

The State of New Hampshire.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon in the County of Grafton and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 12th day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects :

- 1st. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 2nd. To elect two Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
- 3rd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriation for same.
- 4th. To hear reports of agents and auditors heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 5th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6th. To see if the town will vote to dispense with the liquor agency for the ensuing year.
- 7th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law and to determine how the same shall be divided.

8th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to properly observe Memorial Day, also to see if the town will vote to pay the rent of the G. A. R. Hall.

9th. To see if the town will vote to discount all taxes paid on or before July 5, 1918.

10th. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of Ozro Streeter to the Hotel Look-Off; the Baptist Church through Lover's Lane to Franconia line; from the Goodnow School House to the Homestead; Barrett's Station; said Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight and from five A. M. until daylight; all of the above premises to be lighted with electricity except Barrett's Station, which is to be lighted with oil, and to raise the necessary money for the same.

11th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the District Nursing Association.

12th. To see what action the town will take towards applying for State Aid for highways and to raise the necessary money to secure the same.

13th. To see what action the town will take towards applying for State Aid for the maintenance of the Sugar Hill and Franconia road and to raise the necessary money to secure the same.

14th. To see what action the town will take towards applying for State Aid for the maintenance of the Trunk Line and to raise the necessary money to secure the same.

15th. To see if the town will vote to equip the bridge in Lisbon Village with wire screens between the driveway and sidewalks.

16th. To see if the town will vote to give the use of the Town Hall Building for the coming Community Fair.

17th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money for the improvement of the Streeter Pond road, the Mallory road and the Blake road.

18th. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate two hundred dollars to help destroy the white pine blister.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Abstract from Town Clerk's Record

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Lisbon, qualified to vote in town affairs, at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on the second Tuesday of March, 1917, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, the meeting was called to order by William E. Price, the moderator, who proceeded to read the warrant, after which the following officers were elected and business transacted:

For Town Clerk: Augustus M. Clough.

For Selectmen: Edward E. Gates, Walter S. Jesseman, Marshall H. King.

For Treasurer: Earnest H. Hallett.

For Auditors: Ned G. English, Fred Parker.

For Library Trustees: Elizabeth Richardson, John S. Gilman.

For Fence Viewers: Herbert E. Morse, Lorenzo E. Barrett, Austin J. Batchelder, Dwight H. Parker.

Pound Keepers: Charles V. Elms, Erwin Bowles, Harry O. Conrad, George A. Ash, D. Herbert Noyes, Herbert E. Morse, Harvey L. Bishop, Otis Hildreth, George O. Savage.

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber: Frank E. Buck, Jerry Callahan, Daniel M. Tefft, Grover Hanno, Frank D. Howard, Levi M. Campbell, George A. Beane, Walter S. Jesseman, George Savage, Edward J. Conrad, Warren Dexter, William H. Nihan.

Upon motion—

Voted:

To raise the sum of four thousand dollars to defray town charges and to apply on indebtedness.

Voted:

To raise one half of one per cent. of the valuation for the repairs of highways and bridges, same to be divided between the Lisbon Village District and the remainder of the town as per the valuation in each.

Voted:

To dispense with the Liquor Agency.

Voted:

To raise the sum of five hundred dollars, in addition to that required by law for the support of the Libraries, and that this amount and the total amount on hand and that required by law be divided in the ratio of three-sevenths for Sugar Hill branch and four-sevenths for Lisbon Village Library.

Voted:

To raise the sum of ninety dollars to properly observe Memorial Day and to pay the rent of G. A. R. Hall.

Voted:

To discount two per cent. on all taxes paid on or before July 5, 1917.

Voted:

To raise the sum of thirty-eight hundred dollars to light Lisbon Village District (including Town Building), Sugar Hill and Barrett's Station.

Voted:

To raise the sum of two hundred dollars for District Nursing Association.

Voted:

To raise the sum of twenty-eight hundred twenty-one dollars and fifty cents (in order to secure seven hundred five dollars and twenty-five cents from the State) as State Aid for high-

ways to be expended at the discretion of the Selectmen and Highway department.

Voted:

To discontinue the Hess road.

Voted:

To raise the sum of fifty dollars for the repairs on Streeter District Cemetery and one hundred and fifty dollars for Salmon Hole Cemetery.

Voted:

To raise the sum of four hundred dollars for the Fred Hibbard road; four hundred dollars for the E. J. Conrad road, and five hundred dollars for the Hotel Look-Off road.

Voted:

To raise the sum of seven hundred fifty dollars (in order to secure the same amount from the State) for the maintenance of the highway from Salmon Hole to Sunset Hill House and thence to Franconia line.

Voted:

To raise the sum of eleven hundred ten dollars (in order to secure fifteen hundred fifty-four dollars from the State) for the maintenance of the Trunk line.

Voted:

To raise the salary of the Selectmen from two to three dollars per day.

TRUSTEES OF

THE LISBON PUBLIC LIBRARY.

GENTLEMEN:

I herewith submit my report of the library for the past year.

There are 5,242 upon the shelves, exclusive of State and Government publications. 158 have been added by purchase, 15 by bound magazines and 8 by gifts.

Ninety-four books have been rebound and 72 new cards have been issued.

Again the circulation has reached the ten thousand mark.

A bulletin board has been placed in the library, whereon the numerous food and war bulletins furnished by the Government and State have been displayed.

Several posters have also been displayed to urge in raising funds for patriotic purposes.

The Government Official Bulletin has been a daily visitor. Many other valuable bulletins relating to food products, etc., have been received from time to time and placed on the reading table for the use of the patrons.

Our quota for the War Library Fund was \$123, but through the efforts of the trustees the sum of \$141.65 was raised.

Folders have been printed containing each new lot of books, together with the notes on them.

Readers' Guide is proving more valuable to the students in the selection of magazine articles.

Few libraries of this size subscribe to so many magazines as this one. We sometimes wonder if the citizens realize how easily these magazines can be used. Just borrow them on your non-fiction card.

We are glad to voice our appreciation of the better care taken of the books by the children.
