To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lincoln in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Lincoln High School Auditorium in said Lincoln on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. How much money will be raised for Police Department.
4. How much money will be raised for Fire Department.
5. How much money will be raised for Public Health Department.
6. How much money will be raised for Town Maintenance.
7. How much money will be raised for Street Lighting.
8. How much money will be raised for Miscellaneous Expense.
9. How much money will be raised for Cemetery.
10. How much money will be raised for Public Library.
11. How much money will be raised for Support of Town Poor.
12. How much money will be raised for Old Age Assistance.
13. How much money will be raised for Maintenance of Water Department.

14. How much money will be raised for White Mt. Region Association.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 and Interest to take up Water Bonds due April 1, 1947.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,000.00 and Interest to take up Water Bonds due July 1, 1947.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$143.87 for T. R. A. work, the State to contribute the sum of \$568.94.

19. To see what action the Town will take in regard to collection and disposal of Town Garbage.

20. To see if the Town will vote to establish a planning board of five (or seven) members, with duties set forth in Sections 3 to 15, inclusive, of Chapter 53, of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire 1942, to make a study of the town's development and report to Town Meeting appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the town's best development, the board members to consist of one selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the selectmen, as provided in said Chapter 53 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire 1942.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lincoln for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the town. Schedules as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the audit and examination were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and the Municipal Court.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Comparative Balance Sheets, December 31, 1945, December 31, 1946: (Schedule A.)

Comparative balance sheets as of December 31, 1945 and December 31, 1946, are presented in Schedule A. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$ 3,616.62 during the year.

Reconciliation of Change in Financial Condition:
(Schedule A-1.)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the town during the year is made in Schedule A-1, with the factors which caused the decrease in Net Debt indicated therein.

Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues - (Schedules B and C)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, are presented in Schedules B and C. As indicated by the budget summary a net revenue surplus of \$ 859.85, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$ 743.23, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$ 116.62.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Schedule D)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Schedule D. Proof of the Treasurer's balance, as of December 31, 1946, is indicated in Schedule D-1.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks.

TAX ACCOUNTS

Tax warrants for the levies of 1946 and previous years were examined. Summaries indicating the activity in these accounts for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1946, are presented in Schedules E, E-1 and E-2

TOWN CLERK

The financial accounts and records of the Town Clerk were examined and audited. All funds received by the Clerk on account of the issuance of motor ve-

hicle permits, dog licenses, business licenses and for filing fees were properly accounted for through remittances to the Treasurer. (Schedule F.)

GENERAL COMMENTS

In our report last year we suggested that consideration be given to the current deficit of \$ 7,090.47, which existed at the close of 1945, in the budget for 1946. An appropriation of \$2,500.00 to cover a part of this deficit was made in 1946. Actually, however, the appropriation for this purpose was more than offset by overdrafts during 1946. Therefore the town remained in practically the same position at the close of 1946 as in the previous year, as indicated herewith:

Provision should be made in the 1947 budget for at least a part of the 1946 deficit.

The accounts and records of all town officials were found in good condition and the accounting procedure conformed to the uniform system prescribed by this Division.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that the report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Lincoln for their assistance during the course of the audit.
