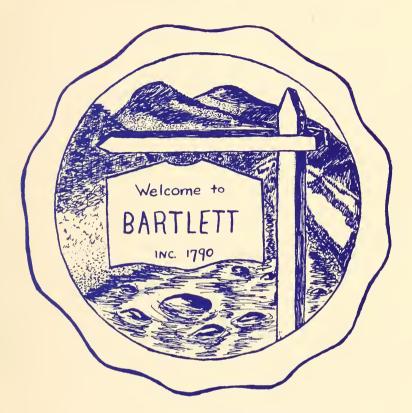

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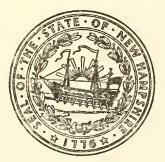

## TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett, New Hampshire in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects hereinafter set forth. The voting on Article 1 will be by official ballot, and the polls shall open for balloting at ten o'clock in the forenoon and shall not close before 6:30 o'clock in the evening. The remaining Articles of the warrant shall be acted upon at 7:00 o'clock in the evening.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum not exceeding in the aggregate \$250,-000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of the Town and on the credit of the same, negotiable notes thereof, said to be repaid during the current year from taxes collected within the current municipal year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds or by any other means. Subject only to the interest of relatives and heirs, all disposal shall be by public auction.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts, and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Bartlett.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to abandon and deed to the abutting owners, a twelve foot wide road leading from Route 16A to the Comb's property. Said road commonly known as Burdette Road.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for support of the Eastern Slope Regional Airport.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,000.00 for the purchase of a new truck and authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the Town Mapping Account \$4,432.50 to cover the 1977 payment to the mapping contractor.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for a Dump Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the withdrawal of \$8,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund for this purpose.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the Building Capital Reserve Fund and authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for renovations and heating system changes in the town

hall, and a new gas pump for the police department, and further authorize the withdrawal of said sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the sum of \$25,000.00 as the Town's share in a state aid reconstruction project for the improvement of the West Side Road; and raise and apppriate the sum of \$12,500.00 as this year's share of said project and further, to authorize the withdrawal of said \$12,500.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to support the White Mountains Region Association.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept the assets of the Bartlett Village Precinct that pertain to fire equipment and related buildings. All present liabilities shall remain payable by the precinct and all future liabilities of the fire department will be borne by the Town. Any equipment or building presently under mortgage agreement shall be leased by the Town for one dollar per year until the discharge of that mortgage, at which time such equipment and buildings shall be conveyed to the Town of Bartlett.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,800.00 for equipment purchase and operating expenses of the Bartlett Village Fire Department for 1977.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to establish a board of fire commissioners to act in an advisory capacity to the selectmen. The Board shall consist of two men elected from each the Glen and Bartlett Village Fire Departments and one member of the Board of Selectmen.

Article 18. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept a deed from Attitash Development Corporation for a certain parcel of land located on Attitash Mtn. in Bartlett, intended for public use for a road or street and other public utilities; said parcel being 66' wide and approximately 4,300' long, located off Route 302 and shown on a certain plan entitled: Property of Attitash Development Corporation Phase I of Subdivision, Thaddeus Thorne Surveys, dated 1973, Plan 73-112. Acceptance of the deed is contingent upon construction of a road to standards established by the Town and satisfactory to the Selectmen. Agreeable to a petition signed by Joe Berry and others.

Article 19. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept a deed from Attitash Enterprises for a certain parcel of land located on Attitash Mountain in Bartlett, intended for public use for a road or street and other public utilities; said parcel being 66' wide and approximately 400' long, located off Route 302 between an existing town road and Attitash Development Corp., and shown on a certain plan entitled "Property of Attitash Enterprises, Inc. Phase I of Subdivision, Thaddeus Thorne Surveys, dated May, 1969" Plan 73-112. Acceptance of the deed is contingent upon construction of a road to standards established by the Town and satisfactory to the Selectmen. Agreeable to a petition signed by Joe Berry and others.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$951.66 for the support of the Carroll County Mental Health Service, Inc.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$504.00 for the support of the North Conway Children and Youth Project (C&Y Project). This sum to be used as rent for clinic and office space. Agreeable to a petition signed by Susan Gaudette and others. Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction the real estate deeded to the Town by the New Hampshire Electric Cooperative and known as the Goodrich Falls.

