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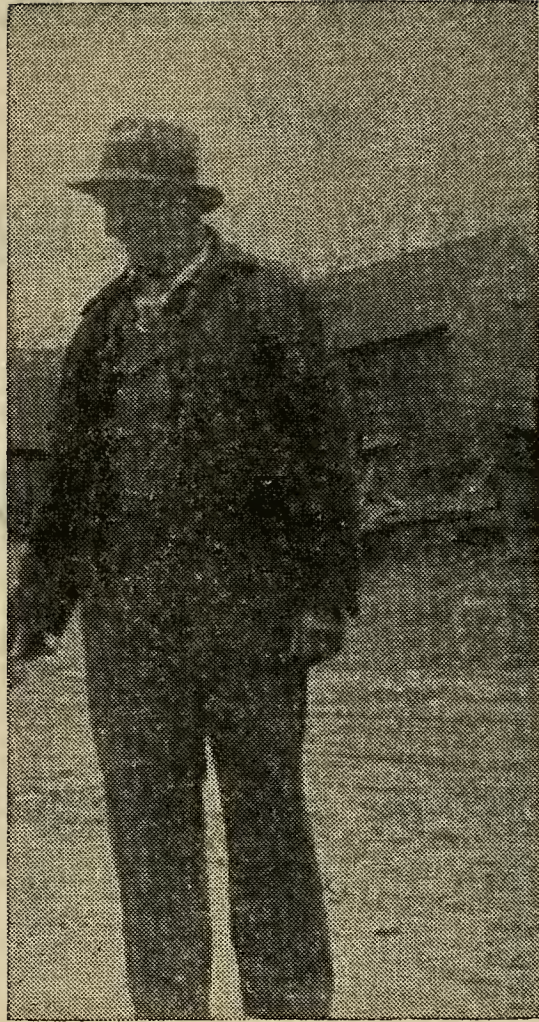

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Epsom in said County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epsom on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next, at two of the clock until six of the clock in the afternoon, and at seven of the clock until 8:30 in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see what action the Town will take upon the Budget submitted by the Budget Committee.
3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$731.41 for the maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, the State to contribute \$4,876.06 as provided in Chapter 83, Laws of 1953.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of taking the Annual Inventory.
6. Pursuant to the Provisions of the Laws as revised, Chapter 292, Section 7, 1949. The following Article is submitted: Shall the Provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town?
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the Concord Hospital to help offset the estimated operating deficit for the year 1962.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the salary of the Treasurer from \$150.00 to \$200.00. (Recommended in the Budget)

9. To see if the Town will vote to spend no more than \$100.00 in 1962 to improve the road at the Northwood Lake Development located in Epsom, funds for the project to be taken from highway appropriations.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 to be used in the White Pine Blister Rust Control Program. (Recommended in the Budget)

11. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955. (By Request)

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be put in a Capital Reserve Fund in anticipation of the purchase of Fire Equipment.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following Trust Funds: \$200.00 from the estate of Lulu E. Brown to be known as the Lulu E. and Frank E. Brown Fund, the interest only to be used for general care of cemeteries, especially for Memorial Day.

\$100.00 given by Arthur E. Roby, the interest only to be used for the perpetual care of the John J. Hill lot in McClary Cemetery.

14. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before this meeting.

AN APPEAL FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook — yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness — our carelessness. This, we — you — and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations — hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you —

1. Follow the warden's directions.
2. Secure the required burning permit.
3. Keep your fires under control.
4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. Towle replaced Mrs. Ethel Murch in grade 3 and, Miss Jacqueline Kezar replaced Miss Aphrodite Papazoglou in grade 4. Fortunately, these were all excellent replacements. However, it must be pointed out that such a high turnover of teacher personnel is not financially nor educationally a sound practice.

With the cooperation of Mrs. Fife, it has been possible to continue remedial reading this year. Blocks in reading can be overcome with this special help, thereby helping your children to continue at a normal rate of progress.

Through the able guidance of Principal Snodgrass, the following special activities; that is, the school newspaper, the typing class, Educational T.V. in the areas of French, Science, Music and Social Studies have been continued.

Transporting your children is still a problem with which to be concerned. This is due, largely, to the geography of the community. It is hoped that a solution to alleviate the extreme length of the school day can be worked out.

The population growth of school age children in the town of Epsom has created a dire need for additional classroom space. We are now using the multi-purpose room for classroom use and for the feeding of your children. Projection figures indicate that this will continue to be a problem. It would be advisable at this time to start planning now for additional classroom space.

It has been a pleasure to work with the citizens, school board, teachers, pupils and all school personnel during the past year. I am most appreciative of their constant cooperation.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

To Mr. Martineau, Superintendent of Schools, the School Board, and the citizens of Epsom:

It gives me pleasure to present the following report of the health program at the Epsom School during the past year.

We have been fortunate in having had no serious illnesses in the school. It is very gratifying to again say that the parents have been most cooperative in having treatment for cases of defective vision, dental care done, and cases of enlarged tonsils checked by their family physicians.

As occasionally a misunderstanding may exist, especially with parents who have moved from other parts of the country, I should like to point out that according to the regulations of the State Board of Education a school nurse is only permitted to give first aid care. We are not allowed to give internal medication to any pupil unless it is by order of the family physician.

In May there was a successful Pre-school clinic with twenty-four children attending. Thanks to the well-child clinics conducted by the Public Health Dept. in previous years, nearly every child had been vaccinated and was up to date on polio shots.

The following is a brief summary of the health program:

Vision Tests: 186

Hearing Tests: 134

Heights & Weights: 179

Teeth & Tonsils: 179

Home visits: 10 (this does not include taking home a child with a minor upset).

Of eight cases of serious vision defect, all have been treated by a doctor. One child will be treated under

Sight Conservation during the next month. A child with some hearing difficulty is under treatment by a doctor. Of the few having serious cavities, all have had or will have dental care in the near future.

May I extend to Mr. Martineau, the School Board, all the teachers, and the parents my thanks for their cooperation.
