To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grafton, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

 Polls to close at 5 p.m.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining Highways and Bridges.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by deed any real estate acquired by Tax Collector's deed.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the Forestry and Recreation Department for the current year.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$850.00 for insurance, including (a) Workman's Compensation and Public Liability Insurance (\$350.00); (b) Liability Insurance on Town Highway Equipment (\$330.00) and (c) Fire and Extended Coverage Insurance on the Town Hall (\$170.00).

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to continue street lighting.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$918.93 and thereby receive \$6,126.17 from the State for Town Road Aid.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Old Home Day.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the care of the Common at Grafton Center.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550.00 for the care and maintenance of cemeteries including clearing and leveling of that portion east of the main entrance road in the Pine Grove Cemetery.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to establish a Town Beach on Town land near the dam at Kilton Pond.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$73.00 (1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation) for publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for repairs to the abutment of the bridge across the Smith River near Helen Valia's.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the purpose of oiling roads.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as an emergency highway appropriation, said appropriation to be controlled by the Selectmen.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to establish a capital reserve fund for the purpose of improving and raising the dam at Kilton Pond.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for the purchase of a loader and back-hoe of which appropriation \$2000.00 is to be raised by taxation this year and the balance of \$4,000.00 by two serial notes of \$2,000.00 each plus interest, one note due in 1961 and one in 1962.

22. To see if the Town will vote to transfer to the General Fund the special appropriation of \$1000.00 made in 1959 for the purpose of putting a basement dining room and kitchen under the Town Hall.

23. To see if the Town will vote, subject to similar action by the voters of the Town of Enfield, to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, that portion of the highway leading from the Grafton Pond Road to the Enfield Town Line, from the entrance to the Huntley Cemetery to the Enfield Town Line.

24. To see if the Town will vote to accept a Trust fund of \$100.00 from Sadie Seamans, the income from said fund to be used for the care of the Archie E. Seamans burial lot in the Grafton Center Cemetery.

25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell cemetery lots at \$25.00 per lot in the Pine Grove Cemetery, said monies to be used to establish a Trust Fund, the income from said fund to be used for the maintenance and repair of said cemetery.

26. To see if the Town will vote to fix the annual compensation of the secretary of the Trustees of the Trust Funds at \$25.00, said compensation to be drawn from the amount appropriated for Town Officers' Salaries.

27. Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,458.58 for completion of flood damage repairs.

29. To see if the Town will vote to use \$1,000.00 of the 1960 TRA appropriation to purchase four 30 inch and two 36 in culverts to be put in place of culverts that proved too small in last fall's heavy rains as per recommendations submitted. The smaller culverts to be put in places suited to their size.

30. To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Grafton qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are herby notified to meet at the town hall in said district on the 8th day of March 1960, at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Prevention is Everybody's Business

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note:

58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners.

10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple—

1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles—use your ash tray.
5. Don't burn at home—Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.