Article 23. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept a deed from Glen Acres, Inc., for a certain parcel of land located in Glen Acres Subdivision and intended for public use for a road or street and other public utilities. Said parcel being 66' wide and approximately 970' long beginning off Glen Ledge Road and running to a Cul De Sac between Lots 5-6-7 in Glen Acres. Also, a section 66' wide and approximately 400' long running off above mentioned road to a Cul De Sac between lots 12 and 13. Master Plan–Glen Acres, drawn October, 1973 is on file in the Town Office, acceptance of the deed to be contingent upon construction of the roads agreeable to standards established by the Town and satisfactory to the Selectmen. Agreeable to a petition signed by Jeannie Poliquin and others.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept a deed from Owen Jefferson, for a certain parcel of land located in Glen. This deed will describe public roadways which meet the geometric standards set by the Bartlett Planning Board. These public roadways being a continuation of Glen Ledge Road (4600 ft.); South Ledge Road (600 ft.); and Forest Ledge Road (300 ft.) to the intersection of Glen Acres Road. Said roadways to be completed satisfactory to the Selectmen at the time of acceptance. Agreeable to a petition signed by Owen Jefferson and others.

Article 25. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept a deed from Glenwood, Inc. for land sixty-six feet in width for highway and utility purposes as shown on plan recorded November 23, 1976, Carroll County Records Plan Book 35, Page 07, and in the Town Office, and being Glenwood Avenue, (approximately 1,200 feet), Littlefield Road to the intersection of Mt. Stanton Road (approximately 1,400 feet), Popple Hill Drive, (approximately 1,950 feet), provided that the Selectmen find that said highways have been constructed and meet town standards at the time of acceptance. Agreeable to a petition signed by James R. Illsley, Jr. and others.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$220.00 in support of the Senior Meals and Wheels Program. Agreeable to a petition signed by Alice Davis and others.

Article 27. To see if the Town of Bartlett will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,175.00 for the Home Health Agency of the Memorial Hospital, Inc. The said sum being equal to \$1.25 per person in the Town of Bartlett. Agreeable to a petition signed by Stephen W. Whittier, Sr. and others.

Article 28. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 (twenty-five) to assist the environmental service project. Agreeable to a petition signed by John Nuveen and others.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,516.00 to become a member of the North Country Council, Inc.

Article 30. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept a deed from G S Corporation for a certain parcel of land located in Rolling Ridge, intended for public use for a road or street or other public utilities; said parcel being 66 feet wide and approximately 8,500 feet long, commencing at the point where said road intersects Rolling Ridge Road, between Lot No. 23 and Lot No. 25, thence continuing in a general Southerly and Southwesterly direction through Phase IV Rolling Ridge, as shown on plan recorded Carroll County Records, Plan Book 32, Page 45; thence continuing through Phase V Rolling Ridge in a general Westerly and Southerly direction, as shown on Plan entitled "Rolling Ridge Phase V," recorded in said Records, Plan Book 35, Pages 80 & 81; thence continuing through Phase V in a general Westerly direction, thence Northerly direction, then Easterly direction, as shown on plan entitled "Rolling Ridge Phase V," recorded in said Records, Plan Book 35, Pages 80 & 81, until said Logging Road intersects with Rolling Ridge Road, which is now a town road. Acceptance of the deed is to be contingent upon the construction of a road to standards established by the Town and satisfactory to the Selectmen. Agreeable to a petition signed by Herbert M. Billings and others.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to support the Mount Washington Valley Chamber of Commerce.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to ban residential building construction, residential septic systems, and commercial development, excepting farming and campgrounds, on the Flood Plain, as determined by the 1975 survey of the Soil Conservation Service, or on filled land on the Flood Plain, Excepting municipal or school district facilities.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 on condition that not less than \$25,000.00 be reimbursed by Federal funds, to purchase approximately 62½ acres of land in the Town of Bartlett located on the southerly side of Route 302 at and to the West of the junction of the Saco and Ellis Rivers formerly known as Mt. Washington Soaring Center and more particularly described on "Plan of Land in Bartlett, N. H., Properties of Joyce & Howard and Plusch to be deeded to Mt. Washington Soaring, Inc." by Thaddeus Thorne Surveys, Center Conway, N. H. surveyed November, 1973, and subject to easements and restrictions as of record. Agreeable to a petition signed by Warren J. Ross and others.

