STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

SEAL

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan in the County of Coos in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I. O. O. F. Hall at Milan in said town on Tuesday the 8th day of March at 9:00 of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' salaries.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' expenses.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for tractor expense for the ensuing year.
6. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for the construction of class 2 roads known as Milan Hill Road and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,000.00 or will accept state aid for class 5 roads and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$322.37.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town poor.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for old age assistance.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for public library.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries.
11. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 to be laid out on the French Hill Road as extra money.
12. To choose by ballot one Trustee for the Cemetery Trust Fund for three years.
13. To choose by ballot one Trustee for the Public Library for three years.

14. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$59.00 based on 1-100 of 1% of assessed valuation to be paid as its share of the expense of carrying on an advertising and other beneficial program for the section of the state known as the White Mountain Region, of which this town is a part, in co-operation with the State of New Hampshire and other towns in said region, to be paid by the Board of Selectmen to the Treasurer of the White Mountain Region.

16. To choose by ballot one delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

17. To transact any other business that shall legally come before the meeting and appropriate money for same.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

Milan, N. H.,
February 1, 1938

To the Milan School Board:

I submit, herewith, the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools, this being the eighteenth in the series of Superintendent's reports.

During the last complete school year ending June, 1937 seven different schools were maintained for the required 36 weeks with a total enrollment of 131 pupils.

The present school year opened and is now being carried on with no change from last year's teaching corps.

Twelve pupils were graduated from the eighth grade in June and eight of them are now furthering their education in high school.

The average attendance for the last school year was 94.3. The highest record was at West Milan with a percentage of 96.6.

The Health Supervision has been carried on as usual by the School Nurse and notices of physical defects sent to parents.

All the schools have been regularly visited and inspected about on an average of once in two weeks by your Superintendent.

Twenty-eight pupils are now in attendance at Berlin High School.
