# WARRANT FOR FOLLINSFORD TOWN MEETING

State of New Hampshire

Tuesday, March 8, 1960

POLLS TO BE OPEN FROM 10 A.M. to 7 P.M.

Appropriations and other Articles of Town Business will begin at 11:00 A.M. in the forenoon.

TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF ROL-LINSFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF STRAFFORD, IN SAID STATE, QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town, the eighth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ARTICLE 1. To bring in your ballots for Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman and Overseer of Public Welfare for a term of three years, one Road Agent for one year and Chief of the Fire Department.
- ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as prepared and submitted by the Budget Committee.
- ARTICLE 3. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes of the 1960 levy except poll taxes, paid within thirty days after presentation of warrant to Collector.

- ARTICLE 5. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will vote to revoke its previous adoption of the non-Partisan Ballot System. (By Petition)
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to have the power to appoint a Highway Agent beginning the year 1961.

Polls to be open at ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at seven o'clock in the evening.

To the School Board and Citizens of Rollinsford:

This is my second report to you as your Superintendent of Schools. The past year has been a good one for the Rollinsford Grade School. We have a competent staff headed by a very capable Principal, Mr. Lewis Hatfield. The turnover in personnel has not been heavy which in turn leads to fewer disruptions within the school.

Teacher turnover is not all bad, some turnover is good for a school. New ideas and ways of doing things are carried into the school with a new teacher. A heavy teacher turnover, on the other hand, is detrimental to a school, the result being no established practice and few teachers who really understand the community or background of individual children. In order that teacher turnover be kept within reason it is necessary to offer suitable salaries. slight upward revision in the salary schedule this year will tend to keep the school somewhat competitive. We must maintain a good position in the "teacher market" or suffer the consequences of sub-standard teaching, poor teacher morale and inferior student achievement.

Transportation - the problem that existed in transportation a year ago has been solved through the addition of another vehicle, a sixty passenger school bus. Presently we are in a favored position, but with increasing enrollments coupled with new housing starts I cannot safely predict how long our position will continue as at present.

Enrollment - as reported elsewhere in the Principal's Report the number of pupils on opening day closely paralleled that on opening day one year ago. Today our enrollment has reached (224) two hundred and twenty-four pupils, a total of fourteen above that on the first day of school. The recent installation of a new pump and source of water coupled with the extension of water mains to the Silver Street area of the Town has materially raised the possibilities of new families moving into Rollinsford. The new families mean more students for the school. In addition to the above you must take into account the fact that the Town has many open areas which could be developed into housing projects.

The School Board is cognizant of the aforementioned facts; they have continued to follow developments closely in order to be prepared for any eventuality. It is possible a new addition to the school will be necessary in the near future.

School Budget - the overall budget has been reduced slightly for 1960-61, in fact, the tax assessment upon the Town will be about four thousand dollars less next year. The tuition item of the budget is the one area which is responsible for the favorable budget picture. This item has been reduced enough to hold the line relative to the 1960-61 school year. A surplus in the tuition account this year will produce a surplus which will reduce the tax assessment.

In spite of the apparent reduction costs continue to rise year after year. Personally, I do not see any real reduction in school costs for some years to come. A community such as Rollinsford cannot continue to shoulder higher costs without help. The property tax cannot furnish over ninety percent of all local tax

resources; other sources of revenue are needed if we are to do the job the way it should be done.

The following reports and statistics will further explain the major areas in our school.

In closing this section of the report I wish to thank the Teachers, Principal, and the School Board for their cooperation and help during this year.

I am happy to be able at this time of the year to present to you a report that covers partially some of the activities of the Rollinsford Grade School during the past year 1959-1960.

### ENROLLMENT

The fall session of the Rollinsford Grade School opened this past year on Wednesday, September 9,1959. The enrollment as of this date was two hundred and ten pupils. As is customary the pupil population of the school has increased through the fall months and the number of pupils in the school at the present time is two hundred twenty-four pupils.