Article 34. To see whether or not the Town will authorize the Selectmen to enter into a five year agreement with the Town of Conway for support and contribution to private independent ambulance services in form and manner as the Selectmen shall determine appropriate provided the town shall bear only its share of expense of support in relation to its population of the total population of all participating towns.

Article 35. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SELECTMEN'S REPORT

From a fiscal standpoint, 1976 was a very successful year for Bartlett. The tax rate was lowered from \$16.50 to \$16.20 per thousand, and while this may not seem like much of a decrease, it is most certainly better than an increase which is the rule in most towns in New Hampshire. The Town finished payment on the fire truck note in 1976, and in 1977 we will be making the final payments on the re-evaluation note and the town hall note, leaving us with only three long term notes left to pay, an enviable of debts whenever possible, thus cutting down not only principal amounts but most importantly, interest amounts. By getting out the tax bills the earliest which would have been paid on temporary notes.

The year 1976 saw a co-operative effort by Bartlett, the State of New Hampshire, and the White Mountain National Forest, in replacing the bridge over the East Branch River. Estimates by the state to have this bridge repaired to meet the safety regulations were estimated at over \$60,000.00, which would have been paid entirely by the Town. Through extensive negotiations by the Selectmen, the National Forest agreed to pay 34% of the cost of a new bridge. This along with the state's share of 50% of the cost, left Bartlett paying only 16% of the total cost of approximately \$200,000.-00. This means the Town has a new bridge for approximately \$200,000.-00. This means the Town has a new bridge for approximately one-half of what it would have cost to repair the old one. This is certainly one example of co-operation between local, state, and federal governments producing desirable results for all concerned.

Work on the new tax map appears to be on schedule, and when it is finished in the spring of 1978 will be a big help in assessing and with the proper identification of property as it is bought and sold in Bartlett.

The Selectmen have had many meetings with various individuals concerning the Town's Goodrich Falls property. The Selectmen had been trying to reach an agreement whereby the property would be leased to a private individual, and hopefully put to use as a power plant once again. Unfortunately, it appears that liability insurance is not available to private individuals for this type of venture, and the Selectmen feel it would be unwise to lease this property if the Town cannot be protected by insurance. Because of this insurance problem, the Selectmen feel it is in the best interest of the Town to sell this property at public auction and get Goodrich Falls back on the tax roles again. An article asking for a vote of the Town on this matter will be appearing in this year's Town Warrant.

The Selectmen inquired to the State of New Hampshire as to the status of West Side Road. The Town has maintained West Side Road during the winter months and the State has handled summer maintenance. We were aware that the state would be assuming winter maintenance of the Conway portion upon completion of the Lucy Brook Bridge, and the Selectmen felt the State should also assume the Bartlett section. The State Highway Department stated that the Bartlett section did not meet state road standards, but if the Selectmen would agree to participate in a reconstruction project of the Bartlett section, the state would assume year round liability for West Side Road. The Town has been asked to raise \$12,500.00 for two years to aid in this reconstruction. The Selectmen heartily endorse this expenditure because the 3.5 miles of West Side Road has been the hardest road we have to maintain, both from a labor standpoint and more importantly, the tremendous amount of sand and salt needed to keep the road open.

