# TOWN WARRANT

---

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

---

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the  
County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified  
to vote in Town Affairs:**

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to make any additions to the electric lighting system and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class II road known as the Bond's Corner Road and raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$3000.00, the State to contribute \$7000.00 or take any action relating thereto.

5. To see what action the Town will take to provide supervision at the bathing beach during the summer months and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum of money for Workmen's Compensation and Public Liability insurance or take any action relating thereto.

7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Week or take any action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 to the Monadnock Region Association or take any action relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 1% on all taxes except poll taxes paid on or before July 15, 1941, or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to replace the wooden pipe on Norway Hill with iron pipe and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

11. To hear the report of the special Tool and Fire House committee; take any action relating thereto and raise and appropriate money for the same.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds and this authority shall continue until revoked by some future Town Meeting.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes or take any action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts or legacies left in trust for use of the Town or take any action relating thereto.

15. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and take any action relating thereto.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF ELECTRIC LIGHT COMMITTEE

New customers added to the lines during the year include Walter Packard, Patricia Holsaert, Robert English, Arthur Marcouillier, Foster Avery, George Haskell, Harry Gardner, Henry Tonry, L. B. Thacher (cottage), James Russell and Chester Dufraine.

Total income for the year amounted to \$6,814.47. This amount is larger than usual due to the fact that the final payments for both 1939 and 1940 were received during this fiscal year.

The extension to serve the residence of Henry Tonry has been completed according to the vote at the last annual meeting. We have also built a three pole extension to serve new houses on the Marcouillier property.

The relocation of poles caused by road construction has been completed, also a short section of line near Dr. Briggs' Felch house was moved.

The trees along several lines were trimmed, continuing the practice which we started two years ago.

We are asking for the same appropriation as last year as we hope to finish trimming the remaining lines in the system and also, since some of the lines have been in service almost twenty years, we think it will be necessary to start replacing poles on some of the older lines. The condition of the poles on Main Street is especially bad and as soon as the New England Telephone and Telegraph Co. makes the necessary appropriation for their share of the work, most of them will have to be renewed.

I am enclosing with my seventh annual report the statistical summary of the Hancock Schools for 1939-1940, and the report of Miss Margaret E. Harris, School Nurse.

These figures show practically the same enrollment as last year, an increase of six over two years ago, and an increase of 15 over three years ago.

There has been no change in the teaching force of the elementary grades.

The advantages mentioned last year of having a teacher for each two grades instead of three grades has been even more marked than it was last year. More time is available for individual work with pupils who have been absent, or who need special drill.

Under the gifted leadership of Miss Manchester the Hancock High School maintains its outstanding position among the smaller high schools of the state. The splendid spirit shown by the pupils of this school indicates the value of such leadership.

The Hancock schools have also been fortunate in having Mr. Craig in charge of the elementary grades. He has rendered exceptional service over a period of more than seven years.

I wish at this time to express my thanks to all who have so generously co-operated in the support of our schools.
