TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Unity on the second Tuesday of March next—March 8, 1960—at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

To choose all necessary Officers, Agents and Trustees, for the ensuing year under the Australian Ballot System.

1. To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing one year.
3. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing one year.
4. To choose an Overseer of Public Welfare for the ensuing one year.
5. To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing one year.
6. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing one year.
7. To choose a Highway Agent for the ensuing one year.
8. To choose a Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.
9. To choose a Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

BUSINESS MEETING CALLED TO ORDER AT 2 O'CLOCK

1. To hear the report of the Selectmen and other Town Officials and pass any vote in relation thereto.
2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other Town Charges.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay Librarian's Salary and Library Tax.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age Assistance and Town Poor Charges.

6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay just debts of Town.
7. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for maintenance of highways and bridges, snow removal, and determine price to be paid for labor and trucks
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$250 for the control of Blister Rust.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of 753.58 for Town Road Aid. If this sum is raised the State will contribute \$5,022.55.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the betnefit of the Unity Volunteer Fire Dept., Inc., the Fire Dept. to have authority to spend any part of this money for Civilian Defense equipment for the Fire Department.
11. To see if the Town will vote by ballot to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds.
12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise one-hundredth of one per cent of valuation for the benefit of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Association.
14. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the Town's share of Social Security.
15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase from the Unity School District, for the sum of one dollar (\$1.00), the old school house in Unity Center.
16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Unity qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Unity School in said district on the second day of March, 1960, at eight o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization and building funds, together with other income; the School Board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to appropriate receipts from federal lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and any other receipts from miscellaneous sources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1960-1961, for the lunch program, general expenses, equipment and improvements.

10. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U. S. Government and/or state agencies.
11. To see if the school district will authorize the School Board to make provisions for a kindergarten class, and see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of such a class.
12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Unity, I herewith submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

We were very fortunate to have all our teaching staff available for the opening of school in September this year. To have experienced teachers with high retentive power in the faculty, means a stronger and a better organized school. Mrs. Nelson continued as Principal of the Unity School, assisted by Mrs. Cragin in the Primary Room, Mrs. McCullough in the intermediate room, and Mr. Hall in the upper grades.

Mrs. Smith continued this year as custodian of the school, and we are all very appreciative of her efforts in making our school facilities comfortable and most livable. Mrs. Chase has again provided hot lunches in the cafeteria, and all children who desired to do so, have had an opportunity to make use of this school service. Monthly shipments of Government surplus foods have helped finance the lunch program, and enabled us to serve meals at a minimum cost to the child.

The building is in fine physical condition, and the school board has every intention of maintaining the school so as not to permit unnecessary depreciation. Two rooms were redecorated this year, and the building was thoroughly cleaned and floors waxed, during the summer vacation.

Mr. Floyd DeLude and Mr. James Paul operate our school transportation system. Children are transported to and from school in large capacity buses which provide safe and comfortable seating arrangements. One bus is used on the East Loop and the other on the West. Marie Clough operates a feeder line as in past years.

The superintendent's office has made a four year survey of prospective school enrollments for the years 1960-1963 inclusive. The results of this research shows the school population trend for the next few years as follows:

We expect an entering class of sixteen pupils in the first grade when school opens next September. There will be ten graduates in June who will continue their education at Claremont or Newport High Schools. This would indicate an opening day enrollment of 116 pupils for next year.

One change in our testing program will become effective with the opening of school in September 1960. Pre-school tests will be given to all first grade candidates for admission. Those children who have reached their sixth birthday by September 30th must attend school in accordance with State Law. Children whose birthdays fall between September 30th and December 31st will be selected and admitted on the basis of results shown in the pre-school tests to be given previous to the first day of school. Children six years of age after December 31st must wait another year to attend school.

Under the government National Defense Act, public schools in New Hampshire are privileged to participate in Federal Funds provided for improvement of school programs, particularly science. The school board has expressed interest in taking advantage of this opportunity, on a matched fund basis. The State has allotted approximately \$375 to Unity for improvement in science instructional materials in the elementary school.

I wish to thank the teachers for their support and loyalty throughout the school year. I am very appreciative of the cooperation given me by the members of the school board. Working together, we can continue to maintain a high Standard of Education for the children in this community.

Among the more interesting new pieces of equipment is a Science Laboratory which gives the children a chance to make actual experiments in this increasingly important field.

A very successful Book Fair was enjoyed by both children and parents this year. At this event we were privileged to meet Mr. Raymond Holden, lecturer, and author of several very important and interesting books. Mrs. Mahoney spoke to the younger children.

The teaching staff wishes to thank the school officials, local organizations and individual parents for the help that has been so freely given in the past year.

SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT

Our School Health Program continues to be a busy one. Once again Dental Clinics were sponsored by the Parent-Teacher Association. A total of sixty children attended these clinics for corrective work. Fourteen appointments of three hours each made up the clinics. Dr. Rund of Claremont did the dental work. This is a very worthwhile educational program, as well as a corrective one. Our children are very much aware of dental conditions and appear to enjoy attending the clinics. The children are transported into Claremont by volunteers.

This past year for the first time fourth inoculations of Salk Vaccine were made available. A large clinic was held at the Unity Elementary School. Children and adults from Goshen-Lempster attended this as well as the Unity people. Nearly all of the children in the Unity School have the protection of Salk Vaccine.

The yearly screening tests were done—vision, hearing and general inspections, including weighing and measuring. Response to the treatment of defects reported by the nurse to the parents was very good and in nearly all instances there was an effort made to remedy the defect.

Tuberculin Patch testing was done in grades one, three, five, seven and eight. There was one positive reactor and a follow-up was made by the County Tuberculosis Nurse. A chest X-ray was done on the child and the results were negative.

I would like to express my thanks to you for your cooperation and real interest in our School Health Program.
