### TOWN MEETING WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Landaff, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Landaff on Tuesday, the twelveth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate toward the support of the Lisbon District Nursing Association.
- 4. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for control of White Pine Blister Rust in Landaff.
- 5. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate to paint the Town Building, and purchase a stove for the kitchen.
- 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to accepting State aid for highways, by Special Legislation, and raise and appropriate the town's share.
- 7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Landaff:

At the close of school last year none of your teachers wished to have their contracts renewed. Miss Elsie Greenwood of Meredith, was elected to the position at the Center School, Miss Velma Robinson of Lincoln to the Ireland School, and Miss Alice Robertson of Manchester to the Blue School. All of these girls were graduates of the Plymouth Normal School. Miss Robertson resigned in December and is now teaching in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire. Miss Adelaide Ryan of Manchester, a graduate of the three year course at Keene, now has charge of the Blue School. I am pleased to say that all of these teachers are doing good work in their positions. The schoolrooms are orderly and attractive. The pupils are interested and industrious. The atmosphere is especially wholesome in all of the schools.

The report of school statistics for the year ending June 30, 1929, shows that 61 pupils were enrolled in your schools. The average attendance was 52.5 and the per cent of attendance was 92.6. This per cent attendance is still slightly below the average for the state. With good schools and no severe epidemic, parents should co-operate with teachers and school officials to have the highest possible attendance this year. You have this year 57 pupils enrolled in your schools. In addition you have three pupils enrolled in the Nutter school at Bath, one in the elementary school at Lisbon and nine in the Lisbon High School.

The school board has made quite extensive repairs during

the present year. A new chimney has been built at the Blue School. All three of the schoolrooms have been papered and painted. One new door and two new windows have been placed in the Ireland school.

During the next year further improvements should be made to place your school buildings safely on the State's approved list. The Ireland building needs to have its foundation or under-pinning improved. New steps are needed there, too. Chemical toilets should be installed in all of the buildings. Chemical toilets are now in successful use in so many schools in New Hampshire that they are no longer considered an experiment. I would strongly urge the installation in at least one school during the next year. In any case the toilets now in use should be improved to be more sanitary than at present. The exterior of the buildings should be painted. If the Scotland school building is to be maintained as a good investment the roof should be shingled.

The school board's request for \$300.00 for repairs will not be sufficient to make all of these improvements indicated as desirable. This amount raised each year for several years will in the course of three or four years accomplish the desired results, however.

The last school year closed with a balance of \$1,410.27 in the treasury, or due the treasurer. If the budget recommended by the school board is not exceeded, an appropriation of \$4,000 will be enough for the next year. This is \$500 less than the appropriation of last year. With this appropriation the treasurer's balance in June 1930 will be considerably less than that of last June or in June 1929. The school board, believes, how-

ever, that a reduction of the balance from the amounts of the last few years is sound business. The desire to reduce taxation seems to warrant this opinion. The co-operation of school board, parents and teachers has made this year a pleasant one for me.
