

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$142.24 for T. R. A. work, the State to contribute the sum of \$568.94.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 to finish water works construction on D. W. Highway.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 to apply against the current deficit of \$7,090.47.



Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lincoln for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1945, which was made by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission in accordance with the vote of the town. Exhibits and Schedules as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and the Municipal Court.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Balance Sheet - December 31, 1945

A balance sheet, as of December 31, 1945, has been prepared and is presented in town report.

Change in Financial Condition:

As shown in Town Report, the fiscal year of 1945 ended with a Net Debt of \$46,590.47, as compared to a Net Surplus of \$18,871.76 at the close of 1944, indicating a change in financial condition during 1945 of \$65,462.23. This resulted principally from the issuance of water bonds and a net budget deficit. The change in financial condition of the town during the year may be summarized as follows:

As indicated by the budget summary, a net overdraft of appropriations of \$30,843.78, less an excess of actual over estimated revenue of \$337.15, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$30,506.63. It is noted that the large amount of overdrafts was occasioned principally by water works construction, purchase of new equipment and retirement of bonds.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1945, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Town Report.

Ten Year Statements of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes

Summarized statements of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes, covering a ten year period, prepared from reports on file in the office of the Tax Commission, are presented in Town Report.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1945, is indicated in Town Report.

TAX ACCOUNTS

Tax warrants for the levies of 1945, 1944, 1943, 1942 and previous years were examined. Summaries indicating the activity in these accounts for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1945, are presented in Town Report.

TOWN CLERK

The accounts and records of the Town Clerk were examined and audited. All funds received by the Clerk on account of the issuance of motor vehicle permits, dog licenses, business licenses and for filing fees were properly accounted for through remittances to the Treasurer.

GENERAL COMMENTS

When the budget for 1946 is made up, it would be well to consider the current deficit of \$7,090.47 which existed at the close of 1945. This is arrived at as follows:

The accounts and records of all town officials were found in good condition and the accounting procedure conformed to the uniform system prescribed by this Division. The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

BONDED INDEBTEDNESS

The bonded debt of the school district on June 30, 1945, amounted to \$10,000.00, representing the outstanding balance of a bond issue of \$20,000.00 dated January 1, 1936. The bonds mature at the rate of \$1,000.00 a year until January 1, 1955, when the final maturity occurs.
