Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to make any additions to the electric lighting system and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class II road known as the Forest Road and raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$1,186.50, or will accept State Aid for the construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$723.65 or take any action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to co-operate with the W. P. A. for roads or fire hazard work or take any action relating thereto.
6. To see what action the Town will take for purchasing a tractor for summer work, raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.
7. To see if the Town will vote to repair cemetery fence and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

8. To hear the report of the special cemetery committee, to raise and appropriate necessary money or take any action relating thereto.

9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the fire department or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see what action the Town will take for extending or making replacements to the water system, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see what action the Town will take to provide supervision of the bathing beach during the summer months and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the use of the Town History Committee or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money for Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability insurance or take any action relating thereto.

14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Week or take any action relating thereto.

15. To see what action the town will take in regard to repairing the Town Scales and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 to the Monadnock Region Association or take any action relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts or legacies left in trust for use of the Town or take any action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes except poll taxes paid on or before July 15, 1939, or take any action relating thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any action relating thereto.

20. To hear the reports of agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.

21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

The electric line has been extended during the past year to serve the residences of Ruby Allen, Arnold Diamond and Hiram B. Marshall. Other new customers include John Haas, Joseph Patnaude, Constance Todd, Carroll Dow and William L. Johnson. A third wire was added to the services of Alfred Fairfield and Mrs. Cynthia Hurst.

The income for the year amounted to \$5,343.87, a part of this amount being adjustment of 1937 revenue. The final accounting for 1938 has not been received.

The hurricane of Sept. 21st caused serious damage to the lines, the cost of repairs to date being shown in our report. All the damage has not been repaired and we are asking for a larger appropriation for the electric light department as we anticipate a larger expense for repairs this coming year.

We have had a conference with officials of the Public Service Co. of New Hampshire and expect to have some proposition to present to the town at the annual meeting with reference to running a fourth wire from West Peterborough to the village to correct the low voltage condition.

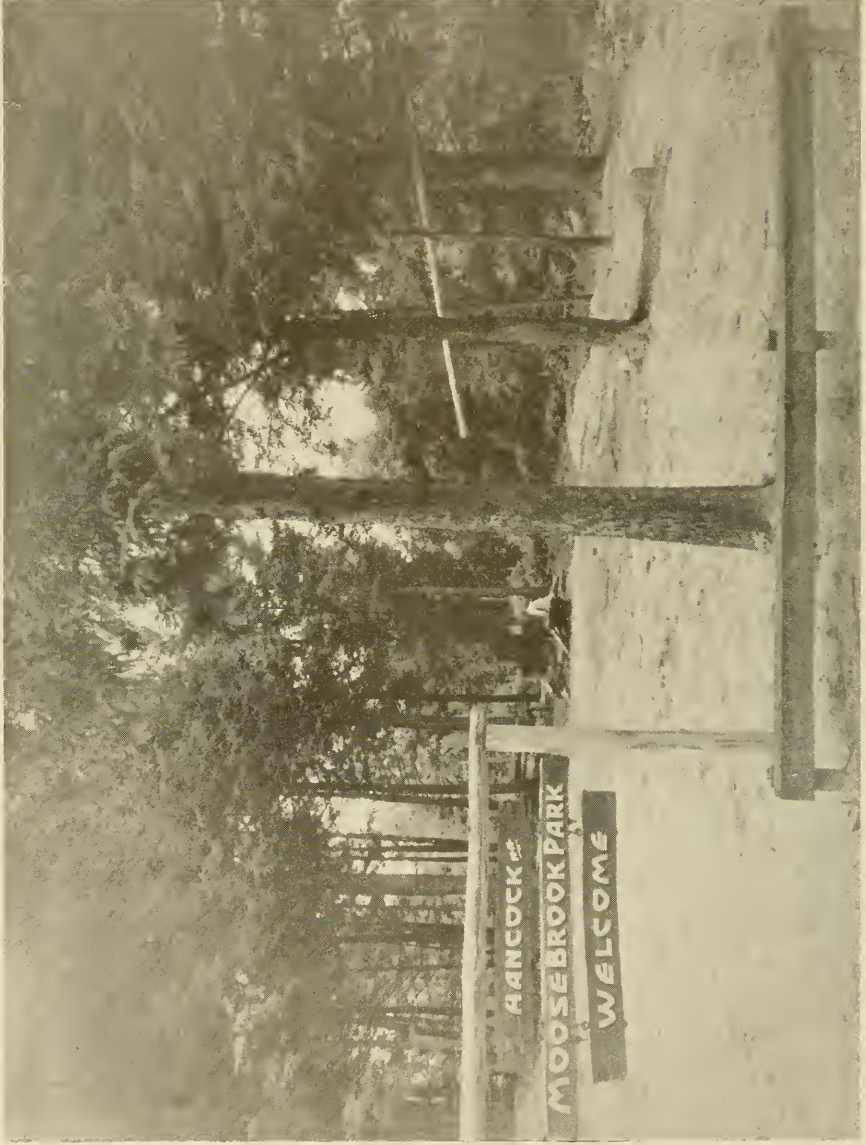

Due to the large number of pupils who were detained from school on account of being quarantined the work of the primary school was considerably upset, and much extra drill has been required during the present year to bring the grades up to the required standard.

The increased enrollment during the past two years has necessitated the purchase of a large number of new text books in order to adequately supply the needs of the pupils.

I wish to express my thanks and appreciation to the school board, teachers, pupils and all who have co-operated in carrying on the work of the Hancock schools.
