TOWN MEETING - MARCH 14, 1967

The Meeting was called to order at 8:05 P. M.

The Moderator read the Warrant.

Article 2. Voted to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. Voted to spend the interest of the Parsonage Fund for preaching for the ensuing year.

Article 4. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

Article 6. Was on the ballot.

Article 7. Voted to accept and maintain all fire fighting equipment now owned by the Danville Firemen's Association, as itemized and filed with the Town Clerk.

Article 8. (Tax Collector Edward T. Battis said that he would accept six tenths (6/10ths) of one per cent (1%) of the Tax money until the Taxes reached Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand (\$250,000.00) dollars; then it was to be cut to five tenths (5/10ths) of one per cent (1%) as wages.)

Voted to accept Edward T. Battis proposal.

Voted to close the meeting at 9:30 P. M.

SELECTMEN'S OPEN LETTER

Several thousand years ago a very wise man wrote in the Bible that "Money is the root of all evil." To those of us who concern ourselves with municipal problems, these same words never had more substance than they have today.

Beyond doubt, today, money is the root of all our Town problems. Our schools, if they are to progress, need ever larger sums; if we want better police and fire protection, we need more money. Since most of our much needed money comes from the property tax, and since the property tax is based on valuations that have been determined by local selectmen, no wonder the sudden demand for a greater degree of accuracy in our valuations has created a vital need for property revaluations.

Your local assessors are, by the very nature of their duties, at the cutting edge of the shovel that brings in the dollars now required by the various spending units in our town. To the local assessor, a property to be revalued is not merely a set of statistics that is fed into a slide rule or a computer and out comes market value. It is not merely a bundle of accumulated laws to be intoned from the shelter of the State House Annex. No, the local assessor is well aware that behind each assessment there are people, and to these people their annual tax bill is a highly personal and important matter.

The question arises as to whether or not it would be advisable to promote a bulldozer type revaluation by so-called "outsiders - strangers" with a resulting high cost and inequities, or would it be better to use the "do-it-yourself" revaluation method and work for correction of inequities. Since we felt it more reasonable to pursue the latter method, a great deal of time has been devoted to reassessments during this past year.

We wish to thank all those who have been helpful, understanding and cooperative during the past year. It is this cooperation that enables us to best serve the Town of Danville.
