THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Canaan, N. H. in County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, Canaan Street in said Canaan, on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of tax revenues.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by quitclaim deed all property acquired by tax deed, or take any action thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow the playing of "Beano" or "Bingo" in the Town of Canaan as prescribed by the laws of the State of New Hampshire, or take any action thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to employ the services of the State of New Hampshire assessors to obtain more equalized assessments and raise money to pay for the same, or take any action thereto.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to designate the highway leading from the small park on High Street near the residence of E. F. Lorden and running in an easterly direction to its junction with Route 118 as the "Billy Reagan Road", or take any action thereto.
- 8. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to discontinue all highways that have been previously discontinued but made subject to gates and bars prior to 1960.
- 9. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to have a "Curfew" for all children under the age of sixteen off the streets of Canaan at 9:30 P.M. unless with written permission or accompanied by their parents.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the zoning ordinance proposed by the Canaan Planning Board. A true copy of which is in your town report supplement. Or take any action thereto.
- 11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or any other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Note: Polls to open at 10 A.M. and close at 6 P.M. Articles in warrant to be taken up at 1:30 P.M.

Superintendent's Report

At the time of writing of this report it would appear that a sizeable deficiency appropriation will be required to allow the School District to pay its just debts at the end of the school year. This has been caused in large part by the necessity of hiring another teacher for the High School. The new position was required to release your principal from all teaching duties and to relieve the excessive load on the other teachers. At the high school level six different class preparations daily make for poor teaching, and our State Department of Education will not approve schools which operate under such a schedule.

The loss of a good part of School Foundation Aid from the State has increased the burden on local tax payers. This was brought about largely by an increase in Canaan's equalized valuation, and an increase in the number of pupils in the state for whom a definite amount of funds had to be divided. A larger appropriation of funds at the State level would lead to an increased amount of aid to Districts which are in an unfavorable financial situation

A squeeze is on to find room in the school for all of the youngsters who must attend. It is expected that additional teaching stations will be required for the 1962-63 school year. By the time this has been printed we will have a good idea as to how the problem will be solved for years to come. We certainly hope that the hard work of many people on the cooperative school study will not be in vain, but the decision is one for the voters to make. Whatever it is, the problem for next year will still remain with us. There probably will be more pupils in high school. Because of the size of

this year's first grade it was necessary to have two sections, using Mrs. Dow as one teacher, and eliminating the remedial teaching which she has been doing. We anticipate the splitting of the first grade again next year. With all of the available rooms being used now, where will the extra class meet?

Canaan is fortunate to have good teachers who are interested in the pupils in their charge. The youngsters, like so many others, must realize their need for a good education. When they do, we can look forward with more hope for their future.

To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of the schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of six thousand (\$6,000.00) dollars, the same to be made available during the current fiscal year.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Polls for balloting to open at 2:00 P.M. in the afternoon, to close not earlier than 9:00 P.M. Articles in the warrant other than balloting for officers will be considered at 7:30 P.M.
