To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hebron Community Hall on Tuesday, the thirteenth of March next at five of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Polls open from five p. m. to eight p. m.

Business meeting will open at seven P. M.

2. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the ensuing year for expenditures enumerated in the proposed budget appearing in the Town Report. Copy of the budget is attached to the posted Warrant.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to give two per cent cash discount on property taxes if paid thirty days from date of tax bill.

5. To see if the Town will appropriate and raise money for the installation of a two-way radio in the car of the Police Chief. The cost will be shared equally with the State at an estimated cost to the Town of \$280.

6. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Other articles may be added before the Warrant is posted.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Hebron qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in said district on the 6th day of March, 1962, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the School District will authorize the School Board to appoint a committee of three persons, including one member of the Board of Selectmen, to investigate participation by the Hebron School District in a Cooperative School District and to report their findings at a special meeting to be called for the purpose.

10. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900, the same to be made available during the current fiscal year.

11. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to arrange to purchase the lights in the South Danbury School, and to determine what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for this purpose.

12. To see if the School District will vote to accept the following agreement between the Hebron and Groton School Boards: The Hebron School Board agrees to accept Groton's pupils in grades 1-4 inclusive, in exchange for Hebron's pupils in grades 5-8 inclusive, and to pay a tuition rate of \$225 per year for each pupil in excess of the number being received from Groton, and to pay the cost of transportation between the two schools, for a three year period beginning Septemer, 1962.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
