To the inhabitants of the Town of Gilsum in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Gilsum on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at one-thirty of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

The business meeting will be called to order at 8:00 P.M. to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for the use of setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if the estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action thereon.

- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be placed in the Fire Truck Trust Fund.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with a bond company in the amount of \$80,000, for the sole purpose of rebuilding and refurbishing the Town Hall building. (2/3 majority vote required for passage)

- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the purpose of finishing the downstairs portion of the Sumner Hall Library Building.
- 5. To receive the report of the Budget Committee, to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town expense; and act in any matter relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authroize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to take charge of the observance of Memorial Day.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue permits, without charge, for supervised activities held on the Town Grounds, said permits to include the erection of temporary structures.
- 9. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to sell any land and all pieces of real estate, either by auction or private sale, acquired by tax deed, said property to be advertised for sale for three weeks prior to sale.
- 10. To transact any business that may legally come before this meeting.

The following articles will be voted on during the voting hours of 1:30 until 6:30 P.M. by special ballot:

A-1 Question: Should the game of Bingo or Beano be allowed to be played in the Town of Gilsum?

#### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT 1979

For 1979, library circulation rose to 5,605, an increase over last year, even though only 202 patrons were registered. Library cards were issued to 57 children, and to 145 adults and young adults. The circulation figure includes 2,076 non-fiction volumes and 843 magazines. Fiction circulated was 2,623, records 19, sets of color slides 23, and jig-saw puzzles 21.

This past year, with the New Hampshire State library's restricted budget, we received only two visits from the Bookmobile, with a total of 1,683 books borrowed. The Keene Public Library gave us welcome loans of 166 volumes. Over the many years that they've been so helpful to us, we've been inclined to take the Keene Library for granted, but since their closing for alterations a few months ago, we've come to realize how much we depend on them for additional materials. We won't take them for granted in the future.

We've had a sort of mini-bookmobile of our own this year, thanks to our faithful assistant, Lois Wright. She has been taking books regularly to several of our senior residents who are not able to come to the library. The State Library, too, has supplied talking books to one of our residents, who, because of limited vision, has difficulty seeing to read print. Library Service, to the Handicapped, as it is called, is provided by the State Library for the blind and physically handicapped, so that they can obtain free of charge, library materials especially designed for the handicapped. If you, or anyone you know can make use of this service, please inquire at the library for information. We'll be glad to assist you.

Our annual book sale was held at Rock Swap time with moderate success. This sale has a double advantage for us. Not only do we turn discarded books into money, but we gain room on our shelves for books we do want.

The Mine Maps and Gilsum postcards continue to be offered for purchase at the Gilsum Village Store, thanks to the proprietors, Linda and Duane Wakefield. This is very helpful to people who come into town to visit the mines at times when the library is not open.

At present, the library has a collection of material compiled in past years by earlier Gilsum residents on the activities and news of Gilsum. This material has been made available to the newly-formed Gilsum Historical So-

ciety for using in their research. Sylvanus Hayward's History of Gilsum records the history only up to 1879. It would be great if the Historical Society could gather enough material for continuing the history from that date forward.

The Library Trustees and staff are striving to make the library more responsive and useful to all of our residents. Remember, the library is yours. Become acquainted with it. Why not make your watchword this year, "Meet me at the Library!"

#### REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

#### 1979

Two subdivisions were approved this year. One lot was subdivided into three lots and the other into two. All lots created through subdivision are over 5 acres.

The five amendments approved at the 1979 Town Meeting were incorporated into the Gilsum Zoning Ordinance. Updated copies of the Ordinance are available from the Selectmen or Town Clerk.

The Board continued to work on a Master Plan with the assistance of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. In an effort to obtain opinions as to the future development of Gilsum, a special public meeting was held in June, and a questionaire was distributed by the Boys Club to a sampling of Town residents. Those responding indicated strong preferences for:

Differential zoning according to use of land (i.e. residences, farms, business, etc.)

Limitation of number of mobile homes.

Continuation of the regulation permitting only one-family or two-family houses.

General satisfaction with Town services.

Encouragement of small business or industry.

Two thirds of those responding were of the opinion that additional recreational facilities (Particularly a swimming area) are needed. Accordingly, a joint meeting was held with members of the Recreation Commission to share the concerns and suggestions expressed on the questionaire.

The Board expects to complete the Master Plan in 1980. Further suggestions from Town residents are always welcome, and all Planning Board meetings are open to everyone.

## REPORT OF THE GILSUM HISTORICAL SOCIETY

As we begin this new year with all our New Years resolutions, let's put our Society interests right up at the top of the list. We got off to a good start in September when we formed our society because of the great desire of the founding members.

Selectman Robert Coppo asked to have the insurance recommendation for 1979 increased from \$5,000.00 to \$7,000.00; an additional \$2,000.00 for errors and ommissions insurance. The Selectman reported that about two weeks ago some townspeople asked for an audit of the Town books, and a few errors were found.

It was made clear that this \$2,000.00 figure was an estimated one, and would cover all Town Officials except Police Officers.

Ralph Finch: "I make a motion to appropriate \$70,864.32 for the budget." (Which includes the additional \$2,000.00.)

It was voted on by a show of hands, and there being 56 people present, the vote showed:

6 people did not vote.

The article was so ammended and the total budget was passed.

4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

The motion was brought to the floor & seconded, voted on by a show of hands which was; 54 yeas, & 2 nays. The article was passed.

5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town expenses.

The article was moved to the floor, seconded, and approved unanimously with no discussion.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to take charge of the observance of Memorial Day.

This article was moved to the floor, seconded, and approved unanimously with no discussion.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue permits, without charge, for supervised activities held on the Town Grounds, said permits to include the erection of temporary structures.

This article was moved to the floor, seconded, and

passed unanimously.

8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell any land and all pieces of real estate, either by auction or private sale, acquired by tax deed, said property to be advertised for sale for three weeks prior to the sale.

This article was moved to the floor, seconded, and passed unanimously.

- 9. To transact any business that may legally come before this meeting.
  - a. A motion was made to report action taken on Town warrant:

We resolve to include in next year's Town Report all action taken on articles at this year's Town Meeting. (Selectmen shall do this)

b. A motion was made that a committee be developed to collect figures on costs of restoration of the present Town Hall. Motion Carried

With the ever increasing number of wood stoves being installed in homes due to the price of home heating oil, your Fire Department is getting very concerned about your safety.

We know that some of these wood burning units are being installed in an unsafe manner and some are being connected to old chimneys that are very unsafe.

We expect that in the near future there will be a new State law pertaining to this. But, as of right now, there is no law saying that anyone can come into your home and tell you that your stove is not installed in a safe manner or that your chimney is not safe; even though it would be for your own protection.

In the meantime, I suggest very strongly that each home have at least two smoke & fire dectors installed. These detectors could very well save your life or the lives of your family.

As of February 1, 1980, through your Fire Department, you can purchase a Sunbeam smoke & fire detector for the minimal cost of only \$8.75 which is a very small price for possibly your life or the lives of your loved ones.

I will be more than glad to take orders for these detectors and, if after you receive them, you are unsure of locating them in your home or unable to install them yourself, you may contact me or any member of your Fire Department to help you.
