TOWN WARRANT
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hebron Community Hall on Tuesday, the twelfth of March next at five o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Polls open from five p. m. to eight p. m.

Business meeting will open at 7:00 p. m.

2. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the ensuing year for expenditures enumerated in the proposed budget appearing in the Town Report. Copy of the budget is attached to the posted warrant.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to give two per cent cash discount on property taxes if paid thirty days from date of tax bill.

5. To see if the Town will vote to sell and convey to John L. Hughes and Marguerite Hughes three (3) small parcels of land situated on the northerly side of the Hobart Hill Road, so-called, more particularly bounded and described in the following three deeds to which reference is made for a more particular description:

1. Fred Huckins to Town of Hebron, dated November 10, 1906, and recorded in the Grafton County Registry of Deeds, Book 479, Page 284.

2. Fred B. Huckins to Town of Hebron dated August 31, 1910 and recorded in said Registry, Book 507, page 266.

3. Syd Huckins to Town of Hebron, dated December 6, 1924 and recorded in said Registry, Book 583, page 298.

6. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

7. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Other articles may be added before the Warrant is posted.

Preventing Forest Fires Is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545.00. In the same period, the cost to cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634.00. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2,200 acres burned. Residences, farm, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
2. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
3. Have something to keep the fire under control — pails of water, garden hoses, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
4. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
5. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to install in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.

In 1962 we had 2 fires.

We burned $\frac{1}{4}$ acre.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Hebron qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in said district on the 9th day of April 1963, at 7:30 o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot a Moderator, a Clerk, and a Treasurer, each to serve one year; and a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Action on articles in warrant will begin at 7:30 P. M. At the close of the business meeting, the polls will open for balloting until 9:00 P. M. or until such time as shall be determined by the meeting.

2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

5. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

6. To see if the Hebron School District will vote to petition the State Board of Education to become a member of a cooperative school district as provided in New Hampshire RSA 195:3 which may include, in addition to this District, the following School Districts, namely: Alexandria, Bridgewater, Bristol, Danbury, Groton, New Hampton.

7. To elect two representatives to serve with two representatives from each of the above mentioned school districts, namely: Alexandria, Bridgewater, Bristol, Danbury, Groton, New Hampton, on an interim committee which shall prepare a financial budget for the operation of the proposed cooperative school district.

8. To see if the school district will adopt as its school check-list the Town check-list, as provided in RSA 197:12a, as inserted by laws of 1957, chapter 57: this provision to be effective for the 1964 and subsequent annual district meetings.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Another legislative year has arrived, and it seems that no other area of State business is getting more attention than education. The publication of the preliminary report of the Legislative Interior Commission on Education has encouraged many people to take a hard look at our whole system. This report is based on a great deal of study and is the result of thousands of hours of real work. It is deserving of serious study, for its conclusions are very significant for the Towns in this area. There is no indication of immediate legislation to implement the suggestions of the report, except possibly in the area of increased State Aid to school districts. We should all watch carefully those items of legislation which affect our schools, and let our representatives know how we expect them to vote.

Of particular interest to citizens of the Newfound Area is the bill which is being drafted to enable the seven towns to form a regional school district. This legislation is being made necessary by the desire of the school study committee to provide for the accomplishment of this cooperation by using some ideas not incorporated in the present Cooperative School Law. Between the time that this is available, a great deal of information will be disseminated in various ways. It is our sincere hope that folks will make up their minds after this information is available to them.

As we have so frequently indicated, the facilities at Bristol Memorial High School are overcrowded now, and future enrollments figures give promise of a greater, not a smaller burden on these facilities. This is not only Bristol's problem, as whatever is done there will materially affect the education of the young people in the surrounding towns.

The average salary for the teachers in New Hampshire's elementary schools this year is \$4900. For high school teachers the average is \$5225. There is a shortage of elementary teachers in the state, and, wherever we pay less than the average, we have difficulty finding teachers to come to our smaller schools. Whenever we find one who is willing to start here we take a chance on the quality of her teaching, and serve as a training school for larger and more affluent districts.

We have many fine, dedicated teachers in this area who are offering a good, sound educational background to our youngsters. It is our intent and hope to keep them, and to be able to get equally effective people to replace them when they leave and to supplement the staffs when necessary.
