pediatric, orthopedic, cancer, heart and also child guidance. These are but a few.

There are many more facets of the school health program but the preceding may give some idea of the role of the school nurse-teacher.

REPORT OF THE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT

In the short space of fifty years the automobile has replaced the horse and buggy; airplanes fly from coast to coast in less than four hours; radio and television keep us in close touch with the world by the twist of a button; push-button devices of every kind have brought about fundamental changes in our mode of living.

Our schools have also changed. Just as medicine and surgery and technology, business management and selling have moved ahead in the knowledge of what to do to achieve desired results, so has education. Modern schools are doing for today's children and tomorrow's citizens what schools fifty years ago never thought of doing, nor were equipped to do. Schools are changing because times and insights are changing. In the past fifty years more has been discovered about how learning takes place than in all the centuries before. Among these discoveries is the fact that individuals differ in all sorts of ways; therefore, teaching methods vary from individual to individual as a result of this knowledge. No longer do teachers attempt to press all children into a single mold.

It seems natural to assume that, because people accept mechanical innovations, they also accept change in schools. Unfortunately this is only partially true. Even though modifications in the schools have occurred as a result of scientific discoveries in how learning takes place, many people still want the schools to remain the same as when they went to school. There seems to be some confusion as to what schools should be doing for children. The common schools of the United States were founded on the assumption that, if the people were literate, they would have access to the truth; if they had the truth, they would automatically be independent and democratic. We know now that recognition of the truth takes more than mere ability to read, write and compute. For example, today's citizens need many different kind of skills. The skills required for democratic action must be taught anew to each succeeding generation because democracy represents a continually developing concept. Schools of modern design, while they in no sense underestimate the essential nature of the basic skills, do recognize that many additional skills in all areas of living - social, physical, emotional, and mental - must be taught children in an environment of reality which is conducive to their effective assumption of the citizenship role in society.

We as adults, must think of the schools in terms of the present day world. We must be aware of the basic changes and challenges which confront individuals and

groups today.

I believe that a good school:

1. shows concern with all-around development - social, mental, emotional, and physical
2. recognizes each child as an individual with unique potentialities and limitations
3. strives constantly to help each child develop his powers and overcome his limitations
4. establishes the climate which assures to the utmost extent that each child
 - a. feels he belongs, has opportunity to contribute as well as receive
 - b. develops a feeling of security
 - c. is loved and respected for what he is as an individual as well as for what he may become
 - d. is encouraged to ask questions
 - e. is helped to understand and develop values
 - f. is helped to develop skills and appreciations
5. should aid children in ways of working satisfactorily as members of groups
6. should aid children to acquire attitudes, understandings, knowledges, and skills needed to work according to the democratic processes which are the foundation of American culture.

The schools may only accomplish to the degree that the public gives it support both by attitude and in the form of appropriated money. School budgets will increase each year as more and more youngsters enter school. We will need more rooms, more teachers, books and supplies.

I believe the most important school budget item is the teachers salary. Without the guidance of a top notch, dedicated teacher the fine classroom containing the best furniture, books and supplies is wasted. Taxpayers all and parents in particular must decide what type of education they want for their children and what they can afford. Communities bordering our towns have indicated that they will advance starting salaries to \$4500.00 thus matching the Massachusetts state minimum. What effect will this have on the towns in Union #10? We no doubt will have a very difficult time filling all vacancies with qualified teachers. Some of our schools began the school year with substitutes. We need replacements in the same schools right now and have been unable to find qualified people. Our problem is not only that of attracting new qualified teachers but also of holding the good teachers that we have.

PERSONNEL

Increasingly the problem of staffing schools with professionally prepared personnel is the major problem of education. In the last three years there have been 11 changes in seven positions. To develop a program that fully prepares the graduate to compete successfully with other young people with such a turn over is exceedingly difficult. Fringe benefits, salaries, and working conditions, as a means of developing a more permanent staff, should be scrutinized carefully and adjusted so as to make teaching in Auburn more attractive.

The two positions vacated last year were filled with qualified teachers of experience. Under the leadership of Mr. Currier the staff provided an opportunity for each child to advance in accord with his ability. This is desirable and adjusts our program to individual needs. With this objective the need for guidance is imperative. The selection of courses and program of studies at secondary level is important. With staff and program designed to meet needs the problem of proper selection of a secondary program is met more adequately.

The program of music and handwriting continues. As indicated in last years report this is not only desirable but almost imperative. Worthy use of leisure time is a worthy objective. It is even more so than it was first promulgated. Some 40 years ago the work week was longer. It seemed desirable at that time to establish this objective, worthy use of leisure, as a cardinal principle of education. Today it is increasingly important. Music therefore, should play an important role in the educational program. Handwriting is a social and economic asset to young people. It is a positive asset to be able to write neatly and legibly. The continuance of the current program will continue to pay dividends to the young people of Auburn.

The only constant in our current civilization is change. This applies to the educational scene as well as the social and economic world. Improved techniques lead

to improved performance. Programmed instruction, teaching machines, team teaching and team learning are attempts to make the educative process more productive. In our smaller communities expense prohibits the use of the first two, team teaching is geared to a situation where there are multiple grades. Our best solution to meet the challenge of improved teaching techniques seems to be in the area of team learning. The success of this program in several Massachusetts towns under the leadership of Boston University seems to indicate a means of meeting the challenge.

A review of 21 years of stewardship could be extensive. Increased staff, increased enrollment, personnel changes, curriculum revision, and evolutionary changes in curriculum over a 21 year period could involve a great deal. The change in physical plant including equipment is indicative of the change. There were two buildings in Auburn each housing 8 grades in two rooms. Grades 1-4 and 5-8 were under the direction of a teacher. This meant a staff of four with short periods of instruction for each of the grades. The first addition to the Village School - a forerunner of a second addition - enabled the school to provide instruction in two grades to a room. Wisely provision was made to expand the heating plant for a future addition. The second addition of four rooms enabled the district to provide a single grade to a teacher. These additions to the physical plant voted by the district have allowed the educational program to keep pace with the times. The educational program could not advance without a staff dedicated to children. It has been the district's good fortune, with a few exceptions, to have had teachers who have been devoted to the advancement of children. With physical facilities available, in accord with the district's financial ability, these teachers have provided a sound educational background for Auburn children.

It has been my privilege to serve the school community over these years with fine cooperation from the citizenry, parents and students. School boards have, almost without exception, been devoted to advancing the educational progress of children. In such an atmosphere progress can and has been made.

I should be remiss if I failed to express my appreciation to all who have assisted in my efforts to provide a better educational opportunity and program to the pupils of Auburn.