One of the biggest problems facing the Town presently is the dump. While we spend a considerable amount for leasing the land, the overall cost of the dump is quite reasonable as compared to what it would be if we operated a sanitary land fill or an incinerator. However, no matter how reasonable the present costs are, Bartlett is faced with an immediate problem as to what to do with its solid waste. The Selectmen have explored and tested seven sites only to find them all unacceptable to the State of New Hampshire. The Mount Washington Valley Public Service Council has supported negotiations between officials of the Brown Company in Berlin and a private contractor who proposes to have waste from this area to be used as fuel by the Brown Company. Such an arrangement is working very well in Groveton with the paper company there. Due to problems at the Brown or three years.

After meeting with the Air Pollution Control Commission in October, the Selectmen received a letter from the Commission which stated that since they realize the severe problems faced by Bartlett in solving its solid waste problem, the commission has ordered the Air Pollution and Control Agency to give Bartlett all assistance possible in an attempt to meet the open burning deadline, and report its progress to the commission every 60 days. The Selectmen are hopeful that this added effort by the State of New Hampshire will help Bartlett to meet this deadline.

Bartlett continues to be one of the fastest growing towns in Carroll County, and along with this growth certain problems are inherent. The need for more services rises along with this growth, and coupled with the high inflation rate of recent years, it becomes very difficult to keep the local property tax at reasonable level. The Selectmen have tried very hard to maintain a balance of careful spending and new budgeting ideas, which they feel will lead to the most efficient government possible for Bartlett.

The Selectmen are elected to serve the people and to help try to solve any problems that may arise. In order to help with a question or problem, we first have to be asked to help. We urge everyone to become more involved with their town government: ask questions, get the facts first hand. # **BARTLETT PUBLIC LIBRARY REPORT – 1976**

The Bartlett Public Library circulated 8,703 books in 1976. Two hundred and forty-four books were added to the collection. The bookmobile visited four times and 1,744 books were borrowed from it.

The librarian attended a book-buying meeting, a workshop on censorship, served on a panel at Franconia College during the White Mountain Children Book Festival and, took a course on Audio-Visuals in the Library at Plymouth State College.

During the summer the library again conducted Monday Night Film programs for ten weeks. The library also sponsored the "Four Thousand Footer Reading Club for the ninth year. At the end of the summer the members of the club climbed a mountain, The library also co-sponsored the New Hampshire Ballet which performed the "Carnival of the Animals". The library participated in the Fourth of July parade by having a float based on the theme "Freedom to Read".

A pictorial history of Bartlett has been started through the generosity of the Bartlett Bicentennial Committee, which collected old pictures and had them enlarged and put in a scrap book. Many people have enjoyed looking at this collection. This will be an on-going project. If you should find any old-time pictures of Bartlett, the library would like to borrow them to have them reproduced for the scrap book. Also, the library would appreciate any old town reports of Bartlett. Especially those of the 1920's, 1930's and 1940's.

Memorial books were given to the library in memory of Mr. Ed. Pleau, who has been a summer visitor to Bartlett for many years.

The Bartlett School children in the second grade designed and made a bicentennial rug which they presented to the library. The fifth grade made a scrapbook of snapshots that they took of Bartlett, 1976.

In November, the library celebrated the Children's Book Week by having a story hour and film program. Nancy Chandler led the children in singing "Papa's Goin' to Buy Me a Mocking Bird" with her guitar. The library plans on having regular story hours for pre-schoolers on Friday aftermoons at 2:45 P.M. at the library beginning in March. # AMERICAN REVOLUTION BICENTENNIAL

The Selectmen requested volunteers interested in Bicentennial activities for the Town. Daniel Bianchino and Maxine Othot volunteered. Flora Jones was asked to help, making a group of three who became the organizational group and steering committee. Maxine Othot was elected secretary and Sandra Mead, treasurer.

Bartlett became a Bicentennial Community in November, 1975 and we were among the first towns in the state to receive recognition. The Bicentennial flag was presented at a ceremony held at the Josiah Bartlett Elementary School Gym January 23, 1976.

Noted Historian and author Charles Eastman, Jr. spoke to townspeople about the life and times of Josiah Bartlett, signer of the Declaration of independence, for whom our town was named.

"Torch-A-Hikes" were held in June of 1975 and 1976. Adults and children obtained sponsors and hiked Kearsarge North. Flares were lit after dark for all those that climbed. Plans are to make this an annual event – join us next June!

The Fourth of July Parade grew in size and enthusiasm. After two years this event is already established as an annual affair.

The signs at three entrances to town were designed and built by James Clemons, assisted gy Joseph ("Red") Mulkern. Glen Grange, through Lawrence Flint and Brian Hill, planted a beautiful flower bed at the Route 16 sign. Plans are to have the other signs beautified by next season.

Maple trees were planted throughout the town and flower pots were placed at ten locations.

## SACO RIVER STEERING COMMITTEE

#### SUMMARY REPORT

The Saco River Steering Committee is made up of citizens of the towns of Conway, Bartlett, Jackson and Hart's Location. Its members were appointed by the respective town's selectmen by direction of town meetings for the purpose of taking a broad overview of the Saco and formulating a plan which would take into account economic, recreational, aesthetic and environmental values. The Committee has met regularly for two years, sampled town opinion by questionnaire and public hearings, walked the banks of most of the river, met with government agencies including the Soil Conservation Service, North Country Council, State Office of Comprehensive Planning, Maine's Saco River Corridor Commission, Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission, Fish and Game Department, and reviewed many local, state and federal reports prepared on the Saco.

Using questionnaires and public hearings, it has become obvious that the citizens of the valley would overwhelmingly like to see this area preserved. Through research we have found that the recreational use of the river system is of immense economic importance to the valley.

National Forest figures, which are representative of only a fraction of the total river system, confirm that 282.5 thousand visitor day visits (all visits lumped into 12 hour units) can be directly related to river use. Total visits to three sites in 1972 (Rocky Gorge, Lower Falls, and Sawyer Rock) totalled 556 thousand people. These figures further demonstrate the value of the river system to the valley.

In summary, the Committee has concluded that the preservation of the river system, a major resource of the valley, is of prime importance in maintaining a high quality area for living, valuable in itself, as well as enhancing property values and contributing significantly to the economy. Therefore, we submit the following recommendations to be implemented at the earliest possible date and stand ready to assist in their promulgation.

- A. That the Saco River Steering Committee continue its existence to promote the importance of the river, to recommend solutions to ongoing and upcoming problems concerning the river and to help administer, plan, and develop any resolutions or warrants voted by the towns involved.
- B. That future actions and recommendations of the Committee be guided by the following priorities for the river system in descending order of importance:

Preservation of Natural Habitat Agricultural Use Recreational Use Home Sites Commercial Use

- C. That the towns adopt flood plain ordinances that restrict building on the flood plain. That the flood plain and designated flood way correspond to the most recent delineation of the 100 year flood plain by the Soil Conservation Service.
- D. That methods other than manmade impoundments be used as a means of minimizing the impacts of flood damage in the Saco Watershed.
- E. That erosion control techniques should be applied primarily to the protection of critical river sites and when undertaken should recognize the concern for recreational and aesthetic values.
- F. That public access be promoted and developed by the towns involved.
- G. That scenic easements be sought and developed to ensure and enhance the natural appearance of the valley by preserving the Saco River and flood plain in its natural condition.
- H. That strict adherence to New Hampshire laws concerning forestry practices near stream beds be enforced.
- I. That the towns should consider adopting uniform set-back ordinances along the river system.

## **MINUTES OF TOWN MEETING, MARCH 2, 1976**

Meeting called to order by Moderator Paine at 7 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance led by Chairman of Board, David Taylor.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Moderator read results of elections: Selectman, David Taylor, 97 votes; Thomas Monahan, 62 votes; Auditor, Catherine Peinert, 156; Trustee of Trust Funds, Shirley Taylor, 155; Library Trustee, Flora Jones, 156.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Budget presented by Chairman David Taylor.

