

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the Eleventh day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for repairs of highways and bridges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to repair the road from Lord's Corner to High Haith bridge and if so, how much.
5. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to hire money for town purposes, in anticipation of taxes.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to defray expenses of Memorial Day, and if so, how much.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to erect an honor roll for the Veterans of World War II, and if so, how much.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to defray the expenses of electric street lights in Center Harbor Village, and if so, how much.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital, and if so, how much.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$2,000.00 for welfare work.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$800.00 for the maintenance of the Fire Department.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$92.00 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town, to Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
13. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid road assistance, the Town to raise the sum of \$1,381.50 and the State to contribute \$4,143.50.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Band Concerts in Center Harbor, and if so, how much.
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for oil to be applied to the roads, and if so, how much.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to purchase new equipment for road work.
17. To see if the Town will choose an agent or agents to care for the fountain at Center Harbor Village.

18. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the Town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.
19. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of the audit.
20. To see if the Town will choose a committee to take charge of the wharf, and to make regulations for same.
21. To see if the Town will choose an agent or agents to care for the cemeteries throughout the Town.
22. To choose agents and committees in relation to any article in the Warrant and hear reports of any heretofore chosen.
23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

PREVENT FOREST FIRES — IT PAYS !

Prevention is one of the most important phases of all fire effort. This is particularly true of forest fire control work. Preventing forest fires preserves valuable forest growth and other property, conserves man power and permits their use in productive channels, saves taxpayers' money and conserves fire fighting equipment.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The importance and value of the work of the forest fire warden and his deputies is, perhaps, best appreciated during hazardous periods when fire danger is greatest. The public, however, looks to him at all times for speedy and economical suppression of going fires.

To properly fulfill his mission, the warden needs the generous and understanding cooperation of the public at large. He attempts to secure this cooperation by the posting of caution notices, news items and by word of mouth, always carefully explaining the necessity of restrictions imposed. In the matter of giving cooperation, however, the public often fails. The record shows that an average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned

over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year. Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 per cent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable.

The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, cigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not covered with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment as it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this —

1. Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.

2. Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.

3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.

4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.

5. **HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES** — his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him!

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Teachers:

Mrs. Josephine Newman, teacher last year of the upper grade room, declined to be a candidate for reelection and Mrs. Elva Bickford of South Tamworth has been employed in her place. We are very fortunate in a time of real scarcity of qualified teachers, to be able to maintain our schools without frequent changes and under capable and experienced instructors.

Our music supervisor, Donald Musgrove, was unable to return to school in September, but has recovered sufficiently from his accident to resume his duties, beginning work December first.

Budget Increases

Due primarily to the need of increasing teachers' salaries, but partly also because of higher costs of school supplies and equipment, all towns are facing the prospect of increased cost of schools this coming year. Center Harbor's budget calls for an increase of about 11 per cent over last year, which seems small in comparison with nearby towns where school boards are asking for increases ranging from 26% to 54% over the 1946 estimate.

In December the school board voted a bonus of \$200 to each teacher, as many other towns have found it necessary to do because of the increased cost of living. Trends seem to be upward, and in all probability teachers' salaries will be still higher for several years to come.

Changes in State Administration

The new commissioner of education, Edgar Fuller, is making changes in the organization and policy of

the State Department which are of significance to all. Of these changes, two are briefly mentioned here.

In his policy of expanding the services offered by State Department personnel, Mr. Fuller has brought to us Gertrude Lewis, who is an expert in methods of teaching reading and other elementary subjects. Miss Lewis conducted in October an institute for rural teachers at Meredith Center. Then while working in this area in December, she visited the Center Harbor school, and also conducted a meeting of teachers in this union to help with their difficulties and to offer suggestions for improving their work.

The policy of the State Department also proposes that a greater share of school costs be borne by the State; and in order to put this into effect, a law is under consideration (House Bill No. 12) which should help to prevent excessive increases of local tax rates in future years. If this bill becomes a law, funds from the State treasury will be available to all districts, the amount varying with size of schools and with local needs.

School Marks and Promotions

Report cards are looked upon by most parents as a true indication of the success or failure of their children in school; but this is not always the case. When John and Mary got A and B on their cards last year, and the new teacher this year marks them C and D, the parents naturally suppose the children are not learning as well and often blame the teacher. The difference may be that the new teacher demands more, setting higher standards for her class, and really teaching just as thoroughly as the former teacher has done. Teachers are not encouraged to give high marks except for really superior work.

Promotion to the next grade should depend upon various factors: not only marks in class, but mental maturity, ability to understand the next year's work,

reading skill, etc. In deciding what grade a pupil should enter next September, the question we try to answer is, "Where will this child learn most, and progress best, next year?" If the work of the next grade will seem like a mountain to him, so that he will give up trying, perhaps he needs review. Each case has to be decided on the basis of the best good of the pupil concerned. We hope for understanding and cooperation between parents and teachers in helping to do at all times what is best for the children in our schools.

The Red Cross furnished a new First Aid Kit for each room which was an improvement on the previous arrangement.
