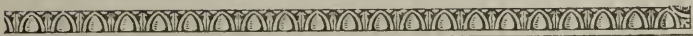

RECORD OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

Dunbarton, N. H. Mar. 13, 1956

Meeting called to order and the warrant read by the Moderator Louis D. Holcombe at three o'clock in the afternoon. Check list posted and polls opened for balloting.

Action on all articles was delayed until eight o'clock in accordance with the Warrant posted and read.

Article 1. The following-named were elected in open meeting and one vote was cast for each by the Clerk at request of the Moderator :

Town Forest Committee—Frank E. Woodbury Jr.

Health Officer—Wilfred H. Marshall

Constables—Wilfred H. Marshall, Arthur Powell

Sextons—Center, Charles Weatherbee—East, Walter E. Warriner—North, Warren Spofford

Fence Viewers—Eli N. Noyes, Ralph C. Walker, Lincoln W. Burham

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber—Fred C. Blackman, William L. Merrill, Caleb A. Fuller Jr., Wilfred H. Marshall, Frank E. Woodbury Jr.

Auditors—Earl Hadley, Earle H. Stone

Overseer of the Poor—Louis D. Holcombe

Hog Reeves—Charles Johnson, Herbert Goss, John H. Mills.

Article 2. Motion to raise and appropriate the amount of \$7170.00 to defray Town Charges by Eli N. Noyes was passed.

Article 3. Motion by Arthur H. Newell to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for General Highway Expense was seconded by J. Gardiner Mills and carried by the Meeting.

Article 4. Motion made by J. Gardiner Mills to raise and appropriate \$6500.00 for Summer Maintenance was seconded by Arthur H. Newell and passed.

Article 5. Motion by Earl Hadley to pass over this article was defeated.

A motion for passage of the article was then introduced by William L. Merrill and amended by Eli N. Noyes.

That the amount of Auto Permit money be earmarked as a deficit appropriation.

Defeat for this motion.

Again a motion by Earl Hadley to pass over the article was defeated.

A motion was then introduced by Kenneth Cowan that Selectmen be authorized to appropriate in each year an amount for applying tar to our Class V and/or T.R.A. roads in an amount equal to at least and not to exceed the amount of revenue received from Motor Vehicles Fees in the preceding year.

Amendment that twenty percent of this amount be used to reduce the deficit was then presented by Joseph Iriana and defeated.

Mr. Cowan then withdrew his motion.

Motion by Richard Frink to rescind last year's motion passed.

Mr. Cowan's motion was again placed and this time was passed by the assembly.

Article 6. A motion by J. Gardiner Mills to pass over this article and seconded by Robert Baker won.

Article 7. Motion by J. Gardiner Mills, seconded by Eli N. Noyes, that the sum of \$3500.00 be raised and appropriated for Winter Maintenance was carried.

Article 8. On a motion by Arthur H. Newell, seconded by J. Gardiner Mills, the sum of \$674.72 was raised and appropriated to match a sum of \$2500.00 to be contributed by the State for Class V roads. \$2500.00 was allocated to the

Stark Road; the balance to be used on the Twist Hill road.

Article 9. It was moved by Arthur H. Newell, seconded by J. Gardiner Mills, that the sum of \$3500.00 be raised and appropriated for Town Poor, Dependent Soldiers and O.A.A. This Passed.

Article 10. \$1080.85 was raised and appropriated for the Town Poor Deficiency occurring in 1955 through a motion by Arthur H. Newell and seconded by J. Gardiner Mills.

Article 11. Motion by John Swindlehurst to pass over this article was carried.

Article 12. Motion by Wilfred H. Marshall to pass over this article passed.

Article 13. The sum of \$292.57 was raised and appropriated for Fire Hose and Water Holes on motion by John Swindlehurst and seconded by Alfred Venator.

Article 14. A motion by Arthur H. Newell to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Memorial Day and carrying an amendment by Eli N. Noyes that arrangements for the Day be left in the hands of the American Legion Post was carried.