While dealing with the facts that are presented by the Enrollment table it might be well that we take a brief look at the summary of facts that is presented in the Registration Statistics Table that is presented below:

In comparing the table of 1959-60 with the same information of the period of ten years ago, we find that in that previous period there was an enrollment of 133 pupils and that in the ten year interval there has been a total increase of ninety-one pupils, or an average yearly increase of 9.1 pupils.

The following is the enrollment table showing the enrollment for the entire school and the distribution of the pupils within the various grades of the school.

### INSTRUCTION

The Rollinsford Grade School adheres to the Following Statements of Basic Beliefs:

- Educational opportunity should be provided for all children and youth and for adults to the full extent of their abilities and aptitudes through a program which recognizes and provides for individual differences.
- Teaching is a profession requiring special preparation in subject matter, teaching methods, and knowledge of how children grow and learn.
- The curriculum of a school cannot remain the same; it must be responsive to changing local, state, and national needs.

### 4. Our Aims are to:

- Foster intellectual growth as a primary objective.
- 2. Teach the basic skills thoroughly.
- Provide a balanced educational program in terms of the abilities and aptitudes of all learners.
- 4. Develop the attitudes, habits and values, appreciations, and understandings essential for a well adjusted person and a contributing member of our society.
- 5. Recognize and develop the special talents and meet the special needs of all pupils.
- Develop the ability to make rational judgments based on accurate and complete information.
- 7. Contribute to Physical and Mental Health.

- 8. Help pupils grow morally and spiritually.
- Contribute to the social and aesthetic development of pupils.
- 10. Help pupils develop increasing ability to exercise self-discipline as individuals and in groups.
- 11. Develop a respect for work and for skill in performance and the ability to carry tasks through to completion.
- 12. Stimulate an attitude for continued learning throughout life.

Our school presents a program of organized experiences for all children between the ages of 6 and 14. Common learnings in grades 1 - 6 include the elementary skills, knowledges, and the understanding of:

- The Language Arts -- reading, literature, listening, oral and written language, handwriting and spelling.
- Quantitative Subjects arithmetic and elementary mathematics.
- The Social Studies -- geography, history, citizenship, and the related fields.
- 4. Sciences -- elementary physical and biological sciences.
- 5. The Arts -- ART, Music, drama, and dance.
- 6. Physical well-being -- health, and physical education, and recreation.

Equally important is the elementary school's effort to help children develop healthy personalities. As subject matter is mastered, the elementary

school child learns to work and study, recognizing standards of skilled workmanship; to live safely; to contribute to his group; to cooperate with others; to assume his responsibilities; to accept leadership. Such traits as honesty, reliability, fair play, sensitivity to others, self-control are developed through day to day activities.

We have been most unfortunate this year in not having available to us the services of a music supervisor. The reason for this condition is simply that the Supervisor is not available. In past years we have had a portion of the time of the supervisors that have been attached to Somersworth. This year, however, the number of the classes that Somersworth has, has been so great that there is no time available for Salmon Falls. It is hoped that next year the situation will change and that the services of a supervisor will again be available to us.

By taking advantage of the Federal Aid to Education program in the fields of science and Mathematics, through the purchase of a Television set, we have been able to supplement our teaching in many of the grades with the excellent material that has been available from the local TV Educational station WENH-TV, at Durham, New Hampshire.

Television has not been confined solely to the fields of Science and Mathematics, but has been used with equal efficacy in the fields of English and French, and Social Studies.

Through the public-spiritedness of one of our Townspeople, Mrs. Charles A. MacIntyre, we have the services of an excellent teacher of penmanship. Mrs. MacIntyre has given us her services and teaches three classes in penmanship per week in Grades six, seven, and eight.

### FACULTY

During the past year there have been several changes in the faculty. As has been mentioned in the previous section one change has come about in the field of Music. We have lost the services of Mr. Killian because of his full schedule of teaching in Somersworth. It is hoped that next year we will be able to have the services of a Music Supervisor.

Early last spring it became apparent that we were faced with a vacancy in the Science and Math. fields inasmuch as Mrs. Eleanor Milliken had presented her resignation.

After careful consideration, Mrs. Marjorie Perkins, the then first grade teacher was selected because of her excellent background and training in the requirements of these fields. Mrs. Perkins started the fall term and was forced to withdraw because of reasons of health. We were fortunate in being able to persuade Mrs. Milliken to resume her teaching of these subjects.

The first grade vacancy was filled by the hiring of Miss Patricia Reilly, of Dover, N. H. Miss Reilly is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and holds a Bachelor of Arts degree. She is currently engaged in doing graduate work at the University with a master's degree as her goal.

Another vacancy in the faculty was occasioned by the resignation of Mrs. Greta Benoit of the third grade who left to assume a position with Berwick Academy, in South Berwick, Maine.

Her place was filled by Mrs. Nancy McHugh, of Durham, N. H. Mrs. McHugh came to us well recommended from her previous position. She has an excellent educational background, and holds a bachelor of Arts Degree. She has had two years of previous experience, and is doing an extremely capable job of instructing the pupils of the third grade.

  - (b) Potato, Riće, Noódles, Maćaroni, Špaghetti (c) Vegetables, according to the season, both
  - fresh and canned.
- (2) A sandwich of some variety
- (3) A dessert of some variety cake, pie, cookies, ice cream, fruits, etc.
- (4) A bottle of Pasteurized milk.

After some discussion, the motion was put to a vote. William Fleming, Edward Burke, Robert Whitehouse and Joseph Chabot acted as tellers. The motion was defeated 86 to 72.

ARTICLE 2 To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes of the 1959 levy except poll taxes, paid within thirty days after presentation of warrant to Collector.

Joseph Chabot moved, seconded by Edward Burke, that Article 2 be accepted as read. Motion was put to a vote and carried.

ARTICLE 3 To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

Motion was made by Joseph Chabot, seconded by Edward Burke, that Article 3 be accepted as read. Motion was put to a vote and carried.

ARTICLE 4
To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to have the Town Books audited every year by State Tax Commission.

Basil Mitchell moved, seconded by Donald Rees, that Article 4 not be accepted until such time as the cost for such audits is determined. Leo Gagnon explained that the cost would be approximately one-half of this year's audit, and also stated that it had been recommended by the State Tax Commission.

Motion was made by Joseph Chabot, seconded by Edward Burke, that Article 4 be accepted as read. Motion was put to a vote and carried.

ARTICLE 5 To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate that has been or may be acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.

Edward Burke moved, seconded by Joseph Chabot, that Article 5 be accepted as read. Motion was put to a vote and carried.

To see if the Town will vote to revoke its previous adoption of the Non-Partisan Ballot System.

Motion was made by Joseph Chabot that Article 6 be accepted as read, but that it be fully explained before any vote was taken. Motion was seconded by Edward Burke. The Moderator then explained the Non-Partisan Ballot and the Australian Ballot. After much discussion, the motion was put

to a vote and it was defeated. The Non-Partisan Ballot System will, therefore, continue to be in effect for the coming year.

ARTICLE 7 To see if the town will vote to abandon the so-called Dump Crossing if or when the B & M R.R. builds a road on the westerly side of the railroad leading to dump.

After discussion as to the location of the road, cost of construction, if any to the Town, motion was made by Honore Ouellette, seconded by Charles W. Jackson, that Article 7 be accepted as read, when it was brought out that the cost of construction would be the responsibility of the B & M R.R.

ARTICLE 8 To see if the Town will vote to publish all delinquent Head and Poll Tax payers.

Discussion as to cost of publishing these names, the amounts involved was followed by a motion made by Blanche Valliere that Article 8 be accepted as read. Motion was put to a vote and carried.

ARTICLE 9 To see if the Town will vote on disposing of Town Tractor, it being no longer serviceable.

Motion was made by Basil Mitchell, seconded by James Skaltsis, that the town tractor be disposed of with the use of advertisement. After much discussion, motion was put to a vote and carried.

ARTICLE 10 To see if the Town will vote on disposing of the 1930 Ford Tank Truck which no longer can be of any service to the Town.

