TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grantham, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Police Officer, and two Auditors for the ensuing year; one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds, one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway agents, and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to delray town charges.
- Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the poor and Old Age Assistance.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to apply for Town Road Aid, and raise \$294.24 for same.
- Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for snow bill.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1958 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and

resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the use of the fire department.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell any property acquired by tax title, if they should deem it advisable.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for maintenance of the town dump.
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise \$400 to pay for the cost of street lighting.
- Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and set aside the sum of \$300.00 for the new truck fund.
- Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise \$100.00 for control of the White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the use of the Newport Hospital.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money if necessary.
- Art. 20. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to buy a used dump truck, not exceeding \$2,000.00 in cost, and to use funds from the Equipment Fund for said purchase.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to discontinue as a town road that section of old route 10 from the approach to the Grass Pond interchange, north to the Enfield town line.
- Art. 22. To hear the reports of the officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 23. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

YOU, whether YOU be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First-by setting a good example YOURSELF-being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second - by using YOUR individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

I wish to thank the Board of Selectmen, the officers and men of the Department and the people of the Town for their continued help.

Our committee feels that a good plan could lead to sound zoning ordinances that would make a better community for tomorrow, and we recommend that the Town adopt the Article to have a Planning Board.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Grantham:

The problems of educating children in the smaller districts are centered around books, supplies, buildings, teachers and taxes. Grantham has three teachers who are dedicated to improving high quality learning by each child. The children in each room are interested in studying and doing their share in acquiring an education. Books and supplies are adequate but never sufficiently challenging for all pupils. The buildings and desks have been greatly improved.

Taxes for 1960-61 are lower because of a larger amount of State Aid. To estimate the State's share for 1961-62 is difficult, but probably will be larger. The State's increase undoubtedly will be more than the amount lost because Grantham did not raise \$14.00 per thousand on the equalized valuation in March, 1961, as explained in the last Annual Report.

The long range school problems can be solved by constructive thought and efforts by parents and others working together. The cooperative school program is gaining an important place in providing good education for more children at a realistic cost in several areas of New Hampshire. This possibility may be worth studying.

In conclusion, I suggest that education is acquired through studying, and that studying is hard work for most people. Parents and grandparents can assist children by encouraging them to attend school with a desire to study effectively. Children owe their country the effort to acquire an education that will make them productive citizens.

My thanks to the School Board, teachers, nurse, janitors, parents, citizens and pupils who have worked for the educational program in Grantham.

All children in both schools were weighed and measured. Eye tests were given with a new machine, a Bausch & Lomb Ortho-Rater. Only two defects were found and they have been corrected. Hearing tests were given with only one defect found and this is in the process of being treated. Tuberculin patch tests were given to most of the students and I am happy to say there were no positive reactors.

I would like to express my thanks to Mr. Young, the Grantham School Board and the teachers for all their efforts. We are all working for the welfare of the children.