Article 15. An amount of \$215.00 was raised and appropriated for support of the Library on motion by Catherine Fuller.

Article 16. A motion by J. Gardiner Mills to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for care of the Cemeteries passed. This amount to be used as follows; \$75.00 for North Dunbarton, \$200.00 for Center and \$75.00 for East Dunbarton, with the remainder of \$50.00 to be used for general Maintenance.

Article 17. Motion by Robert Baker to pass over this article was sustained.

Article 18. It was voted to pass over this article on motion by John Sweeney.

Article 19. Motion by J. Gardiner Mills to pass over this article was defeated.

It was then moved by Robert Baker that a committee of

five be appointed by the Moderator on or before April first 1956, to name each Town Road and arrange for suitable signs to be installed at proper locations,—the expense to be borne by the General Highway Fund. This was passed and the Moderator named:—Lyman Nutt Chr., Robert Baker, Eli Noyes, Wilfred Marshall, L. Webster Burnham.

Article 20. The sum of \$2537.50 was raised and appropriated, on motion of John Swindlehurst, to pay off the Principal and Interest on the \$2500.00 note on the Fire Truck.

Article 21. It was voted to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to pay to the Town the sum of \$61.26 from the Reserve for Water Maintenance for repairs to the water system during 1955 on motion of Arthur H. Newell.

Article 22. A motion to pass over this article was introduced by Joseph Dulude and sustained.

This article was reopened without objection of the body by Arthur Gewehr with a motion that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the installation of an 80-gal. stone-lined electric automatic hot water tank. Cost of tank \$220.00, \$50.00 for installation and \$20.00 for connecting. This unit to be installed in the basement. Motion passed. It was also stated that the cost of a gas water heater would be approximately \$140.00.

Article 23. Motion by Robert Baker to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to cash a war bond maturing in July 1956 and place same in the bank account of the Capital Reserve Fund, was passed.

Article 24. The Office Of Tax Collector became elective instead of appointive upon passage of a motion by L. Webster Burnham.

Article 25. A motion by C. Allen Fuller to pass over this article was sustained.

Article 26. \$50.00 was voted as a contribution to the N.H. Marine Memorial on motion of J. Gardiner Mills.

Article 27. It was voted, on motion of Arthur Powell to

authorize the Selectmen to dispose of any Real Estate acquired through Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 28. On motion of Eli N. Noyes it was voted to allow a $1\frac{1}{4}\%$ discount on all property taxes paid within a two-weeks period after the mailing of the bills.

Article 29. It was voted to allow the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes through motion by Arthur H. Newell.

Article 30. A motion to pass over this article by John Swindlehurst was sustained.

Article 31. A motion to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and other officers by L. Webster Burnham was passed.

Article 32. It was moved and passed that May 1, 1956 be the installation date of the Hot Water Heater,—Lillian Durost.

It was moved that all articles in the warrant bear six signatures,—John Swindlehurst.

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L.S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of DUNBARTON in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dunbarton on Tuesday the Twelfth day of March next at three of the clock in the afternoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least eight o'clock in the evening of said day for such Town Officers as may be listed on the ballot.

You are also notified to meet at the same place at eight o'clock in the evening of the same day, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of moneys as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Highway Expenses.
4. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Summer Maintenance.

5. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Winter Maintenance.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$672.90 for Class V Roads to match a sum of \$4485.98 contributed by the State.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000 to take up the balance of the note now overdue at the Concord National Bank.

9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appropriate the sum of \$3263.57 (the amount of motor vehicle fees for 1956) for applying tar to our Class V and/or T.R.A. roads.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Town Poor, Dependent Soldiers and Old Age Assistance.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Library.

13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries.

14. To see if the town will vote a fixed rate of remuneration to be paid the Tax Collector for the collection of taxes.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$90 (less than 1/100 of one per cent of the town's assessed valuation) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town in cooperation with the other 37 communities of this Region or to act in relation thereto.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for water holes and fire hose.

