TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Temple in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Temple on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at seven-thirty (7:30) o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Town Dump, Parks and Playgrounds, Election and Registration, Town Hall and Other Buildings, Flag, Cemeteries, Forest Fires, Civil Defense, Vital Statistics, Legal Expense, Dog Damage, O.A.S.D.I. (Social Security) and for any other charge arising within the Town.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Summer Highways.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Winter Highways.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a Sander. If favorably considered a Bond issue to cover payment shall be voted, or to take any other action relating thereto.
6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the improvement of Class V roads and appropriate the sum of \$776.67 and the State will contribute \$5,111.16.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Temple Volunteer Fire Department, said sum to be turned over to the Treasurer of the Fire Department.
8. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of acquiring fire equipment and raise and appropriate a sum each year not in excess of $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% of the last assessed valuation for the purpose thereof.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Salary and expense of the Police Department.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Library, said sum to be turned over to the Treasurer of the Library.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$370.00 additional funds to increase the opening hours of the Library from four hours to eight hours to conform with the New Hampshire Development Program.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the N.H. Forestry and Recreation Commission for the Opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for Forest Fire Protection. The state will provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$65.00 to be used in cooperation with the State and Federal funds for the control of White Pine Blister Rust within the confines of the Town.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$155.00 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association. \$.06 per \$1,000. of the 1966 equalized assessed valuation.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day, said sum to be handled under the auspices of the Day-Quinn-Blood Ex-Servicemen's Association.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes: pursuant and under the limitations of Chapter 33, Sect. 7-8 of N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated.

18. To hear a report of the Planning Board and raise a sum of money for the support of the Planning Board or take any other action relating thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan ballot system for the election of Town officers required to be elected by ballot and also the Tax Collector, as allowed by sect. 73 of chapter 59 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated (1955) as amended, or take any other action relating thereto.

20. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

MANSFIELD PUBLIC LIBRARY

Circulation of books for the year was as follows: adult non-fiction 647, juvenile non-fiction 485, adult fiction 462, juvenile fiction 1,219, making a total of 2,813.

A portion of the summer food and book sale proceeds added to the fund, and our annual state aid for reference books provided \$100 more.

Mrs. Peter Goodwin conducted a successful pre-school story hour during the summer, and the librarian held a fun reading program for the school children with a party for all who participated.

In the year 1968 we had 2 car fires, both out of state, 1 call to Mr. Banks where an oil fired bug lamp flared up in a wind nearly setting fire to the house, the Ellison barn completely destroyed, a chimney fire at Salisbury, a grass fire at Bruce Kullgren's, and 1 run to the Town Dump. The Department was also called to help locate 2 of the Rudolph children who had wandered from home.

Mutual Aid was received at the Ellison barn fire and we were called to assist at the Styles Farm barn fire in Wilton.

On the run to the Styles Farm fire our No. 1 truck broke down. Although the parts to repair this truck were costly, most of the labor was donated by the men of the Department working with and under the direction of Ray Harling.

Assistant Chief James Naglie attended 2 days at the Meadowood Fire School this year with Carl Hedman and Ernest Harling attending 1 day each. Each day at this school is considered as 2 drills on our payroll schedule.

Dr. and Mrs. John Bird Lloyd gave a donation of \$50.00 to the Temple Firemen's Fund. This is the fund that is used to purchase various types of safety equipment for the firemen.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted matches is an adventure, burnt fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cookout, or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the Spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result – escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.
2. To NEVER discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump.

If you must burn –

- a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for ALL debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal braisers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.
- b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on GRASS by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
- c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire BEFORE you light the match.
4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Temple:

I submit this abbreviated report relative to the activities of the School District from the time of the final School District Meeting held in March, 1968, until June 30th. At this time the Contoocook Valley School District assumed full operating responsibilities for schools in Temple.

All plans for closing out of the District proceeded as were projected except that late in the fiscal year the State Tax Commission, Municipal Accounting Division, indicated that it would be a physical impossibility for their office to audit the accounts of the District because of insufficient personnel. Local School Boards, therefore, assumed the responsibility for finding local auditors to conduct a careful and detailed audit. This audit was completed, is reported herein, and met all state requirements.

The accounts of the District were closed in good order providing a net balance in Temple of \$4,606.27. The balance was unusually large because the District Meeting provided an additional \$1,000.00 to cover any deficit that might occur between the time of the March meeting and the end of the fiscal year. As provided by an article that was in the warrant, this net balance has been transferred to the Contoocook Valley School District and has been credited toward Temple's share of funds necessary for operating the Contoocook Valley District in 1968-69.

All Treasurers Reports and Bookkeeping Reports of the School District have been stored within the community at the Selectmen's Office and should be on hand for a period of seven years.

Copies of all recent Town Reports are filed in the Superintendent of School's Office in Wilton and are available for transfer to the Contoocook Valley School District Office.

All registers for Temple, such as they exist, are also at the Supervisory Union Office in Wilton and should be transferred to the Conval Office.

I am pleased to report that the transfer of administrative responsibility from the town district to the Contoocook Valley School District has been made with minimal problems and confusion.