Motion was made by Basil Mitchell, seconded by James Lampesis, that the tank truck be disposed of in the same manner as the town tractor. Motion was put to a vote and carried.

ARTICLE 11 To see if the Town will vote to authorize and compel the Selectmen to have printed in the annual town report the value and tax of all property assessed in said town of Rollinsford.

(By Petition)

After a good deal of discussion, Basil Mitchell moved, seconded by Lester F. Eldridge, that Article 11 be accepted as read. Motion was put to a vote and carried.

ARTICLE 12 To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

### Surveyors of Wood and Lumber

Motion was made by Edward J. Hudon, seconded by Joseph Chabot, that the same members be re-elected. Motion carried, and the following will serve for the coming year:

Discussion brought out the fact that in the event of the resignation of a Town Officer, it would necessitate the audit of his books by the State Auditors, thereby

creating an added expense. Kenneth Bolduc then withdrew his motion.

Motion was made by Honore Ouellette, seconded by Edward J. Hudon, that the same two auditors remain in office for the coming year. Motion carried. Ruth P. Emerson and Armand E. Letarte will remain as auditors.

### Trustees of Trust Fund

Motion was made by Joseph Chabot, seconded by Alfred Morin, that Charles W. Jackson be re-elected to a three-year term. Motion carried.

### Parks and Playgrounds

Joseph Chabot moved, seconded by Joseph Lepage, that Joseph Levesque be elected to a three-year term. Motion carried.

### Budget Committee

Albert Labrecque nominated Edward J. Hudon Albert Labrecque nominated Joseph Boisvert Albert Labrecque nominated Elliot Bisson John Cloutman nominated Douglas Rollins Mr. Tifft nominated Warren Earle Rudolph Therrien nominated Basil Mitchell Mrs. John Lawlor nominated William Cook

ARTICLE 13 To see if the voters of the Town of Rollinsford favor the abolition of the Rollinsford Municipal Court.

Motion was made by Robert Knight, seconded by Mr. Lavertue, that the Rollinsford Municipal Court be left as it is. Motion was put to vote and carried. Article 13 was therefore defeated.

ARTICLE 14 To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as prepared and submitted by Budget Committee.

Kenneth Bolduc suggested that several items in the budget should be discussed before being voted upon. The first of these was the appropriation of \$8,200 for the purchase of a new tank truck for the Fire Department.

After much discussion, Basil Mitchell moved, seconded by Mr. Lavertue, that the tank truck be purchased, and that a committee of three men be chosen to work with Chief Sullivan in the selection and purchase of this new truck. Motion was put to vote and carried.

Basil Mitchell nominated Charles Chase Katherine Roberts nominated Dr. Lampesis Anthony Economos nominated Albert Viel

Basil Mitchell moved, seconded by Joseph Chabot, that the nominations close. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Charles W. Jackson that the sum of \$2,200 be raised for the tank

truck this year, and that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow \$6,000 payable \$1,500 each year for four years. Joseph Chabot seconded the motion which was put to a yote and carried.

The next item in the budget was the town officers' salaries and expenses. This was discussed in great detail. Basil Mitchell moved that the Town Clerk take action, legal action, if necessary, to recover the sum of \$160 allegedly "taken" by the Selectmen. Motion was seconded by Romeo Therrien, but was not put to a vote.

Motion was made by Joseph Chabot that the Budget be accepted as read, seconded by Edward Burke. It was not voted upon.

Basil Mitchell then withdrew his previous motion and submitted another, that being that a vote be taken to see if the budget would be accepted before any further discussion. This motion was seconded by Mr. Chabot. It was put to a vote and the result showed 92 for and 13 against. Budget was, therefore, accepted as read in the sum of \$62,906.53.

Raymond Chase moved, seconded by Katherine Roberts, that the minutes of the Town Meeting be incorporated in the Town Report. Motion carried.

Motion made by Joseph Chabot that the meeting be adjourned. Motion seconded by Edward Burke. Motion carried.

The Town Meeting was therefore declared adjourned at 11 P.M.
