Voted to participate in a state-wide contest to improve the appearance of Danville, N. H.

Voted to give a vote of confidence to the Planning Board for their continuing efforts to complete a zoning plan.

Voted to close the meeting at 8:25 P. M.

# TOWN WARRANT

## TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Danville in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Danville Town Hall in said Danville on Tuesday, the Eleventh (11th) day of March, next at one-thirty of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much of the Parsonage Fund the Town will vote to spend for preaching for the ensuing year.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money for the use of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Title Property.

6. On petition of 10 people or more: "That all restrictions pertaining to the use of the land that are a part of the deed given by the Selectmen of Danville to Edgar F. and Sylvia A. Riley, be removed. Such deed being the one recorded on October 28, 1968 in Book #1937, page 208. Such property now owned by the Danville Fire Association, Inc., and recorded on October 28, 1968 in Book #1937 page 209." Said restrictions are - that the premises 'shall be used only for a nursing home, convalescence home or hospital, or any similar and related purpose; and shall not be used for any other purpose until permission of the Town to do so shall be voted at a duly warned town meeting.'

7. On petition of 10 people or more: "To see if the town will vote to have the State Tax Commission appraise the Town at 100% of true value."

8. On petition of 10 people or more: "To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00, as a partial cost of reappraisal by the State Commission, and that the remainder of the cost to be appropriated in 1970."

9. On petition of 10 people or more: "To see if the town will vote a yearly salary for the Tax Collector of \$500.00, and to raise and appropriate the same."



10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for disposal of refuse.

11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Fire Chief to send fire apparatus out of town and receive fire apparatus from other towns on a donated basis in accordance with the provisions of RSA 154: 24, 25 and 27.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## REPORT OF BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE
