

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said State,, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining Highways and Bridges, including the amount of onefourth of one per cent.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments. 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deed.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$677.00 to continue street lighting.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for care of the Common at Grafton Center.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$929.66 and thereby receive \$6,-197.72 from the State for Town Road Aid.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Department for the current year.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and ap propriate \$50,00 for the observance of Old Home Day.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 400.00 for the purchase of culverts.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the purpose of oiling roads.

15. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing Highway equipment and make appropriation for the same. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as an emergency highway appropriation, said appropriation to be controlled by the Selectmen.

17. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town.

18. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.



Forest Fire Prevention

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Carelessness and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires—all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort— The rules are simple.

is Everybody's Business

- 1. Don't burn at home use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
- 2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
- 3. Be sure that all lighted material cigars, cigarettes and matches — are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
- Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
- 5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.
- REMEMBER the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.
- REMEMBER Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business and our Most Important Undertaking.



SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

At this writing it looks as though Grafton would need a deficiency of \$1500 due to several factors: 1) the moving of the Shaw family into the Wild Meadow section; 2) the moving of the Seamans family into the Springfield area; 3) the necessity of replacing the plastic pipe in the well. Each of the first two involved major increases in tuition and transportation figures. Even though we have some new high school pupils on the whole we have gained about \$1200 in high school tuition because a significantly large number are not attending school this year. Practically speaking it is impossible at this time of year to make a budget with any guarantees as to its adequacy 18 months from now. We "figure" the best we can. Last year we had a good balance but this year is another story!

Since this time a year ago the cooperative study from Salisbury to Enfield has died and a new one centering around New London and Andover is being made. It is safe to say that there will be others and it remains a good idea for Grafton to be represented in all of these studies. Some day one of these will prove itself and be put into effect. Grafton might well gain much by being a member.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Grafton qualified to vote in district affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said district on the 11th day of March 1958, at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town

9. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500, the same to be made immediately available.

10. To see if the school district will adopt as its school check-list the Town check-list, as provided in RSA 197:12a, as inserted by Laws of 1957, Chapter 57; this provision to be effective for the 1959 and subsequent annual district meetings.

11. To see if the district will authorize the school board to participate in various cooperative school studies in which Grafton might be involved, and to report to the school district when advisable.

12. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.
