**TOWN WARRANT**  
**THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

---

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hebron Community Hall on Tuesday, the fourteenth of March next at five of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all Town Officers for the year ensuing.

    Polls open from five p. m. to nine p. m.

    Business meeting will open at seven p. m.

2. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the ensuing year for expenditures enumerated in the proposed budget appearing in the Town Report. Copy of the budget is attached to the posted Warrant.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to give two per cent cash discount on property taxes if paid thirty days from date of tax bill.

5. To see what sum the Town will appropriate and raise for the purchase of a safe for the Town Clerk.

    Proposed: Model 1521-C manufactured by The Hall's Safe Company, Inc., of Hamilton, Ohio.

    Cost \$229, FOB Hamilton, Ohio

    This safe carries Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc., one hour fire resistive label. Weight 350 lbs.

6. To see what sum the Town will appropriate and raise for the purchase of a safe for the Town Treasurer.

    Proposed: Model 1115-C manufactured by the same company. Cost \$157. Carries the same Underwriters' label. Weight 210 lbs.



7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the private roads as have been laid out and are now used by the public on the Beachwood Development in said Town, which begin on the main highway leading from Hebron to Bristol and which terminate at a point approximately 141 feet Northwesterly from the shore of Newfound Lake, provided that George R. Dane and Kenneth E. Shaw, sole owners of said roads, give to the Town a confirmatory deed of said roads.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the private roads as have been laid out and are now used by the public on the Indian Point Development in said Town, which begin on the main highway leading from Hebron to Bristol and which terminate at a point approximately 70 feet from the shore of Newfound Lake, provided George R. Dane, Glendon C. Chapman, Kenneth E. Shaw and Edith B. Lenssen, sole owners of said roads, give to the Town a confirmatory deed of said roads.

9. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Tax Collector on a percentage basis rather than a flat salary. It is suggested that he be paid a sum equal to one percent (1%) of the amount of the warrants for Property, Poll, National Bank and Yield Taxes committed to him by the Selectmen.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Other articles may be added before the Warrant is posted.

Dear Sirs:

The following is a report of the activities conducted by the N. H. Department of Health, Bureau of Public Health Nursing, for the town of Hebron for the year January 1960 to January 1961. Please have this report included in your town report.

Home visits have been made in the town on mothers, babies and preschool children and assistance given as necessary.

There was a Salk Vaccine Clinic held in Bristol in January 1960 and several from the town of Hebron attended, both children and adults. The "Booster" shots were given at this clinic.

The Tuberculosis program for Grafton County is now under the N. H. Department of Health in cooperation with the N. H. Tuberculosis Association. Chest clinics for examinations and x-rays will be held at Plymouth three times a year and residents of Hebron are welcome to attend. A report of findings will be sent to the patient following the clinic.

### PREVENTION IS YOUR BUSINESS

Carelessness, HUMAN CARELESSNESS, causes nine out of 10 forest fires. Each year 200,000 fires burn over 30 million acres in the United States. This represents five per cent of our nation's woodlands being wasted each year. Every fire takes its toll. Floods follow; stream flow is affected; timber, buildings, grazing and wildlife are destroyed — all because MANY are CARELESS with fire in and near woodland. This can be remedied. YOU can put an end to this shameful waste! PREVENTION is YOUR business!

YOU, whether YOU be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First — by setting a good example YOURSELF — being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second — by using YOUR individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

The following simple rules may be used as a guide both for you and for them.

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden — the law requires it.

2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning — don't leave it.

3. Make certain your fire, camp or debris, is DEAD OUT before leaving it.



4. Don't throw down lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes or from moving vehicles — make sure they are out — use your ash tray.

5. Don't burn at home — use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.