17. To see if the town will vote to establish a Municipal Court in the Town of Dunbarton, and raise and appropriate a suitable sum of money for the support of said Court.

18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to transfer to the Town Treasurer two unspecified Capital Reserve Funds of 2/12/46 and 10/30/47.

19. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3652.39 and place same in the Capital Reserve Fund for Town Equipment.

20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$82 as a subsidy to the Concord Hospital.

21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$900 for the purchase of a new snow plow.

22. To see if the town will vote to accept one mile of the roads at Holiday Haven Acres and maintain same as regular town roads.

23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to pay to the Town of Dunbarton the sum of \$175 from the Reserve for Water Maintenance fund as a part of reimbursement for expense of repairs to the old pump and towards the cost of installing the new pump.

24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to cash a War Bond maturing in December 1957 and place same in the bank account of the Capital Reserve Fund.

25. To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivors Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, Amended by Chapter 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

26. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan, services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

27. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan, services in any class or classes of positions, the compensation for which is on a fee basis.

28. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the town, the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Town Treasurer as the Officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

29. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

30. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

31. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

32. To hear the reports of Agents, auditors, committees and other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

33. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Dunbarton Volunteer Fire Dept. Inc.

Your Fire Dept. responded to 15 alarms during the past year, Jan. 1st to Dec. 31st.

During the past year 8 waterholes were dug at a very reasonable price by John Haefield of Goffstown. A purchase of 300' of 2½" Double Jacket Hose was made. Presently plans are being made to purchase a 5 HP Siren to be located at the center. Funds donated and raised by members are expected to make this purchase possible.

Mr. Fife of the N.H. Board of Underwriters met with me on Dec. 19, 1956. I requested this meeting to find out if there was any practical way to get a decrease in our fire insurance rates. The fire apparatus and fire fighting equipment will qualify as is, but deficiencies were found in the Station and Alarm Facilities. Below I shall list his recommendations to meet requirements.

1. Provide a fire alarm sounding device to be either an electric siren of not less than 5 HP or a suitably arranged compressed air whistle.
2. Compliance of either section of this recommendation is considered to be compliance with the whole.
 - a. Provide a new fire station to be constructed in accordance with the requirements of Section A, of the pamphlet Community Fire Defenses.

b. Concerning the existing building.

1. Provide an 8" Concrete Block Firewall where present fire station adjoins the town garage. This wall must extend through the roof and sidewalls of the building. Any openings in the wall must be protected by approved class "A" fire doors.
2. Provide an approved heating system installed in accordance with the Standards for Community Fire Defenses and with the N. H. State Laws. This may be either in a cutoff boiler room or may be of a type specially approved for garage occupancy.
3. Provide meeting room, emergency sleeping, kitchen and toilet facilities.
4. Complete the installation of the concrete floor.

By compliance to these recommendations we will be eligible for a reclassification of insurance rates. This would at present result in an approximate 30% reduction in fire insurance rates for dwellings within 2 miles, by road, of the fire station.

SCHOOL WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Dunbarton qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dunbarton on the 9th day of March, 1957, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, and to cast ballots from that hour until at least eight o'clock in the evening of said day for candidates for the following district officers:

1. Moderator (for the ensuing year).
2. Clerk (for the ensuing year).
3. Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. Treasurer (for the ensuing year).
5. Auditor (for the ensuing year).

You are also notified to meet at the same place at eight o'clock in the evening of the same day, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officer of the district.
2. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To choose Agents and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
4. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund to-

gether with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

5. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to contract with Concord, Manchester and Goffstown School Districts and School Departments for the tuition of Dunbarton pupils in the high schools of said districts at an amount necessary to provide therefor.

6. To see if the District will vote to appropriate any funds received from tuition for so-called state wards toward payment of general expenses of the school year 1956-57.

7. To see what sum of money the District will vote to appropriate as a deficiency appropriation for the school year 1956-57, such deficiency arising from unanticipated expenses.

8. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of Dunbarton :

The current school year opened with approximately the same pupil enrollment as a year ago. We were fortunate in having no changes in our teaching staff.

The school warrant for your action at the March meeting contains the customary articles regarding the election of officers and the consideration of the budget as prepared by the School Board. In addition there are listed several so-called special articles.

An article is included relative to the payment of tuition on high school pupils in neighboring districts. In order that the School Board may legally pay tuition in excess of the statutory limits requires a vote of the district. The law states that a district is liable to the state average costs or the costs of the receiving district, whichever amount is the lesser. At the present time Concord is charging in 1957-58 approximately \$30 over the state average, while Goffstown and Manchester are within a few dollars of the State average. Adoption of the article will allow the School Board to pay the full tuition in all cases.

The Board has also included an article to appropriate such sums as are received from tuition on state wards to the general fund. At this writing it is uncertain as to the amount we might receive in excess of our payments to other districts. Approval of the article will allow such funds to be used in our general fund, and to reduce the over-run on the 1955-56 budget. It will be recalled that the district authorized the expenditure of \$15,000 for the addition to the Center School. Upon receipt of the bids it seemed advisable to the Board to borrow but \$12,500. When the project was

completed and all expenses tabulated it was apparent that we had expended \$12,794.42 on the addition, or an over-run of \$294.42. We also had an interest charge of \$82.63 and insurance costs of \$395.50 making a total deficit on the project of \$772.55. Other budgetary overdrafts of \$223.25 made a total deficit of \$995.80 as of June 30, 1956.

During the current year our transportation on the routes of Mr. Robert Baker necessitated the purchase of a larger bus. The tuition liabilities for the current year will also be some \$350 in excess of the budget estimate. It is the intent of Article #7 to provide the necessary funds for these current expenditures.

1957-58 Budget

The total operating budget as proposed by the School Board is some \$5,500 greater than the budget submitted a year ago. Of this amount, \$1,000 is in the item of floating funds under the school lunch and has no effect on the tax rate since that amount appears on both sides of the budget. The principal increase in the budget is for transportation and tuition, the transportation figure being increased by approximately \$1,000 for reasons previously explained. The tuition item is increased some \$2,200 due not only to the slightly higher tuition rates in the receiving districts, but more particularly to an increase in the number of high school pupils. The remainder of the increase in the base budget is scattered over a number of budget items and can be determined upon examination of the proposed budget.

On the income side of the budget we have an increase of some \$1,200 in the item of State Equalization Aid. The legislation now before the General Court calls for an increase in State Aid which would seem to guarantee Dunbarton at least \$3,200 for the year 1957-58.

The net effect on the tax levy considering the above fac-

tors would be an increase of approximately \$3,400 on the base budget, not including the item for the deficiency appropriation.

In October, 1955, 44 children received their first inoculation of Salk Polio vaccine, and 26 children their second inoculation.

This fall another Polio Clinic was held at Dunbarton. At this clinic first, second, and third inoculations were given.

45 children were given the Patch Test and all were negative.

Registration was held in May with 9 children attending.

At the present time we have one child attending the Convulsive Disorder Clinic, one at the Orthopedic Clinic, and one at the Pediatric Clinic.

Glasses were obtained for one child through the Sight Conservation Program.

I wish to express my thanks to the Superintendent, Parents, Teachers, and School Board for their cooperation.

Use It Freely Care For It

Your town dump has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place where you can dispose of the large amounts of dangerous, inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around your household and local stores, brush, etc., out on your property. The town dump has become a valuable and indispensable asset in modern community life.

The most successful town dumps are supervised—regular days provided for their use and inflammable material consistently burned. The town dump which receives no attention, where waste material is scattered about without supervision of any description, soon becomes a community menace and a liability rather than an asset.

Many people still burn debris around their homes. A large number of such fires get out of control causing unnecessary damage and expense to the burner. Why burn at home? Make use of your town dump and eliminate the hazard of burning. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it. The warden won't refuse you if conditions are safe.