Police budget: Helen Kelley spoke to increasing Chief's salary. Selectman Chandler spoke against second full time policeman. R. Glines asked if Selectmen issued guide lines to police department. Philip Haley spoke in favor of department. R. Kelley spoke in favor. Chief Roden submitted salaries of surrounding departments. Discussion, M. Burke, H. Kelley. Ronald Doyle moved, Richard Clines 2nd, Amend "Second man. Hire officer with minimum 5 years experience." Discussion, Glines, Richard Patch. Amendment failed. Police budget accepted as presented.

Health Department: Selectman Chandler spoke to Rescue Squad appropriation. Asked feeling of meeting concerning trying to collect for rescue calls. R. Plusch spoke in favor. Philip Haley moved, Marilyn Cook 2nd. "Selectmen send bills." So voted.

Town Dump: Philip Haley questioned future of dump. Chairman Taylor explained extension granted by Legislature. Selectman Chandler reported on meetings attended by Selectmen regards Regional Refuse Disposal. Explained systems being explored by Selectmen.

Town Poor: Richard Glines asks who determines eligibility of recipients. State laws were quoted. Selectmen interview. Donalda Howard moved, Richard Plusch 2nd, amend to "increase town poor appropriation by \$2,000.00." Explained change in methods of payments by Government and State at County Home. Amendment adopted. Richard Glines moved, Richard Patch 2nd, "Selectmen try to collect first time help to town poor" voted yes.

Recreation: Marilyn Cook asked breakdown of appropriation. M. Cook moved, John Murphy 2nd "Hire person to flood and care of skating rink. R. Hoffman spoke to increasing appropriation to include Little League. Long discussion. Ronald Doyle offered to match appropriation up to \$500.00. Hoffman moved, Roden 2nd, Appropriation be increased by \$500.00 and accept Mr. Doyle's offer. Gene Chandler spoke against motion. More discussion pro and con. P. Haley suggested money be used on field. Ownership of field questioned. Bartlett Village Precinct. Questions pertaining to legality of Town funds used on precinct property. Legal answer "Yes, if for general good of Town." Hoffman motion carried. Chief Roden presented Mr. Doyle's donation. Remainder of budget reviewed. Taylor moved, Owen Jefferson 2nd, budget as amended to sum of \$293,-009.14. Motion carried.

