#### TOWN WARRANT

#### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Orford on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers. The Polls will be open from ten o'clock in the A.M. until six o'clock in the P.M. for you to cast your ballots for one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, and Road Agent for one year.

Article 2. To hear the budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or pass any vote relative thereto

Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow and care of Town winter roads for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance purposes.

Article 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of electric lights.

Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Orford Free Library and Orford Social Library.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 10. To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen to sell and administer property acquired by Tax Deed.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

#### TOWN WARRANT - Continued

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the Construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate \$769.63 and the State will contribute \$5,130.86.

Article 13. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Care of Common and for Park Commission.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to cover expenses of Memorial Day.

Article 15. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the use of the Fire Department.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be turned over to the Trustees of Trust Funds, toward buying Fire equipment in future years.

Article 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Control of Pine Blister Rust and Care of Trees.

Article 18. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Ambulance Service and how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, made necessary by this action.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to build a building to house some of the Town Equipment and how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, made necessary by this action.

Article 20. To see what action the Town will take in regard to having Town Meeting in the evening and where it will be held.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town reassessed and how much money they will vote to raise and appropriate, made necessary by this action.

Article 22. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Lebanon Airport.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 if the State will match it on a 40-60 percent share basis, to be used to buy equipment for the Police Department and to provide training for Police Officers.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board with duties as set forth in Chapter 36, Sections 1-18, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended, whose purpose shall be the promotion of the orderly development of the

#### Article 24. (continued)

Town; said Board to consist of one Selectman and six other citizens of the Town appointed by the Board of Selectmen, also, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to cover expenses incurred by the Planning Board in the performance of its duties.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to establish an advisory election of the six citizen members of the Planning Board, accepting nominations from the floor, the results of which shall be conveyed to the Board of Selectmen as the preference of the Town.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board to adopt and file with appropriate authorities subdivision regulations for the Town of Orford, in accordance with Chapter 36, Sections 19-29, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 1955, as amended, to provide against premature or scattered subdivision of land that could endanger health, safety, prosperity or the environment of the Community, or necessitate an excessive or unplanned expenditure of public funds for the provision of municipal services.

Article 27. To see if the Town will endorse Upper Valley Health Care and its efforts to improve the delivery of primary health services to people of the Upper Valley and further, to authorize the Moderator to appoint two residents to represent the Town on the Executive Committee of Upper Valley Health Care.

Article 28. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 29. To transact any business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

During this past year, the public has shown a great deal of cooperation in the prevention of fires. We wish to express our thanks for a job well done.

Your forest fire warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires, a synopsis of these laws follow.

## FIRE PERMITS

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning (SUCH BURNING IS RESTRICTED BY REGU-LATION TO BE PRIOR TO 9:00 A.M. and AFTER 5:00 P.M.)

An Air Pollution regulation forbids the burning of household waste in towns where such rubbish is collected by the town.

### EXCEPTIONS

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed under normal conditions with permission of the District Fire Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On anothers' property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

RSA 76:11 provides for delivery of the list (warrant) to the collector within thirty days of receipt of approval of the tax rate unless for good cause the time is extended by the commission. The collector shall within thirty days after receipt of the warrant from the selectmen (assessors) send out the tax bills unless for good cause the time is extended by the commission.

RSA 76:11-a Information Required. The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, or his agent, if known, as provided in section 11, shall show the rate for municipal, school and county taxes separately. The 1970 rate breakdown reflects a proportionate share of the Reimbursement a/c Property Exempted by 1970 Special Session for each unit of government.

RSA 76:13 provides that if tax bills are mailed on or before November 1 interest is not charged if payment is made on or before December 1. However, if tax bills are mailed between November 2 and 15 inclusive interest is not charged if payment is made on or before December 15. In the event that tax bills are not sent until after November 15 interest shall not be charged on taxes paid on or before December 30.

The tax bill which you mail must contain the date from which interest will be charged and this date is determined by the date you send the last bill on the list committed to you. It is also required by statute that you notify this commission in writing of the date on which you send the last bill. There is enclosed a form for this purpose.

Article 1. To choose by non-partisan ballot a Moderator, a Clerk, and a Treasurer, each to serve one year and two members of the School Board each to serve three years. (Polls will open at 5:00 P.M. and will close no earlier than 10:00 P.M.)

NOTE: ARTICLES 2 through 7 WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED UNTIL 8 P.M.

Article 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the Truant Officer, and Treasurer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.

Article 3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relative thereto.

Article 4. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District.

Article 6. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to apply for and accept grants and aid from the United States, the State of New Hampshire, other states, and any agency or municipality thereof, or from private corporations and individuals for the construction, maintenance, reconstruction, operation, and financing of its schools, and to do any and all things necessary in order to avail the District of such aid and cooperation, or to take any other action relative thereto.

Article 7. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

#### TO THE CITIZENS OF ORFORD:

Our society has steadily grown more complex and so also has the education required of a citizen and job-holder. For these reasons the job of educating our children well has become more difficult. However, we believe that we and the citizens of Orford are accomplishing this task.

