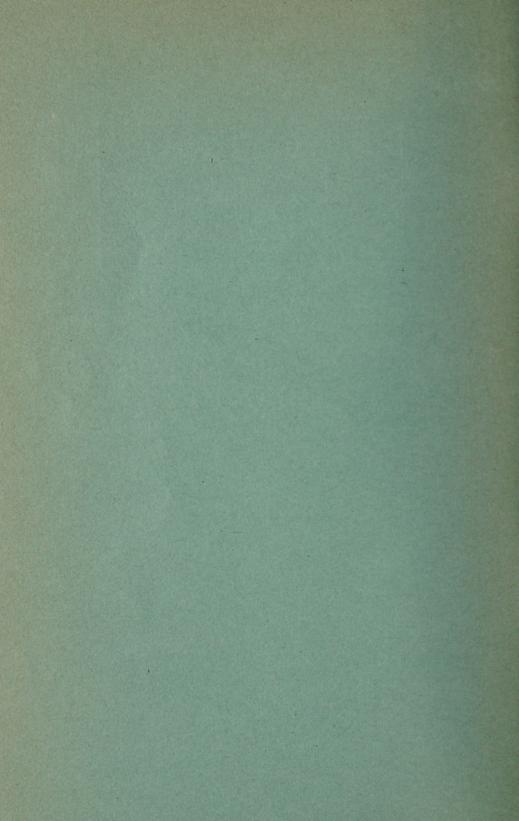

- 3. To see what action the town will take in regard to discounts on taxes.
- 4. To see what sums of money the town will authorize the selectmen to hire in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$58.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire for the insurance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$936.00 for State Aid Construction providing the State will contribute \$1872.00 to be laid out on the Plains Road so called.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$521.47 for T. R. A. so called providing the State will contribute \$2085.91 to be laid out on Class 5 roads.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to petition the state tax commission to have an audit made by the municipal accounting division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense on such audit.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I herewith submit my nineteenth annual report as superintendent of schools, it being the twenty-seventh in the series of such reports.

"It costs from \$2000 to \$2500 to educate a farm child up to the age of fifteen. The migration of farm youth to the city is, therefore, a costly contribution by rural families to city life. The United States Department of Agriculture estimates that the migration from farm to city from 1920 to 1929 represented a contribution of fourteen billion dollars."

If this migration is still going on, wouldn't it be well to find jobs for our boys and girls and keep them at home? The Placement Committee arranged last summer to help high school graduates and this plan should have the support of every citizen of Madison. A rotating fund should be established which could be used to help worthy graduates seeking advancement. The N.Y.A. and short courses at the University of New Hampshire offer opportunities for those who want immediate help for practical projects.

The unemployment situation in the country is tragic. Allegedly there are 10,000,000 unemployed, 4,000,000 being young persons between sixteen and twenty-four years of age. Disappointed youth has the greatest right to complain. Free government is on trial today in the opportunity and faith in the future that it offers youth. Unemployed youth is the soil on which dictatorships grow to power.

It would be very much to the point to introduce Agriculture and Farm Mechanics in Madison High School, training boys to find employment in Madison.

Repairs and Improvements

Good work was done last summer in putting school property in repair. One side of the high school building and one side of the Silver Lake schoolhouse were shingled. Nickerson schoolhouse was painted outside and the foundation repaired. New seats and desks were provided to complete reseating at Silver Lake.

Beautification of school grounds has been sadly neglected. In a beautiful town like Madison, with many summer visitors, the school grounds should be centers of artistic beauty. It should be remembered also that beauty has a marked effect on the conduct and character of growing children.

Last June we graduated a class of five from the high school: Herbert Arnold, Jennie Twombly, Frederick Whiting, Chester Yeaton, and Janet Chick.

A new headmaster came to the school in September—Mr. James D. Osgood. Mr. Osgood has had both college training and military training, in the latter of which he holds the rank of Captain.

That our high school has been doing effective work seems proved by the success of its graduates as they go to higher institutions of learning.

Recent graduates from the high school now in post-secondary work include Francena Pearson in Bates College, Lewiston, Me., Ruth Tyler in Nasson Institute, Springvale, Me., Minerva Pearson in Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio, Lincoln Pearson at the University of New Hampshire, Walter Kennett at the University of New Hampshire, Forrest Leavitt at Concord Business College, Janet Gerry in training in Maine General Hospital in Portland, Me., Herbert Arnold in Plymouth Teachers' College, Janet Chick at Simmons College in Boston. Frederick Whiting and Henry Meader are studying and working under N. Y. A. direction where there is splendid opportunity for applied activity and training. Florence Porter is in training at the Margaret Pillsbury Hospital in Concord.

Statistics

For the year ending June 30, 1939, we had an average attendance of 127, an average membership of 134 and a percent of 95.12. Schools having a percent

of 95 or over were Nickerson, High School and Silver Lake.
