WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- To the inhabitants of the town of New Durham qualified to vote in town affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall, in said New Durham, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, 1953, at twelve o'clock noon, to act upon the following subjects:
- Article 1. To choose a selectman for three years, and a town clerk, a town treasurer, a road agent, two town auditors and all other necessary officers and agents for the ensuing year.

AND YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED TO MEET AT SAID TOWN HALL, IN SAID NEW DURHAM, AT SEVEN O'CLOCK IN THE AFTERNOON OF SAID TUESDAY, MARCH TEN, 1953, TO ACT UPON THE FOLLOWING SUBJECTS:

- Article 2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of town government for the ensuing year in accordance with the recommendations of the budget committee or with such variations as are by law permitted.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 4. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivors Insur-

- ance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951, and will designate the selectmen as the officers to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 for state aid construction, said amount having been determined by the state highway commissioner as the amount of the town's obligation for state aid construction for the year 1953.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to discontinue winter plowing on the following roads:
 - 1. The Dame road from the Van Keuren factory to the residence of Willis Corson.
 - 2. The Valley road from Giles*corner to the residence of Roy Berry.
 - 3. The cross road from the residence of Maurice Hayes to the residence of Izah Berry.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to accept the Daddario road from its point of beginning on the south side of Broad Cove to the Nolan camp, so called, at Merrymeeting lake.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to accept that portion of road which lies between the Daddario road and the Jones road at Merrymeeting lake.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to accept lot No. 400, on the Daddario road, at Merrymeeting lake.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to allow the tax collector 10% commission upon all head taxes collected by him and to authorize the collector to deduct the same from the amount collected, provided that said 10% commission is authorized by act of the New Hampshire legislature.
- Article 11. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to abate the taxes prior to 1949 which appear to be uncollectible.
- Article 12. (By petition) To see if the town will vote to adopt the following restrictions pertaining to building within a one-half mile area of Merrymeeting lake and upon any well founded information that this ordinance is being violated, the selectmen shall,

on their own initiative, take immediate steps to enforce the provisions of this article:

- 1. All dwellings shall be single family dwellings.
- 2. Buildings erected hereafter shall have a side yard on each side of not less than 10 feet in width.
- 3. No dance hall shall be permitted.
- 4. No beer parlor, or like establishment shall be permitted where alcoholic beverages are sold and/or consumed on the premises.

Any lawful building or use of a building or property in existence at the time of passage of this article may be continued. This article shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

Article 13. (By petition) To see if the town will vote to elect the budget committee, consisting of six members-at-large, at the annual town meeting. These members to be elected by paper ballot with nominations from the floor. Two members to be elected for three years; two for two years; and two for one year, and hereafter two members to be elected for the regular three-year term at each annual town meeting. The budget committee to comply with all provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

Article 14. To see what action the town will take regarding the adoption of the zoning laws as provided in Chapter 51 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, 1942, and any amendments thereof, and to act upon any resolution pertaining to the same.
