THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE WARRANT FOR 1979 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE TOWN OF RUMNEY

To the inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton and State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon at which time the polls shall be opened for balloting on Article 1 and shall close not earlier than 6:00 o'clock in the afternoon and you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Rumney on Thursday the 15th day of March, next, at 7:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the second session of the town meeting at which time action will be taken upon the remaining articles in this warrant.

Article 1: To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2: To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to authorize withdrawl from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against one of the sums appropriated under this article as follows:

PurposeAmountTown Library\$3,000.00Amount of set-off\$3,000.00

Article 3: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges, and to authorize withdrawl of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article.

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for equipment for the Highway Department.

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 to defray the costs of operating the Fire Department during the ensuing year and to authorize withdrawl of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article.

- Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be added to the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund.
- Article 7: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the costs of maintenance of the Town Dump during the ensuing year, and to authorize withdrawl of \$5,000.00 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article.
- Article 8: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for engineering studies of the town dump site on the former Banel property in order to determine how best to develop said site in order to comply with the laws and regulations of the State of New Hampshire which prohibit open burning.
- Article 9: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the costs of operation of the Police Department during the ensing year.
- Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$548.45 in order to secure from the state the sum of \$3,656.36 for Town Road Aid.
- Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,326.00 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc., and to authorize the Selectmen to use, as a set-off against the amount appropriated under this article, the sum of \$204.00 from the Anti-Recession Fiscal Assistance Funds received by the Town under the provisions of Title II of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, and interest thereon.
- Article 12: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to revise and update the town tax map.
- Article 13: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Rumney Planning Board.
- Article 14: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the Baker River Audio Visual Center which was established in 1974 as the result of a federal grant.
- Article 15: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Mooselaukee Health Center in Warren, New Hampshire.

Article 16: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and pay the obligations of the Town.

Article 17: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer, lease, rent, sell and convey or otherwise dispense of any real estate or mineral rights acquired by the Town by any Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 18: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.54 for ambulance service.

Article 19: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$65,000.00 to purchase from Bar-Don, Incorporated a tract of land on Stinson Lake in Rumney, New Hampshire, to be used as a park and recreation area, and to raise said sum by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of a note or notes of the Town pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:8. (Two-thirds vote required).

Article 20: In the event of a negative vote on Article 19, to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$65,000.00 to purchase from Bar-Don, Incorporated a tract of land on Stinson Lake in Rumney, New Hampshire, to be used as a park and recreation area, and to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend federal funds for said purpose from the Land and Water Conservation Fund, and to raise the balance, not covered by federal funds, by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of a note or notes of the Town pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:8. (Two-thirds vote required.)

Article 21: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$793.00 as the Town's share of the cost of operation of the North Country Council for the year beginning July 1, 1979, and ending June 30, 1980.

Article 22: To hear the report of the Flood Plain Insurance Study Committee, and to see what action the Town wishes to take relative to the Federal Flood Plain Insurance Program.

Article 23: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,500.00 to defray the costs of a re-assessment of all taxable properties in the Town by the New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration.

Article 24: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate as the Town's share of the cost of reconstructing bridge No. 079-092 on the Sand Hill Road, so-called, and to raise the sum so appropriated by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of a note or notes of the Town pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, RSA 33:8. (Two-thirds vote required.)

Article 25: To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the New Hampshire Humane Society.

Article 26: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the maintenance (including mowing, materials, lime, etc.) and improvement of the Baker Athletic Field in the Quincy section of Rumney. (This article inserted by petition.)

Article 27: To see if the Town will vote to request the Selectmen to provide the Town with a record of the business conducted at the Selectmen's meetings. This should be posted at the Town Hall and submitted to the Plymouth Record following each meeting. (This article inserted by petition.)

Article 28: To see if the Town will vote to request the Selectmen to make known to the Town's people the time, date and place of the meetings conducted to deal with the business of the Town, such as school board, planning board, etc. These should be posted in a public place and well in advance, preferably by the month. (This article inserted by petition.)

Article 29: To hear the reports of agents, auditors and committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FOREST FIRE CHIEF AND YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

For more than 80 years, a cooperative effort between the State of New Hampshire and local forest fire authorities has created a forest fire prevention and suppression program that is recognized as superior throughout the United States.

Since the first forest fire laws were written in 1895, the state and local community governments have worked together to prevent and

combat forest fires.

Today, 249 forest fire wardens and more than 1,800 deputy wardens are appointed every three years by the State Forester to work with the members of the State Forest Fire staff in this effort. State Funds are used to pay one-half the cost of forest fire suppression costs incurred by local forest fire organizations, within pay rates established by the Governor and Council. State funds matched by local funds are used to purchase hand tools to suppress forest fires, to train local forest fire crews and in forest fire prevention work.

All outside burning, when the ground is not covered with snow, is permitted only after obtaining a written fire permit from you local Forest Fire Warden. Penalty for burning without a permit when one is required is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine up to \$1,000 or a jail

term of up to one year or both.

RUMNEY SCHOOL BOARD BUDGET CONSIDERATIONS FOR 1979-80

The Rumney School District budget for fiscal year 1979-80 is \$359,857, a decrease of \$864 from the previous year. The district assessment, upon which the tax rate is based, will be \$331,507, down \$1,161 from 1978-79. This is due to an anticipated increase in revenue for special education from the state and federal governments.

Major increases in the proposed budget include the following items—salary raises, transportation costs, retirment and FICA charges, insurance (primarily the cost of unemployment insurance) and special education.