Article 3. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum not exceeding in the aggregate \$250,-000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of the Town and on the credit of the same, negotiable notes therefor, said to be repaid during current year from taxes collected within the current municipal year. Taylor moved, Chandler, Plusch 2nd, move article. So voted.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds or by any other means. Subject only to interest of relatives and heirs, all disposal shall be by public auction. Taylor moved, 2nd H. Nichols. Move article as read, be accepted. So voted.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts, and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Bartlett. W. Goodwin moved, Taylor 2nd, article be accepted as read. So voted.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize prepayment of taxes and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept in prepayment of taxes in accordance with RSA 80:52A. Chandler moved, Taylor 2nd, article accepted as read. Nichols explained article. Motion carried.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or lease the Town's Goodrich Falls property in whole or in part on a negotiated basis. Taylor explained ownership of Goodrich Falls property. John Cook moved, J. Murphy 2nd, "to strike out word sell and restrict article to word lease until Selectmen can explain fully to people. Motion subsequently withdrawn. R. Glines suggested not to do anything until special Town Meeting to fully explain lease and/or sale agreements. Discussion wording of article. R. Glines moved, several seconds, "That prior to any consumation of any transaction a special town meeting shall be called. Amendment accepted.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that part of old Route 16 which lies westerly of the west boundary of new Route 16 between Station 89+00 on the north and Station 74+00 on the south as shown on Bartlett Federal Project F246 (6) in the records of the New Hampshire Department of Public Works and Highways. Taylor moved, Haley 2nd, article as read. Taylor explained location. Accepted.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$65.00 to defray expenses incurred by the Saco River Steering Committee to continue its efforts in cooperation with other Towns in the Valley to design an overall plan for the future use and regulation of the Saco River and its tributaries in Bartlett. Chandler moved, Murphy 2nd, article accepted as read. Chandler explained article. Motion carried.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Lower Bartlett Water Precinct an easement on the Hodgdon Lot owned by the Town on the Intervale, to protect the well of the Precinct to be constructed upon adjoining property. W. Goodwin moved, J. Murphy 2nd, article as read. Goodwin explained article. Motion carried.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance: "Building Permits. No person, firm or corporation shall erect any new building or structure having a value in excess of \$500.00, nor make improvements to any building or structure unless said improvements have a value of less than \$500.00 without first obtaining a building permit from the Town Clerk. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$10.00 and each day's neglect to obtain such a permit shall constitute a separate offense. This ordinance supersedes all previous ordinances pertaining to Building Permits and/or Registrations of Intent to Build." G. Chandler moved, R. Hoffman 2nd, accept article as read. Several questions asked for clarification of some of the wording. Long discussion of restriction to flood plains. R. Glines moved to flood plains. J. Murphy 2nd. "Restrict to flood plains." Motion failed. Sue Wilson moved, R. Illsley and others 2nd, "Increase \$500.00 to \$1000. 00. Motion carried. G. Chandler suggests adding at end, "does not imply necessity of permit for replacement, repairs, general maintenance." Subsequently made into motion, properly seconded. Motion carried Article as amended accepted.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the support of the Eastern Slope Regional Airport for the current year. Duanne Mark moved, Gail Paine 2nd accepted article as read. Mr. Mark and Winifred Houghton spoke to motion. Article accepted.

Article 13. To see if the Town of Bartlett will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$690.00 towards the support of the North Conway Child and Youth Project (C-Y Project). This sum to be used for rent for clinic and office space. Agreeable to a petition signed by Jane Zack and others. Jane Zack moved, Gail Paine 2nd, amend "change \$690.00 to \$360.-00 and accept article. So voted.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,379.00 as the Town's share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, and general operating expenses, regional planning studies, technical assistance to member communities, coordination with local, State and Federal agencies, and other programs of the Council. These funds may be used in conjunction with State and Federal funds available for planning purposes. Agreeable to a petition signed by Harold Hadden and others. H. Kelley moved, R. Kelley 2nd, pass over article. Motion carried.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for the support of the White Mountains Region Association. G. Chandler moved, R. Kelley 2nd, reduce appropriation to \$1,000.-00. Discussion ensued. Division vote requested. Results: Yes 81. Nay 27.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$865.00 for the support of the Carroll County Mental Health Service, Inc. M. Cook moved, Mrs. Haley 2nd., accept article as read. So voted.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,384.90 for the Home Health Agency, the said sum being equal to \$1.10 per person and authorize withdrawal of the sum from Revenue Sharing Fund established under provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972. Agreeable to a petition signed by Susette Villaume and others. H. Villaume moved, J. Zack 2nd, accept as read. Motion carried.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the General Highway account \$11,000.00 to be used for the purchase of a new truck. D. Taylor moved, A. Charles 2nd accept article as read. Taylor gave explanation. Motion carried.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the General Highway Account \$4,688.00 for the purchase of the new sander. D. Taylor moved, A. Charles 2nd, accept article as read. So voted.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and transfer to the Town Mapping Account \$4,432.50 to cover the 1976 payment to the mapping contractor. D. Taylor moved, H. Nichols 2nd article be accepted as read. Questions asked concerning mapping Co. Article accepted.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to accept Resolutions A and B-1 pertaining to the Federal Flood Insurance Program. Said Resolutions are printed in the Town Report and are posted with this Warrant. C. Chandler moved, R. Plusch 2nd accept article. Several questions. Vote unanimous.

Artcile 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting. D. Howard moved, R. Glines 2nd. Meeting adjourned extending thanks to Mr. Doyle for his generosity. Accepted.
