

Commissioners' Report.

To the Citizens of Belknap County:

In compliance with the requirements of the laws of New Hampshire, your Commissioners herewith submit the report of their financial transactions for the year ending December 31, 1908, and a statement of the financial condition of the county at the end of the year, together with the report of the other county officers required by law.

The Almshouse and House of Correction remain under the same able management as for the past few years. Mr. and Mrs. Weymouth have demonstrated their fitness for the respective positions of superintendent and matron, and their services have been secured for the coming year.

The total amount paid out through the commissioners' office for current expenses of the county has been slightly less than last year and, in fact, less than for several years. The receipts of the county have also been less, the appropriation, \$31,000, being the same as for the previous year, while the receipts from the state license commissioners have fallen off, in round numbers, \$2,000 from last year and about \$4,000 per year from each of the two years preceding the last. It will be necessary for the present county convention to consider, in making their appropriations for the coming two years, the facts that this item, receipts from license commissioners, has now practically dropped out of the account, as has that of board of prisoners in the house of correction, while the court expenses have been increased quite materially by the change in the law increasing the pay of jurymen,

The plan adopted four years ago under the sanction of the legislative delegation providing a means for retiring the county bonds upon maturity has been continued and, there being no county bonds procurable, we have purchased for the sinking fund six \$1,000 municipal bonds bearing the same rate of interest (four per cent), as the county bonds. In doing this we have been obliged to reduce the amount of cash in the treasury somewhat below the amount carried over last year but hope that the sum now in the treasury, \$17,107, may prove sufficient, or very nearly sufficient, to meet the needs of the county until the first payment on the next county tax becomes available. The county debt consists of \$50,000 of four per cent twenty year bonds, \$30,000 payable July 1, 1913, and the balance, \$20,000, payable Jan. 1, 1915. It is evident that if these bonds are to be retired upon maturity, with anything like a uniform county tax, the policy of adding something each year to the sinking fund should be continued.

The amount in the sinking fund at the close of business last year was \$18,639.91, and with the bonds purchased this year and the interest accruing during the year now amounts to \$25,334.61, reckoning the bonds in the fund at the cost price to the county, which is a very conservative estimate of their value. The dividends on this amount for the coming year should about equal one-half of the interest on the county debt for the same period.

The county tax for each of the past sixteen years, being the whole period covered by the law which changed the fiscal year of counties to the present basis, has been as follows:

Auditors' Report.

To the Supreme Court:

We herewith submit our twenty-third semi-annual report of the auditing of the several accounts of the county offlcres for the six months ending June 30, 1908, as required by law.

We have examined the bills rendered by the county commissioners for their services from Jan. 1, 1908, to June 30, 1908, and are of the opinion that the sums charged for services are for time actually spent in the business of the county, and that the sums charged for expenses are reasonable.

We also examined the treasurer's account and find it correct, with proper vouchers for all payments made by him. We have compared the orders paid by the treasurer with the record of orders drawn by the county commissioners and find that they agree, and that the treasurer has paid all orders drawn by them.

The treasurer had on hand Jan. 1, 1908, \$18,554.73. He has received from all sources, \$2,055.69, making a total of \$20,610.42. He has paid out on orders drawn by the county commissioners, \$8,520.59; coupons on bonds, \$970.00; on orders drawn by the court, \$4,077.91, leaving a balance in his hands of \$7,041.92.

We have also examined the account of the superintendent of the County Farm and find that he has received since Jan. 1, 1908, for board of inmates, and all other sources, \$859.79, which he has in his hands.

We have examined the books of the county commissioners and find that they have drawn orders on the treasurer as above stated, of which \$3,560.80 was for the support of the external poor, as follows:

We herewith submit our twenty-fourth semi-annual report of the auditing of the several accounts of the county officers for the six months ending Dec. 31, 1908, as required by law.

We have examined the bills rendered by the county commissioners for their Services from July 1, 1908 to Jan. 1, 1909, and are of the opinion that the sums charged for services are for time actually spent in the business of the county, and that the sums charged for expenses are reasonable.

We also examined the treasurer's account and find it correct, with proper vouchers for all payments made by him. We have compared the orders paid by the treasurer with the record of orders drawn by the county commissioners and find that they agree, and that the treasurer has paid all orders drawn by them.

The treasurer had on hand July 1, 1908, \$7,041.92. He has received from all sources \$31,913.15, making a total of \$38,955.07. He has paid out on orders drawn by the commissioners, \$17,232.23; on orders by the court, \$3,565.84 and coupons on bonds, 1,050.00, leaving a balance in his hands of \$17,107.00.

We have also examined the account of the superintendent of the County Farm and find that he has received since July 1, 1908, for board of inmates, and all other sources, \$864.01, which together with \$859.73 on hand July 1, makes \$1,723.74, which he has paid to the County treasurer.

We have examined the book of the county commissioners and find that they have drawn orders on the treasurer as above stated, of which \$4,247.99 was for the support of external poor, as follows:


The auditors would again call attention to the law which requires overseers of the poor to furnish the commissioners with vouchers for the amounts paid out by them and will insist that all such vouchers must be furnished or they will not approve the bills. We would also call attention to the fact that all bills should state the amount of the article as well as the price.

The auditors have examined the securities of the sinking fund and find that it amounts to \$25,334.61.
