

TOWN MEETING - MARCH 8, 1966

Article 4. Voted to authorize Selectmen to hire monies for use in town in anticipation of Taxes.

Article 5. Voted to authorize Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.

Article 6. Voted to buy new fire truck Class A Pumper and to finance according to Article 6. Also to put one fire truck on duty in North Danville, in that way Fire Insurance Rates would be lowered.

Article 7. Passed over.

Article 8. Voted to pay Tax Collector percentage of 1% not a salary of \$800.00 per year.

Article 9. Was on ballot.

Article 10. Voted to accept Kimball Terrace subject to receiving Deed free and clear from Owners.

Article 11. Voted to close meeting at 9:20 P. M.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Danville Town Hall in said Danville on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at 1:30 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much of the Parsonage Fund the Townwill vote to spend for preaching for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.
- 6. To choose a person to fill the vacancy in the Building Superintending Committee of the Town Library as per request of Lester Colby Fund for such Library.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintainall fire fighting equipment now owned by the Danville Firemen's Association, as itemized and filed with the Town Clerk.
- 8. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

This work was authorized by the Selectmen and welcomed by the Librarian and Trustees so that each would have separate quarters. The additional shelving provides for better display of books. We are working towards State Library certification in the following ways: increased hours to 3-1/2 per week, the Librarian took three Public Library Techniques courses, including two at UNH in July under a McKay scholarship and has completed one-half of her requirements; the collection is being catalogued and classified under the Dewey Decimal System; a Book Selection Policy was written.