Federal legislation now mandates that all handicapped children between the ages of 3 and 21 receive a free public education. Based on the district's liability according to state law, the 1979-80 budget includes \$14,434 for special education tuition and transportation for Rumney children who must go outside the district for appropriate special education programs. This is an increase of \$12,054 over 1978-79.

Major decreases in the proposed budget compared to the present budget include the following—textbooks, library and audio-visual materials, teaching supplies, the hot lunch program. Building repair costs are down a total of \$22,235 from 1978-79.

Plymouth Area High School tuition for 1979-80 will be \$140,622, down \$7,248 from the present school year. This is due to a slight decrease in the tuition rate as well as a decline in the number of Rumney students enrolled at the high school.

Supervisory union costs for 1979-80 will be \$10,636, an increase of \$752 over the present year.

The Russell School cost per pupil for 1977-78 was \$1,000.98, down slightly from the previous year. This was the second lowest per pupil cost in the supervisory union. Rumney transportation costs (\$54 per pupil or 42 cents per mile) were the lowest in the union.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE

In the past few years we have been asked to explain the function of a supervisory union and its relation to the local school board and the state. The following statement extracted from the New Hampshire School Boards Association pamphlet "New Hampshire Public Schools" hopefully provides a succinct answer to the question.

New Hampshire school law states that the State Board of Education has "the same powers of management, supervision, and direction over all public schools in this state as the directors of a business corporation have over its business, except as otherwise limited by law." The state of New Hampshire has 174 school districts which the State Board of Education has divided into 50 supervisory unions, each administered by a superintendent of schools.

Schools, like other public agencies and business corporations, must have a management system. The New Hampshire school management system is the supervisory union. School Board members who are elected by the voters of their individual school districts comprise the policy making supervisory union school board. The superintendent shall serve as the executive head of the public schools, and shall be responsible for planning and administering their affairs subject to statutory requirements, the regulations of the State Board of Education, and the policies of the local districts. In performance of these duties, the superintendent shall be directly responsible to the State Board of Education through its commissioner, and the board or boards of the supervisory union.

Supervisory union budgets, following a public hearing, are annually voted by the supervisory union school board. The budget provides for the salaries of the superintendent and other supervisory union personnel along with any necessary central office expenditures. Supervisory union school boards decide the number of persons to be employed, their duties, and their salaries. Local districts share the services provided by the supervisory union and share the costs of operating a central office. The local school district's share of the union budget is determined by two factors: half on the basis of pupil membership and half on the basis of equalized valuation.

WHAT SERVICES DO THEY PROVIDE?

The supervisory union structure was formed so that local school districts could join together to provide themselves with necessary

administrative services they could not furnish efficiently or economically alone. Services provided include: budget preparation and control; central purchasing; building programs and maintenance; state and federal, record keeping and reporting; recruitment and employment of all staff; public relations, annual reports; supervision and evaluation of all staff; curriculum development and coordination of school programs; staff development and re-training; coordination and development of state and federal programs; school health services; school lunch programs; special education programs; payroll; teacher negotiations and professional assistance to school boards in many other areas.

Central office staff function so that the above mentioned services are provided with a single goal in mind -- to provide the best possible education to the children in our communities, in a cost-effective way.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This school year began with some changes at Russell School: Four new faces joined the staff. Barbara Horton, a Dartmouth graduate, as our Resource Teacher, Bruce Beem-Miller a graduate of St. Lawrence University with a Master's Degree from Leslie College teaching the fourth grade, Carol Braley and Dolores Vitek, our new self-contained fifth and sixth grade teachers. Mrs. Braley, a graduate of Plymouth State College, returns to us from Maine, and Miss Vitek comes from Michigan where she earned her bachelor's and master's degrees. In addition, Miss Vitek teaches Math to grades seven and eight.

The repairs to the roof, heating system, and drainage system behind the school have been successfully completed. All leaking in the building ceilings has ceased and temperatures in all classrooms can now be adjusted to the needs of each teacher. Winter ice and rain storms no longer pose the threat which they have in the past. The installation of storm windows on the north wall and classrooms has made a significant difference in the comfort of classrooms in the new wing.

The Staff of Russell School continue to provide a balanced educational program to Rumney students: Basic skills subjects which are individualized to the needs of each child; science and social studies; experiences in learning social skills and appropriate behavior in formal and informal situations; physical education activities in team sports, physical fitness, body movement, intramural, and interscholastic athletics; a field-trip and assembly program; an Artist-inthe-schools program funded in part by the National Endowment for the Arts; and a special services program which strives to identify, evaluate and diagnose, and prescribe a free and appropriate education program for each child whose handicaps make it difficult for him to learn.

DeEtta Shimek, the school nurse, screens vision and hearing of all youngsters as well as providing emergency first-aid and health and hygiene consultation to students and parents alike. Bob Smith and Donald Smith keep the building clean and well maintained. Bob and Esther Ward provide transportation service to Rumney children with the school's sixty-six passenger bus and maxi-van. Mrs. Lyon continues to serve the best and most economical lunches in one of the State's finest hot lunch programs.

The continued financial and human support of Rumney residents will assure the continuation of quality education we all can be proud of.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1977-1978

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation — "Reports. Each superintendent of a supervisory union shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district and their share of same. Said report shall be filed with the school board of each school district involved and shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrator, if any is in service in the union."

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuations. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$23,500 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of Supervisory Union #48 during 1977-1978 was made up as follows—\$2,500 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$21,000 was prorated among the school districts comprising the Supervisory Union. Allowance for \$800 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of the Assistant Superintendent during 1977-1978 was made up as follows—\$2,413 paid by the State of New Hampshire and \$18,087 was prorated as stated above. Allowance for \$1,700 travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.