## STAFF AND ENROLLMENT

Five new teachers were added to the Orford Staff this year joining the eleven who had returned from the previous year. In addition we have a full-time teacher assistant working in the Orfordville Elementary School. We believe that one of the most important factors in the education of a child is the quality of his teachers. We believe that our teachers are helping us to do a very good job of teaching our children.

We hired a new school secretary, Mrs. Doris Barry. Our previous secretary, Mrs. Ramona Harris, moved because her husband's job was transferred. Our other non-teaching employees continue to perform their jobs well: Mrs. Kathy Baker, our school nurse, Mrs. Muriel Weeks, our hot lunch cook in the Orfordville School, and Mr. Stanley Chase, our custodian.

Student enrollment as of January 15, 1971 was 211 students. There were 121 students in grades 1 through 8, 72 students in grades 9 through 12, and 18 students in Kindergarten. Of the students in grades 9-12, seventeen are tuitioned in from Fairlee and Lyme.

### CURRICULUM

Our most significant change this year has been the introduction of a Kindergarten in the Orford Public Schools. Many people are convinced of the need for a child's attendance at Kindergarten. Before entering first grade children must learn new behavior patterns, including group work, as well as developing a number of pre-reading skills. Our Kindergarten, in its first year of operation, has been accomplishing these goals very successfully. The Kindergarten class is held during the morning in rooms rented from the Orford Congregational Church. It normally requires more than one year to build up necessary Kindergarten supplies but Orford residents have been so generous in their contributions of toys and equipment that our Kindergarten is now surprisingly well-equipped.

In our Orfordville Elementary School we have continued to attempt to provide a program designed to meet the needs of the children as individuals. We have been giving special attention to our reading instruction through classroom teaching, a variety of classroom reading activities, and the use of our remedial reading specialist. We have begun a twice a week program of having two

high school students work with the Orfordville students in physical education. We also plan to have Orfordville students brought to our gym for a few physical education sessions. We believe that this physical education training will help our Orfordville students develop better physically and in team sports.

This year our efforts in sports have been very successful. We have been trying to develop good character in our students in terms of good sportsmanship, ability to work well together as team members, dedication, hard work, practice, and good team and school spirit. They have shown all of these qualities in abundance. Our High School Soccer team made the state tournament. At the time of this writing our girls Varsity basketball team has lost only one game (by only one point) and our boys Varsity basketball team is undefeated with seven straight victories and is the surprise team of the Upper Valley area. We do not have space to mention the accomplishments of all our teams but nearly all have winning records.

We have restructured our High School Earth Science Course to make it more relevant by including practical ecological content related to our environment in the Orford area.

Very few schools in the United States have had community residents teach in schools. However, we have begun a limited program of inviting residents of Orford to come to our schools periodically to teach our students in specific subjects not yet taught. We now have a new High School Sewing Class taught by Mrs. Leona Smith of Orford. We are working on the possibility of a cooking class.

Most school districts in our country have students with drug use problems. Although at the time of this writing we are aware of no students of Orford having drug use problems we believe that it is better to be prepared. We have been among the first few School districts to make free use of the State of New Hampshire's Department of Education Drug Team. We had the Department of Education Drug Team meet in two different sessions with the Orford teachers and Principal. All Orford residents were invited to these two meetings. As a result of these meetings we believe that we are better informed and prepared on the drug topic. We have begun a Health Education Program for our students involving the School Nurse and our teachers. Sections of this program deal with the drug topic. We have also developed a good working relationship with the Orford Police in case their assistance may be needed in the future.

#### BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

During this school year two different student groups on separate occasions painted our High School English and Laboratory rooms. Most of the paint was purchased with money raised by the students. Teachers supervised and assisted in the painting work. We are pleased with the wonderful pride in the school and school spirit shown by the students and teachers. This type of activity rarely occurs in other school districts.

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - 3

Major repairs and improvements to our buildings this year have been the painting of the south end and corridor of Memorial Hall, the painting of the steeple of the Street School and the installation of fluorescent lights in our 8th grade room in the Street School.

Major purchases included three tables and ten chairs for our Kindergarten and a fire extinguisher for our Street School. We were also able to get thirty chairs that had been broken during the past few years repaired, free of charge by the manufacturer. A major instructional purchase was an electricity circuit kit for our industrial arts program.

#### BUDGET AND FINANCES

A large percentage of the budget for the 1971-72 school year which will be presented for consideration at the Annual Meeting is the item for teacher salaries. The budget for teacher salaries is based on \$6,350 for an inexperienced teacher with a Bachelor's Degree.

Other large items in the budget are in the categories of replacing worn and used up teaching supplies and equipment, heat, gas, transportation of students, and electricity.

We were able to get our oil supplier to lower the price he charges us for oil. However, we are prepared, unhappily, for the well-publicized oil price increases in the future.

We will be receiving no state foundation aid again for the 1971-72 school year.

We believe that we are providing a good education for our students. Our small class size allows us to provide our students with much more individualized instruction and attention than students receive in most other school districts. No educational factor is more important than the quality of the teachers and in this area we believe that we are very strong. Our school Board Members have contributed much time and energy and our citizens of Orford have given our school support.

This is my first year as Principal in Orford. We are fortunate to have so many wonderful and able people among our students, teachers, Board Members and citizens. I will continue to work as hard as I can with them to help to provide quality education for our children.
